Minutes from the Trades House Bowling Game from July 1896 to June 1930

Introduction

The Trades House Bowling Game was originated by Deacon Ninian MacWhannell in 1896 and was the outcome of a private game between a rink of Bakers and a rink of Fleshers. The Bakers rink comprised of Deacon William Mathieson, Deacon Simpson, Mr J W Black and Deacon Izat, and the Fleshers rink Deacon Forsyth, Deacon William Guthrie, Ninian MacWhannell and Deacon W. W. Watt. J W Black and Ninian MacWhannell approached the then Platform of the Trades House comprised of Deacon Convener Ramsay, Ex-Deacon Convener McLellan, Collector James McFarlane and Ex-Collector J F Miller. The Platform approved of such a game and through the instrumentality of Deacon Convener Ramsay the Platform presented a handsome silver cup as a challenge trophy to be played for annually. A Committee comprising one member from each Incorporation was appointed and since 1896 to the present day the trophy has been competed annually with the exception of the years 1915-16-17-18. Four gold badges are presented to the successful team and a second prize of five pounds is given to

The First Meeting of the Bowling Competition

The first meeting took place on Wednesday 15th July 1896 in the Trades House with several representatives of the Incorporations.

Deacon Izat took the chair and Ninnian MacWhannell was appointed interim Secretary. The Secretary read circulars which had been circulated to the Incorporations and reported on replies received. After some conversation, the meeting agreed that the first bowling match in connection with the Incorporated Trades should take place on Thursday 13th August 1896 at 5 O'clock p.m.

The game to consist of 21 ends and a committee of five was appointed: Messrs Sturgeon, Izat, Thomson, Crinean and MacWhannell were appointed to carry out the necessary arrangements.

The Secretary was instructed to write out a short notice to be posted on all the greens, notifying the game and requesting members connected with any of the Crafts and who were desirous of taking part in the game to send their names and addresses to him not later than Tuesday 20th Inst.

The Secretary was also instructed to make arrangements for securing greens upon which the games could be played.

The next meeting took place at 5.30 p.m. at Victoria Road, Crosshill on 3rd August 1896 with all the players when the Secretary announced the results of the first game.

The Wrights had the highest score with viz: 11.6 per rink.

At the meeting of Monday 9th November 1896 the Committee of the Incorporated Trades Bowling Game met and Mr Izat was once again called to the chair and informed the meeting that they had met to discuss the arrangements for next year's game and that it would be well to draw up rules. After some discussion it was agreed to leave the matter in the hands of the sub-committee who were to submit proposals at a future meeting.

News of a Cup to be Presented

A meeting took place in the Trades House on 30th November 1896 where the Secretary reported interviews and correspondence with the Deacon Convener regarding the proposed cup and was pleased to state that the Platform had generously agreed to give a most handsome trophy to be played for annually.

Further amendments were made to the rules and the Secretary was instructed to get them printed and distributed.

Presentation of Bowling Cup

On the 11th June 1897 at a meeting of the Trades House, the new cup was presented. The minutes state that:

Collector Macfarlane asked the Deacon-Convener to accept on behalf of the House, as a gift from the Platform of the year 1896-97, the Silver Bowling Trophy on the Table. The purpose of the Trophy was to encourage and maintain amongst the Incorporations an annual Bowling Competition, and to promote thereby a spirit of friendly rivalry on the one hand and unity on the other. He felt certain that the Deacon-Convener himself and his successors in office would ensure that the annual game be wisely indulged in and the trophy zealously safe-guarded.

The Deacon-Convener thereafter accepted the trophy as the actual property of the Trades' House of Glasgow, and as a gift presented in the first place for competition amongst the Members of the Fourteen Incorporations. Should the popularity of Bowling wane at any future time, the House might then adopt such measures as would put the trophy into competition for some other recreation. The Deacon-Convener afterwards moved that the House formally approve of the Rules of the Annual Bowling Game of the Fourteen Incorporated Trades of Glasgow drawn up by the Committee and instruct the Clerk to engross these in the Minute Book. The motion was unanimously agreed to. Late Convener Copland from the floor of the House expressed the thanks of the Members to the Platform for the handsome presentation, which, he said, would do much to stir up friendly emulation in the years to come. The game still retained the distinction of being one of the most genial and kindly, and as it had always a beneficial influence on the health of those engaged in it, and was not hampered with the evil of betting, it was one which should be encouraged by the Institution to which they belonged. Late Convener McLennan replied to the vote of thanks to the Platform. The Deacon-Convener moved a special vote of thanks to Messrs. R. & W. Sorley for the great care they had taken, and the artistic skill they had shown in producing the trophy. This was unanimously accorded.

The Committee and players met in the Trades House in June 1897 where the Secretary announced the winners of the second annual game. The scores placed the Weavers at the top with a win of 18. Mr Sturgeon being the skip received the trophy on behalf of Mr Pearce Campbell, the Deacon of the Weavers.

The above statement was presented to the committee at a meeting held in Knox and Young's Office on 18th August 1897 at 3 p.m. Mr Sturgeon was called to the chair. The Secretary read the financial statement noting a balance of £6. Mr Sturgeon, Mr Knox and the Secretary were instructed to get a design for badges. Last years rules were revised and amended.

At a meeting of the Committee in the Trades Exchange, Gordon Street on Thursday 7th April 1878 with Mr James Hendry presiding where four 15 carat gold medals were viewed and the Secretary was instructed to see them handed over to the Weavers. The stamp to the left, is the one which created the bowling medals.

The Secretary was instructed to advertise the game and to see that a notice was inserted in the papers and to make all arrangements.

Preparations for the 1898 competition took place in the Trades Exchange in Gordon Street on Monday 23rd May where James Hendry presided where the Secretary reported progress and the drawing of the ties proceeded.

The results of the 1898 competition were read out a meeting in the Trades House of Glasgow on Friday 10th June 1898. The Weavers skippered by Mr Wm. Sturgeon was declared winners for the second year in a row with a win of 22. Deacon Convener Miller handed over the cup to the Weavers. The meeting then approved next season's committee:

The game was played in lovely weather and there were 32 rinks with some 123 players taking part. It was about a quarter past ten before the last of the cards reached the Trades House. After the presentation the Deacon Convener entertained the large company to cake and wine. The winning team of Gilberts, Tailor, Allan, Captain Andrews and Wm. Sturgeon were presented with gold medals.

The next meeting took place at 58 West Regent Street on Monday 24th October 1898. Those present were: Messrs Sturgeon, MacFarlane, Izat, McBride, Wilkinson, Green and the Secretary. Mr Sturgeon occupied the chair. The Secretary submitted a financial statement which was approved. The Secretary was instructed to write to the members of last year's winning rink informing them that the committee had agreed to give them £2 15/ each and that they were to purchase what they desired and to send the account to the Secretary. It was suggested that when the April meeting took place that the Secretary mention the change of date of play from June to August.

The following gentlemen were selected as a sub-committee:

Robert Izat, Wm. Sturgeon, J S Knox, J M Wilkinson and Secretary. It was further agreed that one member should fall to retire each year.

The committee met at 58 West Regent Street on Thursday 6th April 1899 at 3p.m. and the following members were present:

Messrs Sturgeon, Forsyth, McBride, King, Rodger, MacFarlane, Wilkinson, Knox and the Secretary.

After some discussion it was agreed to abide by the second Friday of June but that the hour be 4.30 instead of 5.30. The Secretary was instructed to communicate with at least 12 clubs to secure their greens. The following clubs were proposed: Titwood, Shawlands, Wellcroft, Queens Park, St. Vincent, Whitevale, Burnbank, Pollokshields. Willowbank, Bellahouston and Cathcart.

It was suggested that when the Secretary issued the notice of the game to the City Clubs that he also include the clubs in the outlying areas.

A vote of thanks to the Chairman Mr Sturgeon brought the meeting to a close.

The Committee next met at 58 West Regent Street on Friday 26th May 1899 at 3p.m. and the following members were present: Messrs MacFarlane, Wilkinson, McBride, Stewart, Sturgeon, King, Forsyth, Green, Rodger, Crosbie and Secretary. Mr Sturgeon occupied the chair.

The Secretary reported that 35 rinks had entered and that he would endeavour to get another rink of Fleshers rather than ballot out a rink. This proposal was accepted, and the meeting then proceeded to draw the ties.

A meeting was convened after the days play in the Trades House on Friday 9th June 1899 where the results were read out and the Hammermen, Dr. Clark's rink were 22 up and were thus the winners of the cup.

Collector White handed over the cup to Dr. Clark and presented him and his three players with badges. The meeting then selected the committee for next season.

The first Committee 1900 meeting took place at 58 West Regent Street on the 21st of March 1900 at 3p.m. The Committee members in attendance were Dr. Clark, Robert Izat, T McBride, John A Stewart, J S Knox, Wm. King, John Crosbie, A Ferguson, Alex |Sharp and the Secretary. Mr Clark occupied the chair. The Secretary submitted a statement of the Income and Expenditure (see above) which was approved. The following sub-committee was approved: Messrs Dr. Clark, Izat, Knox, McBride and Secretary. It was agreed to print the rules as usual.

The following greens were suggested as suitable and the Secretary was instructed to write for permission to get playing served viz: Whitevale, Hillhead, Wellcroft, Queens Park, Bellahouston, Titwood, St. Vincent, Pollokshields, Burnbank, Cathcart, Kingston, Shalwalnds and Willowbank.

The next committee meeting took place at 58 West Regent Street on Monday 25th May 1900 at 3p.m. The members present were: Dr. Clark, McBride, Stewart, Andrew, Izat, Sharp, Knox, King, Ferguson, Green, Rodger, Crosbie and Secretary.

The Secretary reported that 40 rinks had entered, which was an increase of four over last year. Power was given to the Secretary to secure another green. And Kingston was suggested. The draws of the ties then proceeded.

A meeting took place after the competition in the Trades House on 14th June at 9.30p.m. where Deacon Convener MacFarlane called upon the Secretary to read the results of the days play which was as follows:

The new committee met at 58 West Regent Street, Glasgow in April 1901 at 3 p.m. for their first meeting. Those present were: Dr Clark, Robert Izat, R Paul and the Secretary.

The Secretary submitted a statement of Income and Expenditure for 1900 (please see above) which was approved.

The following sub-committee was appointed: Dr. Clark, J S Knox, T McBride and Robert Paul.
