The Lord Blythswood will introduce His Royal Highness to the Court.

The Deacon will welcome His Royal Highness Prince George saying:

Your Royal Highness on behalf of the Master Court and Members of The Incorporation of Masons of Glasgow I welcome you to this Meeting of the Master Court of our Craft.

Will you kindly sit on my right.

In accordance with a unanimous resolution of the Master Court confirmed at a subsequent Meeting of the Incorporation I beg to move that His Royal Highness The Prince George Edward Alexander Edmund, K.G., G.C.V.O., R.N. be admitted an Honorary Member of The Incorporation of Masons of Glasgow.

I now call upon the Deacon Convener Past Deacon John Train.

The Deacon Convener: I have the honour to second the motion of the Deacon.

The Deacon: Gentlemen: Does the motion meet with your approval?

I have much pleasure in declaring the motion unanimously carried and call upon the Clerk to administer the Oath.

The Clerk: Will your Royal Highness kindly stand and hold up your right hand.

(Oath) Do you swear that you will do all in your power to promote the interests of The Incorporation of Masons of Glasgow to which you are this day being admitted an Honorary Member.

His Royal Highness: I do.

His Royal Highness having taken the Oath will sign the Roll of Honorary Members.

The Deacon: Your Royal Highness, it is now my privilege to welcome you as a Member of our ancient Incorporation.

May I take this opportunity of saying that my Master Court and the Members of the Incorporation appreciate to the fullest extent the very high honour which has been conferred upon the Craft by your accepting Honorary Membership of our ancient Incorporation. I am at the same time to express to you the loyalty and affection which we bear to your illustrious Father, our King, and the other Members of the Royal House.

I call upon the Clerk to read the Certificate of Membership.

The Clerk will read the Certificate.

**The Deacon:** I have now great pleasure in presenting to you a Certificate of your enrolment as an Honorary Member of the Incorporation of Masons. I have also to ask you to accept from the Master Court and Past Deacons this miniature Mason's Mell as a souvenir of the occasion.

I have now the honour of extending to you the right hand of Fellowship and to present to you the Members of the Master Court.
