ROSS-SHIRE ROLL of HONOUR.

A FOREWORD.

Completeness is not pretended in this Roll of Honour for Ross-shire. The Lews, for instance, it has been found impossible to deal with, except so far as the Nominal Roll of the Ross Mountain Battery is concerned, a roll which only touches the fringe of the magnificent response which Lewsmen have made through the Royal Naval Reserve, the 3rd Seaforth Highlanders (Special Reserve), and the various services in the Royal Navy and the Regular Army. Indeed the Lews well merits a separate roll for itself, and, it is understood, may yet receive it.

With regard to the Mainland, the Roll of Honour, extensive as it undoubtedly is, remains nevertheless far from being exhaustive. It is, however, as complete as active research and inquiry could make it, and the Editor expresses his thanks to many people who have assisted in its compilation. In order, however, to help in the task of compiling a roll yet more complete, additions and corrections are invited, and these should be sent to the Editor of the "Ross-shire Journal," Dingwall, who has kindly consented to receive and classify the same. The information desired is as follows:—Rank, No., name in full, occupation, home address, name of unit, and casualties if any. Probably at a later date a fuller roll, with some record of the part the sons of Ross have borne in it, will be undertaken.

Briefly, the scheme of the present Roll is to give the (1) Nominal Rolls of the 1/4th, 2/4th, and 3/4th Seaforth Highlanders, Ross-shire Territorials, (2) the Nominal Rolls of the 1/4th and 2/4th Ross Mountain Battery, with relative Ammunition Column forming part of the 4th Highland Mountain Brigade, R.G.A., Territorial Force, and (3) the Parish Rolls, so far as ascertainable, excluding men serving in the foregoing units.

With regard to the Nominal Rolls of the Territorial units mentioned, these are as nearly complete as it was possible to make them. They are given separately because, after all, in concrete

form they show best how Ross-shire responded to the call to arms. Both the Seaforth and the Ross Mountain Battery Territorials offered complete units for General Service, and both are now in the fighting line in two widely remote fields of action, the one on the battlefields of France, the other somewhere in the Eastern Mediterranean.

Brief special chapters are devoted to these two last-named corps.

MOBILISATION OF THE 1/4th SEAFORTHES.

The outbreak of war found the Battalion somewhat under strength, but better organised than ever before, thanks to the enthusiasm of the commanding officer, Lieut.-Colonel D. Mason Macfarlane, Craigdarroch, Ross-shire (wounded at Neuve Chapelle), and the excellent work of Captain Sir John Fowler of Braemore, Bart., adjutant, and the officers and men. There was, however, a prompt response of men when the pre-arranged word, "Mobilise," was flashed along the wires. Many former Territorials rejoined, officers and men, and many young fellows, some sacrificing lucrative appointments here at home, others in places in the South, in order to help to fill up the gaps in the County Territorial Battalion. Young men left businesses, the claims of which might excusably have held them fast; some left the workshops and the benches, others the counters, the desks, and the professions, readily giving all to the cause. These invariably all enlisted for foreign or general service, few restricted themselves to the alternative of "Home Defence." As for the Territorials who answered to the call under the conditions of enlistment, the response was complete, and very few men indeed exercised their right to restrict their service to "Home Defence" alone, but promptly took on for Imperial Service. Indeed there was a general wave of enthusiasm which never subsequently flagged, but rather became accentuated, to get, as early as possible, into the fighting line to help the British Expeditionary Force, so early tested far beyond its legitimate strength.

The order to "Mobilise" was received at the Headquarters at Dingwall on Tuesday evening, 4th August. It moved the old burgh to the core. A motor cyclist, with a side car, hurried a bugler through the town. The first shrill notes of "the assembly"

pierced the air. The hour was between 6 and 7 o'clock. Some who heard it restrained with difficulty their emotions. They already had thoughts of the fell toll of battle in such a war and for such a cause, and visions of sons, not yet enlisted perhaps, who before long would be in the forefront of battle, falling in the struggle, to "return to Lochaber no more."

The Headquarters company fell in briskly that evening, and were issued their orders for the morrow, and the men dismissed. Dispatch riders, on motor cycles, hurried north, east, south, and west with the Proclamation, which was carried to the remotest parts of the glens and bens of the County Palatine. By the morning of the next day, remote Ross-shire, so difficult of access to the more hum-drum affairs of life, knew, as surely and as quickly as when the fiery cross blazed from hill to hill of old, that the War Lord of Europe had issued his fiat, and that war had come home to us all, and that our sons must answer the muster roll.

Company by company the battalion assembled at Headquarters at Dingwall. In a day or two all but some details necessary for Headquarter duties had gone North to the shores of the Cromarty Firth. From the 5th to the 9th August the Battalion remained at Nigg, its numbers steadily swelling as Ross-shire lads arrived from the south and elsewhere answering the summons, rejoining, or enlisting for the first time.

On Sunday, 9th August, the battalion returned from Nigg, preparatory to the second phase of the mobilisation instructions. Great crowds of people gathered in the county town and watched with interest the march of the battalion from the station to Headquarters, and the subsequent processes of billeting. Later in the evening there was church parade to the Parish Church, where the Rev. J. R. Macpherson conducted a memorable service.

On the 11th August the battalion left by a morning train for Inverness, from whence, after a short stay of five days, the 4th Seaforths left for the war station at Bedford.

At Bedford, thanks to the excellent administration of the command, our Territorials were among the first battalions of all the Highland Division to be comfortably billeted in furnished houses among the middle and working classes of the town, and Bedford, with its various discomforts to many, and the epidemics which hit other units so hard, remained throughout a healthy, hospitable, and happy place to all ranks of the 1/4th Seaforths.

The battalion left Dingwall over 800 strong. The establishment demanded 1050. Ross-shire subsequently supplied a con-

siderable proportion of the shortage, and no fewer than 200 men were promptly secured through the Headquarters of the London Scottish, and ultimately about this number of lads, many of them Scotsmen, more of them of Scottish descent, a goodly number of them Englishmen inspired by the sight of the tartans, the sound of the pibrochs and the traditions of the Seaforths, left with the regiment when the time came to proceed to the front.

At Bedford the battalion underwent a fairly lengthy course of training on a war footing. To particularise would probably be to reveal too much. But highly spoken of by Brigadiers, Divisional Commanders, and even higher military personages, it was early seen that the chances of the regiment getting early to the Front were certainly not inferior to that of any other corps in the whole Highland Territorial Division mobilised at the war station of Bedford.

At length the order came, and on 6th November the 1/4th Seaforths—for the 2/4ths had by then become more than nominal—marched through the historic streets of John Bunyan's town, in two detachments, and entrained at a military station for the seat of war. It was the first Territorial unit to move off to the Front. It was a stirring day in old Bedford; it was in many hearts a sad day to not less romantic Ross-shire. "Mithers grat as they marched away." The people of Bedford, who had grown to love our Highland lads, were many of them moved to deep emotion. But what of us in far away Ross-shire seeking to visualise the scene, amid unfamiliar surroundings, with tender thoughts of loved ones, and the dread of all that might lie before; battling between our fears and our patriotism and our pride in the glory of our sons. But the boys left high in their hopes, resolute in their determination, and their way-going was perhaps easier in the home of the strangers than it would have been here among the hills of Ross.

Every man of the battalion who left Bedford on 6th November, 1914, reached French soil in safety. The Navy of Britain then, as now, afforded our transports complete protection over the narrow belt of water.

At the outset the battalion was moved from one place to another, and saw a bit of France. For a time, consequent on an outbreak of scarlet fever, it was held in quarantine in the region of St Omer. Ultimately the battalion reached Ferfay, and by and by it was quartered in Richbourg, not far from the fighting line, and so it had its first sight of battle, and heard for a first time "the din of war." Presently it grew familiar with the conditions

of active warfare as represented by life in trenches under fire, and soon it had sterner work in the advance trenches, and the casualty list commenced to tell that death and wounds are inseparable from battle, and we in Ross-shire had the first taste brought home to us of "the real thing."

The first man of the regiment to give his life for his country was a smart young private, a member of the great Highland Clan from which the County takes its name. Private William Ross, Maryburgh, was killed in action while on trench duty.

Between November and February there had been a noticeable wastage, chiefly from sickness, and on 19th February the first draft for the Front left Bedford, under command of Captain Robert de Cardonnel Findlay, Aultnamain (since killed), a gentleman well-known for his patriotism. The full list of the names of officers and men forming the draft are given separately, and it may be remarked in passing that in the action in which the battalion so soon after engaged, no section suffered more severely than those ardent patriots who clamoured to get to the Front. Since then other three drafts have gone to the Front—there is never lack of volunteers for the honour—and at the present moment (June, 1915), it is up to the County to see to it that the different battalions are maintained at strength. The 3/4th Seaforths, with Headquarters at Dingwall, is feeder of both battalions, and by and by both may be found abroad perhaps in the same field, perhaps in widely separate parts of the world.

1/4th SEAFORTHS AT NEUVE CHAPELLE.

It is impossible to do more than construct in outline the story of the part taken by our gallant County Territorial Regiment in the already famous advance at Neuve Chapelle. Letters from wounded men carry events up to the dramatic moment when bullet or shrapnel put a period to their personal knowledge; other letters from the lines of the Ross-shires, written by men who passed scathless through the events of the week supplement the tale. But while these communications are vastly illuminating, and in the aggregate form a lurid picture of the field of battle, and are worthy of preservation among the records of a regiment so famous in story,

there must yet remain for the future historian a fine field for yet more graphic description of all that our gallant lads—untried in battle—passed through, and not less must there be recorded due appreciation of their magnificent courage on several occasions when the conflict was at its height—about which few of them speak freely when no man knew, with comrades falling around him—officers and men—when the next bullet or the next bursting shell or falling bomb would send him to his last long account.

From a mass of such letters as has been mentioned, the account of the six days from Monday, 8th March, till Saturday, 13th March, is given, with free excerpts from such letters dealing with particular incidents on the two notable dates—Wednesday 10th and Thursday 11th. Names of correspondents are withheld. Doubtless they would add to the personal interest of the narrative, but the men have no craving for personal publicity. Taking up the story in chronological order, the record begins with

MONDAY, 8th MARCH.

On the evening of the 8th the Battalion were in the trenches. Their duty—dangerous to a degree—was to prepare for sterner work to come.

Earlier letters reflect a steady yet almost imperceptible preparation for events to come. There was an imperceptible something in the air forecasting stirring times, and not a few correspondents wrote, some vaguely, others confidently, of “big things” not far away in point of time or place.

TUESDAY, 9th MARCH.

On this morning the Battalion turned in at 5 a.m., and at 10 a.m. breakfast was served. It was known definitely that “big things” were certainly near at hand. Probably none of the men realised that they were to pass through experiences such as followed on the next two days; nor, happily, it may be hoped, had any of them forebodings of occurrences which, however noble, were, perhaps to end, or it might be to completely alter the whole current of their former peaceful pursuits. Certainly the spirit of all ranks was above depression. Indeed, a note of confidence was present with all; confidence and determination to do all that was asked of them, so far as was humanly possible. Never to flinch, and to quit themselves like men. Several of the men managed to write home on this date—some of them have since met death; others have

hovered near its portals amid evidences of the grim realities of war; and others, buoyant and happy, are recovering from their wounds, and anxious again to "go out;" for the men who have been there know best, even while liking it least perhaps, how much their comrades need them.

The 9th was spent in preparations for the morrow. Virtually all that day the Battalion stood to arms, retiring early to "a covering of straw."

WEDNESDAY, 10th MARCH.

At 1 a.m. came reveille, and, with full equipment, full field supply of ammunition, as much bully beef and biscuits as each man could warrantably carry, and, doubtless, some "comforts" from home stowed or secreted away, at 3 a.m. the Battalion moved off. The march was steady; but even in the dark of the morning spirits were light, and, all be it that discipline demanded quietness in the ranks, the Battalion might, from the passing chaff, and joke, and fun, have been, as concerns many sections, a moving crowd going to or coming from a field of sport or play. About 4.30 a.m. the Battalion took up its allotted position in reserve on the Rue de Bois not far from Richebourg.

"Exactly at 7.30 that morning the British bombardment of the German positions began. Previous to that a few shells were sent over the Germans—just the usual morning 'rations'—and then, suddenly, and at the same instant, the battle thunder broke from — big guns of ours." "It was inferno let loose," says a Seaforth.

"Fancy over a thousand shells a minute, and it must have been that," says a Dingwall lad. "How anything could stand against it goodness knows. It was terrible. Our trenches were just in front of some of the heavier artillery, and shells went flying in a continuous roar right over us."

"About 11.30 a.m. we got the orders to move forward to occupy a position in front. We hadn't gone far, however, when results of the morning's work began to show themselves. Wounded were being carried past us by the dozen, the lighter cases making their own way. While still in the trenches the officers had been informing us of the progress of the bombardment, and we cheered lustily when we heard that Neuve Chapelle had fallen, and that our troops were in it, and now we were eager to see for ourselves and

to be into the thick of the advance. I think all ranks were full of that feeling."

"They had a complete walk over," says one of these writers. "Our troops carried on until they were perhaps 600 yards beyond the village, and during this time we had marched onwards, and reached a communication trench where the first line had been in the early part of the morning. Here we received our first shell."

"We moved through this trench," to quote another writer, "in single file. Major Robertson was leading; Lieut. Dewar was behind or alongside of him. I was among the first dozen files. We emerged into an open part—built on one side only. The leading files were in the open, when a shell burst right overhead. I hear the groan of the wounded yet. About seventeen of us went down. Stretchers were quickly got, wounds were temporarily bandaged, and all of us hit were out of it for the present."

"We remained in the redoubts," writes one who went through it all, "until about 5 p.m., when word reached us to advance. By this time it was getting dark, and a few were hit as we moved along the trench—'Port Arthur' they call it among the Tommies. The German trenches had been not more than fifty yards away, but they had been blown to bits by the bombardment of the morning. At last we got out into the open."

"We advanced perhaps over two miles under fire the whole time, and arrived at the village of Neuve Chapelle."

"We remained near there all night, and dug ourselves in. Each man had his own little dug-out, but it was cold lying in the mud throughout the night. Heavy fire was kept up by the enemy on the village. We tried to get a little sleep; few of us, I think, got it."

THURSDAY, 11th MARCH.

"At dawn we were under orders to advance to the attack. We breakfasted on what was available, and about 6 a.m. advanced in open formation."

"There had been another bombardment in the early morning, and we were in support of the Ghurkas, who were to make the advance. At 7 a.m. we reached the first line of trenches."

It was in this early morning advance that Colonel Mascen Macfarlane was wounded in the thigh, and lay in the field until wounded a second time in the same place by shrapnel, he was taken to the rear. Major Cuthbert took over command, and continued in action although himself wounded. Of our field officers

Major Cuthbert and Sir John Fowler, cool, phlegmatic, and cheerful, alone remained.

"We lay there till 2.15 p.m. Before the advance was made our artillery had bombarded the enemy's lines for 15 minutes, and blew them to bits. Even with the heavy bombardment the Germans managed to get maxims on us. What a maddening sight it was to see the men fall, some never to rise again. Brave men who went to help their comrades got shot themselves. A. Strachan (Maryburgh) was killed going back to the open to help his chum."

"German reinforcements became engaged about 2 p.m., and it was at that stage most of our casualties occurred."

Another writer (a D Coy. man) says:—Major Fraser stood up and ordered the advance. We at once rose, and leaping over the top raced at full pace for the advanced trench some 200 yards in front. This run I shall remember for the rest of my life. I reached the trench in safety, and when I regained my breath looked round at the back of me, and the sight was heart-breaking. There lay my chums wounded and dead, dotted about in the field. It was awful. D Co. had the heaviest list, as they led the advance. They lost 10 killed, 22 wounded, and 1 missing. Our advance was successful, and we could see the Germans running through the wood, (Bois du Biez) in front and away from us for all they were worth. We lay in this trench until dusk, when we were relieved, and had the melancholy job of collecting the wounded and dead."

"After we were relieved, about 6 p.m., we went back to our old dug-outs. Never will I forget that march. We were all done up, and jolly glad at the prospect of rest. We had been altogether about 8 hours in mud and water and under fire. We reached our 'quarters' about 5 a.m. on the 12th."

FRIDAY, 12th MARCH.

"No rest for the weary! We breakfasted and paraded at 7 a.m., and marched off and went to a village en route for rest camp. That night we were on reserve duty again."

THURSDAY, 18th MARCH.

"We have been here five days," says a correspondent, writing on above date, "but for how long I cannot say, only it has been a great relief after the strain."

"We are feeling quite fit for anything we may be put to now, and the men are grand."

Such is the story, pieced together, but authentic as far as it goes, of what our gallant lads went through. But, after all, it lacks detail, especially of those terrible hours from dawn to dusk on Thursday, when, refusing to go back, and long unable to go forward, they grimly held on to the ground they occupied. The advance by rushes proved costly work to the Battalion, but we now know that it was those regiments, and among them the 1/4th Seaforths, who, by their tenacity, prevented German reinforcements from making good their counter attacks, so securing definitely those lines so well won in the fighting of the previous day. But for the ill-luck of the mist which descended, preventing our aircraft from locating the enemy reinforcements, probably the battle of Neuve Chapelle would have resulted in an even greater gain of front than was recorded. But, notwithstanding, the success was outstanding in the annals of trench warfare, and our whole troops proved once more that General French did not overstate the case when he credited our men with a clear individual advantage over the enemy.

“Although our losses have been terrible,” writes a cheery optimist, “we are not downhearted, and never will be. We know that each life given so willingly and fearlessly means a step towards the overthrow of German militarism and oppression, and for the good of humanity in general.”

HONOURS AND CONGRATULATIONS.

Major T. W. Cuthbert, the popular factor on Ardross Estate, Ross-shire, and prominent in the public life of the county, was granted admission to the Distinguished Service Order “for conspicuous gallantry during the operations around Neuve Chapelle. After his Colonel had been wounded, he commanded the battalion with great ability, although himself wounded in the head.”

Four men of the Battalion received the Distinguished Service Medal:—

Acting-Sergeant J. MACLENNAN, D Co., Gairloch (Greenside Cottage, Kinlochewe, Ross-shire).—For gallant conduct on the 11th March, in the advance to the river Layes, when he removed a wounded N.C.O. in cover, whilst under very heavy machine gun and rifle fire.

Honours and Congratulations—Continued.

Private A. THOMSON, D Co., Gairloch (teacher in Glasgow; home address—Tong, Lewis, Ross-shire).—For conspicuous heavy fire and brought a wounded man a distance of 40 yards into cover under difficult and dangerous circumstances, the enemy being only 200 yards away.

Private A. MACLEOD, E Co., Ullapool (chauffeur, Hillside Cottage, Polbain, Ullapool, Ross-shire).—For conspicuous gallantry on 11th March, when he went out of his trench under very heavy rifle and machine gun fire and spent 15 minutes bandaging a seriously wounded Gurkha soldier.

Private W. C. MINCHIN, C Co., Black Isle (architect, Central Tydbrook, Ross-on-Wye, Herefordshire).—For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty, especially at Neuve Chapelle on 11th March. He was always to the fore when volunteers were required for arduous and dangerous work, leaving cover on more than one occasion voluntarily to take the place of wounded stretcher bearers.

The Battalion was congratulated on all hands. Sir John French, Commander-in-Chief, inspected the Battalion, and congratulated all ranks on their splendid work during the advance. The Division Commander (Sir James Willcocks), addressing the Battalion, said:—"I have fought along with your line Battalions many times, and always found them a 'damned tough lot.' I am glad to be able to say that you are of the same breed, and that I will have much pleasure in recommending to the Army Council the gallant behaviour of the Battalion."

General Jacobs, commanding the Dehra Dun Brigade, in a letter, highly appreciative of Colonel Mason Macfarlane's work, speaks of the Battalion as follows:—"You will be glad to hear that your Battalion did splendidly all through. Major Cuthbert got a wound on his forehead from a piece of shell, but he has stuck it out, and is nearly quite well. He is keeping things going well during your absence. I am grateful to you for all the good work your Battalion has done ever since you joined the Brigade. Your officers and men have a fine spirit, and they have proved themselves to be as good as any regular regiment."

Colonel Stewart-Mackenzie of Seaforth, titular head of the Seaforth regiments, and Colonel-in-Chief of the 4th Seaforths, writing to Major Cuthbert, said:—"I am indeed proud to be associ-

ated with a regiment which, by its bravery, has so magnificently upheld the reputation of the Seaforth Highlanders, and proved themselves worthy successors of those who have made its name so well known throughout the Army for its courage and gallantry."

THE BATTLE OF AUBERS RIDGE.

From 18th March onwards the 1/4th Seaforths were regularly on duty with few breaks during the next two months. They took their part regularly in the front line trenches, and did all the work which regular soldiers of the line are called upon to do. Successive drafts were sent out, and at the beginning of May the regiment was strong again in numbers.

As these sheets were running through the Press the battle of Aubers Ridge was being fought. On this occasion the 1/4th Seaforths formed part of a regular Brigade, and occupied front line trenches. To the men of Ross was given the task of taking part in the advance, which for some strong reason, according to "Eye-Witness," after a time, "was not pressed." The battle was more costly to the forces engaged than the battle of Neuve Chapelle, which village is nearby. Many regiments covered themselves with glory; some of them suffered more heavily than others. The 1st Seaforth Highlanders, the line regiment, lost many men, and were specially mentioned for a brilliant if fruitless charge. The 1/4th Seaforths responded with alacrity when the order came to advance, and they too lost severely—even more severely than at Neuve Chapelle, no fewer than 172 casualties occurring during the engagement, most of them in the first advance.

"There has been heavy fighting here since the 9th May," says a B Company man.

"Our Brigade was in the front line, so we had the honour of leading the advance.

"The 1/4ths were in the forefront this time, and right nobly did they respond to the call in the attack.

"The advance opened with a heavy bombardment of the enemy's trenches on the morning of the 9th May at 5 o'clock. This continued till 5.40.

"The infantry advanced by platoons, Nos. 1 and 2 (Tain,

Dingwall, Black Isle, and Alness companies), supported by No. 3 (Gairloch and Ullapool), and No. 4 (Invergordon and Brahan).

“The first that went out did not get any distance when they were met with heavy fire from machine guns and rifles. Our artillery had another go.

“We suffered fairly heavily, especially A (Tain) and C (Black Isle), but we held on until we got relieved late in the afternoon by fresh troops.

“The resistance was very strong, and you were forced to the conclusion that they had prepared for us this time and were not to be caught napping as at Neuve Chapelle.

“Still they must have suffered heavily, as their reserve and support trenches were in clouds of fire and smoke. Their front line did not that day suffer so much while we were there; hence the stubborn resistance we met.

“That evening our Brigade came back to their old billets; the ones we occupied last week, and we all felt pretty tired, although our spirits, despite our losses, were still high. We had been in the trenches for three days before the Sunday.”

The casualties recorded at Aubers Ridge, according to the official list, subsequently slightly varied, were as follows:—

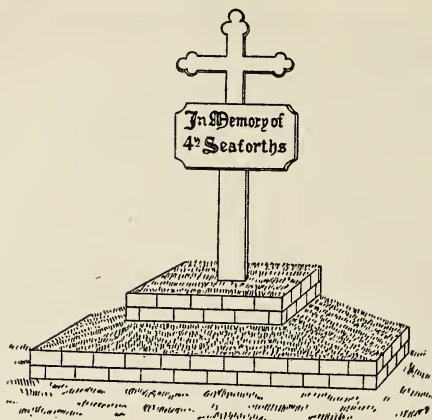

John Ross, son of Mr John Ross, painter, Dingwall, who is preparing the proposed cairn to be placed in the cemetery at Neuve Chapelle, in memory of the 1/4th Seaforths who fell on 11th March and were buried either on the field or in the cemetery. ROSS MOUNTAIN BATTERY AND AMMUNITION COLUMN.

This, like the 4th Seaforths, is a purely Ross-shire unit. With its Headquarters at Lochcarron, it is mainly recruited there and at Stornoway; Stornoway contributing very specially to the total. The Ammunition Column has been virtually wholly raised in Dingwall district. The Battery and Column form part of the 4th Highland Mountain Brigade, Royal Garrison Artillery, and the General Headquarters of the Brigade is at Rothesay, the other batteries being those of Argyll and Bute. Armed with serviceable weapons, the constitution of the force is generally identical to that of the famous Indian Mountain Artillery Brigades.

On the outbreak of war the whole of the Ross Battery and Ammunition Column mobilised at Dingwall. Here equipment was relatively completed; horses were commandeered all over the country, and within a fortnight all was ready for the second phase of the mobilisation order, and on Sunday, 16th August, the entire force moved off to the war station at Bedford.

Very strict and particular training proceeded at Bedford. By the end of the year all ranks were impatient to be at the front. Their time was to come. Refitted and complete to the last strap, the Ross and Argyll Batteries left Bedford on 20th March, for an unknown destination, which was not revealed until many weeks later, when it was told officially that the Brigade was operating at Gallipoli with the British Mediterranean Expeditionary Force. Letters home revealed a pleasant voyage, a short and agreeable stay somewhere close to the sea in the Near East, and subsequently the landing of the troops on the Dardanelles, where since land operations commenced the Brigade has been doing its bit in one of the bloodiest theatres of the great war.

Reports show that the Brigade is a credit to the Territorial Force, and that the men are as well equipped for their work as the regular gunners and drivers of artillery. It is not permissible to say more, the time will come when the story of the Brigade can be told, with particulars as to its officers, men, and equipment, but meantime Ross-shire people can take it that this important and serviceable unit—with few exceptions all Ross-shire men—are adding to the splendid martial traditions of the county. "It is a wicked bad campaign," as Kipling said of soldiers work in Egypt.

ROSS Mountain Battery—Continued.

Climate conditions are treacherous; hot through the day, bitterly cold of night. Water is scarce, and thirst is terrible. Food is plentiful, but the variety is restricted, and bread the soldier never knows. Mails take long to come and go, and comforts from home are limited on account of the want of "keepability" of luxuries which otherwise might be sent.

Still men write home in happy mood. "Life is grand here" one of them wrote after having eight week's "shell dodging."

Casualties, happily, have not been high, than which fact no testimony could be better to the fitness of the officers, who have been vigilant in their care of the men so far as securing concealment is concerned. The full list of casualties up till May 25th, 1915, is as follows:—

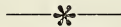

After the Battalion reached France they were put in quarantine for a week or two, consequent on a few cases of scarlet fever which, with measles, became epidemic at Bedford just before—or immediately after—the Battalion left. Meantime war training under the sound of the guns proceeded with, and the Battalion was moved slowly nearer to the firing line, ultimately taking its turn with the regular regiments, first in reserve trenches and subsequently in advanced trenches.

NEUVE CHAPELLE CASUALTY LIST

The battle of Neuve Chapelle has been briefly dealt with in the Introductory Notes. Here the 1/4th Seaforths received their real baptism of fire.

The casualty list of the Battalion was prepared by Captain Sir John Fowler, adjutant, on the 15th March, 1915, and knowing the uncertainty and anxiety at home, and the fact that officers and men were writing home more or less unofficially giving names of killed and wounded, it was decided to take the earliest possible opportunity to make known the

facts, and thus within a week after the Battalion was heavily engaged the semi-official list made its appearance in the Press of the Territorial District.

The list which follows is based on Sir John Fowler's report. The only variation is that the heading "Died of Wounds" has been added to from the list of "wounded," so as to bring it down to the date of this being printed (April 20, 1915), while one missing man subsequently traced to Boulogne appears here as wounded:—

2/4th SEAFORTH HIGHLANDERS

Before the 1/4th Seaforths left for the front in November the work of raising the 2/4th Seaforths had well begun. The 1/4ths were carefully picked, and those left behind at Bedford included officers and men on the Home Defence list together with those on the sick list, as well as those whose training had yet to be completed. Meantime, however, a large number of men had joined at Headquarters at Dingwall, and these proceeded to Bedford to complete training, so as to be ready to supply Drafts for the front as required. Subsequently the 2/4ths were strongly recruited both from English towns and here in the North, and from the New Year until well into spring the local recruiting was good, so that between recruits and men who had been invalided or wounded there was at Headquarters at the beginning of April the whole of D Coy. in the lists which follow. It should be noted that in the following lists there appear the names of men who joined the draft, and also it is probable some names will be found duplicated, a circumstance due to the constant changing of men from one company to another while these lists were in preparation.

All Home Defence men have been picked out of the Battalion, and, as a separate unit, will be utilized for various military duties at home.

ROSS-SHIRE COUNTY INFORMATION.



AREA AND VALUATION.

The length of the county is 67 miles, and its breadth 58 ; its area is 3129 miles, or 2,003,065 acres ; of these, 321,000 are productive, 545,000 are untilled, and 1,136,065 are irreclaimable. The valuation of Ross and Cromarty, exclusive of railways, for 1914-1915 amounts to £272,169 15s 9d, while the railway valuation is £11,051. These valuations do not include the Burghs of Dingwall, Tain, Fortrose, and Cromarty.

ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE.

The population in 1911 was 77,353. The Parliamentary constituency is 8618.

By Act of Parliament 6 and 7 Vict., cap. 92 (local and personal), Dingwall was declared the head burgh of the shire ; but for the better and more expeditious administration of justice, it is divided into Wester, Easter, Black Isle, and Lewis districts, at the head of which respectively are the towns of Dingwall, Tain, Cromarty, and Stornoway, each having a Sheriff Court.

By the Sheriff Court Act, 39 and 40 Victoria, cap. 70 the sessions and vacations are as follows :—There are two sessions. The winter session commence on 1st October, and continues until the end of March. The summer session from 1st May till the end of July. The vacations—The months of April, August, and September, and 15 days at Christmas time (sect. 4 of Act). But by the Act, sect. 44, summary causes may proceed equally during vacation as during session ; and the Sheriff may, if he thinks fit, pronounce interlocutors in time of vacation in all causes.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT IN ROSS AND CROMARTY.



Under the various Local Government (Scotland) Acts, administration of general public affairs is regulated in the County by the County Council of Ross and Cromarty. The system is remarkably complete, and the work is divided so that each district of the County has its own local administration, while the central body exercises a general supervision over the work, and more or less directly controls all the expenditure.

The unit of representation in the County Council is the electoral division, usually parishes, divisions of parishes, or groups of parishes, each division electing a representative.

There are 51 divisions in Ross-shire, and these return each one county councillor. The elective county councillors, with one representative each from the four Royal or Parliamentary Burghs (Dingwall, Tain, Cromarty, and Fortrose) constitute the County Council of Ross and Cromarty.

The administrative functions of the County Council, while directly under the cognisance of the Council, are largely regulated by an admirable system of standing committees. The County Road Board takes general cognisance of all matters connected with that department, and reports annually to the County Council on the state of roads and bridges in the whole county, reviewing the proposals of the different District Committees. The Standing Joint Committee is more particularly responsible for the administration of the County Constabulary. The Finance and General Business Committee practically reviews the entire work of the Council and controls the incidence of revenue and expenditure. Public Health, that is medical and sanitary considerations, water and drainage, has a Committee to itself. Other Committees exist for executive work under the Diseases of Animals Act, Small Holdings and Allotments, Prison Visiting, &c.

District Committees.

For the direct duties of Road and Public Health administration, the County is sub-divided into six districts, and the representatives for each electoral division, with one representative each from the Parish Councils in the District, constitute the District Committees which under the County Council, have wide powers. Special water, drainage and lighting districts may be and are formed under the District Committees, which give to the Districts a system of administration more or less on all fours with that which burghs possess under the Town Councils Act and other statutes.

Parish Councils.

Each Parish in the County has a Council of its own, the duties of which are more or less confined to the administration of the Poor Law. Certain additional duties are placed on the Parish Councils, which have the oversight of rights-of-way, in all landward areas, and other duties such as the administration of the Burial Grounds Act, the administration of the Free Libraries Act, &c., may be assumed if so arranged, by the Parish Councils. The Parish Councils are brought indirectly into touch with the County Council through representatives which they elect to the District Committees.

Parish Council particulars will be found under the heading of Parish Information.

Election and General.

The County Council and the Parish Councils are elected triennially. The next election takes place in December, 1916. The work of all these bodies comes directly under the cognisance of the Local Government Board through which considerable Treasury Grants are made for the purposes of administration. Annual accounts are published by the County and Parish Councils, and these are audited by Government appointed auditors.

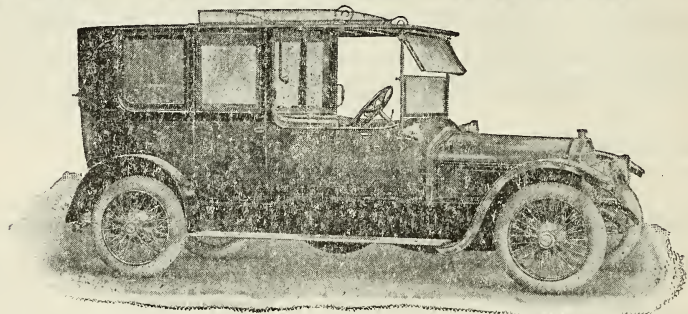

EDUCATION IN ROSS AND CROMARTY.



Ross-shire is remarkably well provided educationally, and the schools throughout the county will, in the efficiency of the work, compare favourably with schools in any part of the country. Education is free, under statute, in all primary public schools, but here in Ross-shire all Secondary Schools provide a complete course up to the Full Group Leaving Certificate without charge. Not only so, but pupils are actually assisted through Secondary Education courses by a system of bursaries allocated, from public funds, by the County Education Committee.

There are three types of schools recognised by the code—Primary, Intermediate or Higher Grade, and Secondary, but the distinctions are not pronounced in practice in Ross-shire, where there is a distinct line drawn only between Primary and Secondary Schools. Some of the Primary Schools are doing Supplementary work, and some of the Higher Grade Schools are doing more than Intermediate work. Rural schools, while only professing Primary work, through the good-will of the teachers, assist pupils seeking to pursue their studies beyond the regular course, but few of them, now-a-days, carry pupils through the full Intermediate course.

Primary Education.

Administration of Primary Education is directed by School Boards elected triennially by the ratepayers of every parish in the county, each parish having its own board. Primary Schools restrict their efforts to a general education complete in itself if not ambitious. One or two Primary Schools have Advanced Departments, which may aim at preparing pupils for the Central Secondary Schools. At present, however, the Supplementary course is more specially the objective of Primary Schools in rural districts. Its main purpose is to continue the education of pupils from the age of 12 up to 14 or 16 years, and to give them a sound general education, without languages.

Considerable grants on average attendance, and in relief of fees, are paid by the Scottish Education Department. Any deficiency in the education fund of each parish is met by assessment collected by the Parish Councils.

Secondary Education.

The County Education Committee exist chiefly for the purpose of fostering Secondary and Technical Education in the

Education in Ross and Cromarty.

County, and has the disbursement of large public funds for that purpose, distributed in the form of grants to recognised schools and of bursaries to certain selected pupils. Otherwise, under the Inspectorate as representing the Department, Secondary Education is administered in Ross-shire by the Parish School Boards, and the local education rate is more or less available, where required, to supplement the deficiency in the Education Funds, to which there is paid considerable grants by the Department.

The objective of Secondary Education, in practice, is the Intermediate leading up to the Full Group Leaving Certificate, and the Secondary Schools form the bridge between the Primary Schools and the University. No pupil need, in these days, leave the County in order to qualify for entrance to the University; the work can be, and is, regularly overtaken with most successful results in several Central Secondary Schools. The preparation of Junior Students destined for the Training Colleges is also undertaken in Secondary Schools, of which several Schools are recognised Centres for this work. The Education in these Secondary Schools affords a course of instruction hardly less advanced or important, although lacking the advantages of University life and experience, than some years ago was attainable by a full course in the Faculty of Arts at the Universities.

Average pupils should be qualified at the age of 13 to 14 to enter the secondary school which starts with the Intermediate course leading up to the Intermediate Certificate. This should be taken in three sessions. The Full Group Certificate usually requires at least other two sessions. For the Intermediate Certificate at least four lower certificates are required; for the Leaving Certificate four higher certificates or three higher certificates and two lower are required. The Intermediate Course is accepted for the chemist's examination, and while not meantime recognised as a qualifying test, is equivalent to the requirements of banking examinations, and certain civil service examinations; the Leaving Certificate qualifies for entrance to the University, and certain separate subject certificates are accepted in examinations in law.

Dingwall Academy, Secondary and Higher Grade Public School and Junior Student Centre.

Tain Royal Academy, Higher Class Secondary School, and Junior Student Centre.

Invergordon Academy, Secondary and Higher Grade Public School and Junior Student Centre.

Education in Ross and Cromarty.

Stornoway Nicolson Institute, Secondary and Higher Grade Public School and Junior Student Centre.

Funds of the County Committee.

The Ross-shire County Committee have a sum of about £10,000 to administer each year. Much of the money is ear-marked to specific purposes, such as fixed grants to Higher Grade Schools, while a very considerable sum is required for bursaries, medical inspection of schools (half the cost of which is borne by the Committee), and various other purposes. The balance unexpended at the end of the year should be allocated as a capitation grant-in-aid among the primary schools of the county.

Grants to Recognised Centres.

Under the Education Act which came into force in January, 1909, certain grants are payable by the County Committee to recognised Secondary Schools, Junior Student Centres, and Intermediate Schools in the County, as above detailed. These grants or payments fall under two general headings. First, each of these schools is entitled to be recouped by the County Committee for the net deficit per pupil on all pupils in attendance for an intermediate or higher grade course, when the ordinary residence of such pupils is outwith the school board district (i.e., parish). In other words, under this Act, no pupil from any other parish attending a Higher Grade School can possibly cost the ratepayers of the parish the Higher Grade School of which they are attending a single penny. Second, a grant is paid by the County Committee to every recognised Higher Grade School equal to half the net ascertained deficit of the school less a sum equal to the product of a penny rate on the net assessable rental of the parish. For example :—

Education in Ross and Cromarty.

These are the statutory grants; other grants may be paid for exceptional reasons.

Junior Students, i.e., students intending to qualify for the teaching profession by entrance to the Provincial Training Colleges are instructed at Junior Student Centres. The course runs on lines differing somewhat from those followed in the Intermediate and Full Group Courses, certificates in both of which are demanded.

Bursaries to Pupils.—Bursaries are awarded by the Committee for pupils in both the intermediate and higher grade course. Intermediate bursaries, so far as possible, are awarded to one pupil in each parish. The minimum value of the intermediate bursary, which is tenable for three years at least at a Higher Grade School, is £3, but, in the case of those whose attendance entails continuous residence from home, the value hitherto has been not less than £15. So great is the financial strain on the Committee that serious retrenchment in the bursary scheme is imminent. Applicants must be 14 years of age (completed). These intermediate bursaries are open to pupils, among others, who aim at the intermediate stage of the leaving certificate examination, with a view to seeking eventual nomination as Junior Students.

Secondary Bursaries are open ("with a preference to Junior Students") to "pupils needing such aid, who, having gained the Intermediate Certificate, and being specially recommended by the teacher and managers, proceed to or continue at schools recognised by the Department" for the work of the full leaving certificate, or for various other defined educational courses. These secondary bursaries vary; the maximum amount hitherto has been £20. Bursars whose home is in the school centre receive about £3; those who travel to school daily get from £5 to £10 according to distance, &c.; those who are in continuous residence from home may get up to £20.

Pupils desirous of becoming bursars should notify their head teachers early, and should communicate with the headmaster of the Central School they mean to attend. Applications for bursaries should be made before the end of the Committee's year in March.

Education in Ross and Cromarty.

Special Bursaries instituted by Sir George D. Mackenzie, K.C.M.G., C.B.:—(1) The "Sir William Mackenzie Bursary" of £30 for three years and (2) The "Jessie Mackenzie, Inchvannie, Bursary" of £30 for three years. One bursary is confined to schools on the Western Mainland seaboard and the Lews, and the

other to the rest of the county. The bursaries are open to boys and girls entering the University or Technical College with the view to graduating either in science or medicine. Particulars from Mr Alexander Ross, secretary, Dingwall.

Highland Trust Bursaries.—The Trust for Education in Highlands and Islands award bursaries of value up to £15 per annum to a limited number of pupils under competitive examination. Competition is keen and the standard of examination is beyond the requirements of the Intermediate and not far short of the Full Group. Particulars may be obtained from the headmaster of any higher grade school.

Ross-shire Victoria Jubilee Bursary.—The interest on a sum of slightly over £100. The bursary originated with the Rev. Wallace Brown, Alness, who made the suggestion in the jubilee year of the late Queen Victoria in 1887, and who collected the money along with the members of the Ross-shire Branch of the Educational Institute of Scotland. The examination arranged by the Ross-shire Branch of the E.I.S., is held each year on the first Saturday of July. Anyone who has been a pupil for a year or more of a school which contributed—there are forty—is eligible if under 13 years of age. The Bisset Memorial Medal—provided from a sum raised by the Branch in 1904 in memory of Mr Bisset, who was secretary for 23 years—is awarded annually along with the Bursary.

Dingwall Academy Bursaries.—The Academy receives the revenue of (1) The Maclellan Trust and (2) The Reid and Mackenzie Trust, amounting approximately to £42 and £30 respectively per annum. The money is apportioned into bursaries of £5 and £6 respectively, available for two or more years to pupils attending the Academy, and are competitive.

Smaller bursaries are available at one or two parish schools.

The total endowments in the county available for educational purposes yield an average revenue of £560, £99 of which is spent in bursaries, £72 of which being attached to Dingwall Academy.

Tain Academy Bursaries.—Two Murray Memorial University Bursaries of the annual value of £20, open to pupils who have been one session in attendance at the Academy.

One Donald Ross University Bursary, of the annual value of £30, open to boys, natives of Tain, who have been four consecutive Sessions in attendance at the Academy.

Four Macleod School Bursaries of the annual value of £4 each, awarded annually by competition, one to pupils entering each of Classes I., II., III., and IV.

One Duff School Bursary of the annual value of £12, for a boy belonging to Tain whose parents cannot afford to pay for his higher education.

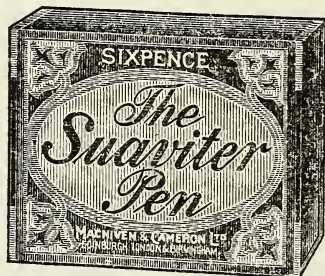

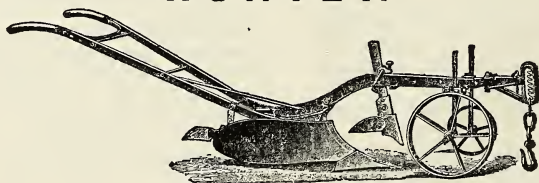

POST OFFICE INFORMATION.

RATES OF POSTAGE—For Inland Letters not exceeding 4 oz., 1d; not exceeding 6 oz., 1½d; and ½d for every additional 2 oz.

POST CARDS are sold at all Post-Offices, price 6d for eleven, singly at ½d each. Newspaper Wrappers, ½d stamp, 4d for seven; 1d stamp, 8½d for eight.

NEWSPAPERS—The rate of postage for Newspapers duly registered at the General Post-Office is ½d each within the United Kingdom, and at the rate of ½d per 2 oz. for any newspapers posted in packets.

REGISTRATION—All letters containing coin or articles of value should be registered. The registration fee for any packet sent to any place in the United Kingdom or abroad is 2d prepaid by stamps.

HALFPENNY POST—The inland rate of postage is :—For an open packet not exceeding 2 oz., ½d which may contain any matter not of a personal nature.

POSTAL ORDERS—These are issued for the following amounts, viz.:—For Orders of 6d, 1s, up to 2s 6d, commission ½d; for Orders of 3s, &c., up to 15s, commission 1d; for Orders of 15s 6d, &c., up to 20s and 21s, commission 1½d; any odd pence not exceeding five can be paid by affixing stamps not exceeding three to the face of them. These Orders are payable at any Money Order Office within three months after the end of the month of issue, after which date an extra commission, the same as originally charged, is payable for every three months after the first three, by postage stamps affixed to them.

INLAND MONEY ORDERS—Not exceeding £1, 2d; £3, 3d; £10, 4d; £20, 6d; £30, 8d; £40, 10d. **TELEGRAPH MONEY ORDERS**—Same as ordinary Money Orders, plus 2d, Supplementary fee and charge for advice to Postmaster, minimum charge 6d.

INLAND PARCEL POST—The maximum weight of a parcel which can be sent by Parcel Post is 11 lb., and the charge is not above 1 lb., 3d; 2 lbs., 4d; 3 lbs., 5d; 5 lbs., 6d; 7 lbs., 7d; and 8 lbs. up to 11 lbs., 1d per lb. The dimensions allowed for an inland postal parcel are :—Maximum length 3 ft. 6 in., maximum length and girth combined, 6 feet.
