

STATEMENT BY THE DIRECTORS.

THE following Statement of the affairs of the Society shows that it is still in a prosperous condition.

The number of New Members admitted since 1923, when the last Roll of Members was printed and circulated, is 214.

The Total Funds at 31st December, 1930, the close of the last financial year, amounted to £18,024, made up as follows:—

APPLICATION OF INCOME.

I. ORDINARY FUND.

The entry money of all Members of the Society at their admission is capitalised, and the revenue therefrom is available for distribution each year. The persons on the Relief Roll of this fund consist chiefly of Old and Infirm Members, Widows of Members, and Daughters of Members, and they receive Annuities of £14 each, payable by quarterly instalments—the sum expended under this head for the year 1930 being £472 10s.

II. BURSARY FUND.

This Fund was established in 1868, for the purpose of assisting deserving Students connected with the Society or the County, who otherwise might be unable to complete their University education, and applicants must be either descendants of Members, or natives of the county, or sons of natives resident in Glasgow. Lady Students are now eligible. The Fund was originally £500, but was subsequently augmented by private subscriptions, amounting to about £1,000, which, with the £1,000 transferred in 1897 from the Education Fund and one or two small legacies, makes the Bursary Fund now amount to £2701 9s. 8d.

This sum will enable the Directors to keep seven or eight Bursars on the roll of the Society at £15 each per annum.

The Directors believe these Bursaries have been a great boon to those on whom they have been bestowed. Several of the Bursars have later in life become Members of the Society.

III. SPECIAL FUND.

This fund was established in 1905, and as regards both capital and income it may be used for the purpose of relieving urgent cases of distress among individuals closely connected with both Ayrshire and Glasgow, irrespective of whether they are Members, or representatives of Members or not, in such manner as the Directors for the time being, in their discretion, may think expedient. The fund, however, is not intended for the assistance of persons who are ordinary subjects of parochial relief. The sum expended from this fund for the year 1930 was £71 12s. 6d.

DIRECTORS' MEETINGS, &c.

The Directors hold four stated Quarterly Meetings, viz., on the Tuesday after the first Monday of February, May, August, and November, at which the Relief Roll is revised, new applications Page Four

disposed of, and other business of the Society transacted. They also hold Special Meetings for disposing of applications for Bursaries as they become vacant, and for other purposes, and visit once a year such of the Annuitants as are resident in or near Glasgow.

It will thus be seen that the Society has been doing much good in the past, and is making steady progress; but Ayrshire is a large County, and with the influx that has been going on from country districts to large centres of industry like Glasgow, there are a great many sad and distressing cases being brought before the Society. The Directors therefore respectfully request the Members to assist them to add largely to the funds of the Society, either by increasing the membership, or by donations, or legacies to the Special Fund, so that the efficiency and benefits of the Society may be maintained and extended. The Life Membership entry money is £3 3s. for both ladies and gentlemen, but in the cases of the wives, daughters and sisters of Members the entry money is modified to £2 2s.

Forms of Application for Membership, and also Forms of Application for the benefit of the several objects of the Society, can be obtained from the Treasurer or the Secretary.

HISTORY.

THE GLASGOW AYRSHIRE SOCIETY was instituted on the Twentieth day of October, 1761, with the object of "uniting together, in a social capacity, natives of Ayrshire and others immediately connected therewith, so as they might combine their efforts for the promotion of such charitable and benevolent objects as might from time to time appear to have claims on their common solicitude." It is believed to be the oldest County Benevolent Society in Scotland.

The Society, as conducted for many years, was purely for the charitable relief of Members, or their widows or families, who had fallen into poverty. But three other distinct and important objects were afterwards ingrafted on the original design—viz. the establishment of separate funds for Education and for Bursaries, and a Special Fund for urgent cases of distress. In the year 1838 the Education Fund was commenced, with a donation from Dr. Walter Brechin, of Glasgow, amounting to £250, for the purpose of providing education to children or orphans of Ayrshire people who had fallen into reduced or destitute circumstances. This fund continued till 1897, when it amounted to £1,000, and it was then, in consequence of the introduction of free education in schools, transferred, by resolution of the Society, to the Bursary Fund. The Original Bursary Fund was raised in the year 1868, through the instrumentality of William Brown, Jun., Esq., of Parkend, Saltcoats, and amounted to £500. The Supplementary Bursary Fund was raised between the years 1877 and 1879, and amounted to £1001 11s.; the object of both funds being to provide Bursaries, in the University of Glasgow, to students connected with Ayrshire, who, without such assistance, might be unable to prosecute their studies.

The Special Fund was founded in 1905 on the initiation of Mr.

As the aims and objects of the Society developed, its rules and regulations have been from time to time revised, and the following is now its Constitution:—

CONSTITUTION.

I.—Name and Objects.

The name of the Society is The Glasgow Ayrshire Society; and its leading objects are the preservation and management of the three Funds before mentioned, and of additions thereto, for the purposes for which they are respectively set apart, as after provided. Additional separate funds may from time to time be established by the Society for other defined charitable or benevolent purposes; and special rules, suited to the circumstances, shall be made for the management of these Funds.

II.—Persons Eligible as Members.

All persons natives of Ayrshire, or having an interest in the county by property, business, or residence, and all persons connected by marriage or relationship with Members of the Society, or with persons qualified to be members, may be elected Members of the Society. Members may be elected at any meeting of Directors, or at the Annual Meetings. The full name and address, with a statement of the qualification of every person to be proposed as a Member, is to be communicated in writing to the Secretary, before the meeting, by his or her proposer. The entry money for the present is fixed at £3 3s., for both ladies and gentlemen, except the wives, daughters, or sisters of Members, for whom the entry money shall be £2 2s., but, as expressed in an old rule, "The stated entry money shall not be construed to restrain the liberality of those who may be disposed to contribute more largely to the Funds."

III.—General Meetings.

A stated Annual General Meeting of the Society shall be held in the month of January, on the day held as "Burns' Anniversary," at which the Directors shall make a report of the proceedings and progress of the Society for the previous year to 31st December, with statements of the capital, and the particulars of its investment, and the annual income and expenditure, under the heads of the several funds belonging to the Society. At each Annual General Meeting the President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, for the then ensuing year, shall be chosen, and the three Ordinary Directors at the top of the list shall retire from Office. All the vacancies in the Directorate shall then be filled up, and the names of the new Directors shall be added at the bottom of the list in the order of their election. Any Member of the Board of Directors shall be eligible for re-election. Special General Meetings of the Society may be called on a requisition to the Secretary, stating the purpose of the Meeting, signed by three Members of the Board of Directors, or eight ordinary Members of the Society. All General Meetings shall be advertised not less than twice in one or more Glasgow newspapers, at least seven days before the Meeting.

IV.—Board of Directors.

The management of the affairs of the Society shall be vested in a Board of Directors, consisting of a President, a Vice-President, twelve ordinary Directors, Secretary and Treasurer, all Members of

the Society, to be chosen as before provided. Any vacancies which may occur in the Board from non-acceptance, death, resignation, or any other cause, may be filled up by the remaining Members of the Board; and the Member so named shall, as regards the period of office, take the place of the Member whose office has become vacant.

V.—Meetings of Directors.

The Directors shall hold four stated quarterly meetings, for disposing of the business of the Society—viz., on the Tuesdays, after the first Mondays of February, May, August and November, or on such other day in the first or second week of these months as the President or Vice-President may determine at the time. The President or Vice-President, or any three Directors, may direct the Secretary to call special meetings of the Board, from time to time, for managing the business of the Society. The Directors may appoint Committees of their number for the transaction of any particular business, and with such powers as they deem necessary. The quorum of a meeting of Directors shall be three; and at all meetings of the Directors, the President, if present, shall preside; failing him the Vice-President, and failing him one of the Directors chosen at the time. The person presiding shall have a casting as well as a deliberative vote, in case of equality. Meetings of Directors or Committees shall be called by circular, delivered or posted not later than the day previous to the meeting.

VI.—Duties of Secretary.

The Secretary shall give notice of all meetings of the Society, Directors and Committees; attend such meetings and write the Minutes; engross them and all other documents in the Minute Book; frame and engross Reports of Directors and Committees; keep the roll of Members; make out diplomas or certificates of Membership; take charge of the titles and documents of the Society; and generally manage and conduct, under the direction and control of the Board of Directors, the business and general affairs of the Society. His Salary shall be deemed payment in full of all charges which he can make against the Society for the business and duties performed by him.

VII.—Duties of Treasurer.

The Treasurer shall have the responsibility of collecting and disbursing the funds or income of the Society, under the direction

and control of the Board of Directors. He shall also prepare the Annual Statements of the Capital, Investments, and Income and Expenditure of the Society. When the money in his hands amounts to £20 he shall deposit the same in the Society's Bank Account. The Bank Account shall be operated upon by cheques signed by the Treasurer, and counter-signed by the Secretary and also by one of the Directors.

VIII.—Regulations as to Capital.

The Capital of the Ordinary and Bursary Funds of the Society shall be kept distinct and preserved entire. All entry monies shall be added to the Ordinary Fund. The Capital, as well as the income of the Special Fund, shall be held or applied at the discretion of the Directors for the time being. Special subscriptions and donations shall be added to the fund to which they are appropriated. In the event of any of the separate funds becoming greater than is required for the proper purposes thereof, it shall be competent for the Society to resolve that payment of a specified amount be made out of the capital of such fund to any of the other funds of the Society; but such resolution shall be passed and confirmed in the manner hereinafter provided with regard to alterations or amendments on the Constitution of the Society. The capital of the Society may be invested in loans upon bonds and dispositions in security over lands or houses, or upon mortgages or bonds of public companies or corporations incorporated or empowered by Act of Parliament, or in the purchase of heritage, feu-duties, ground annuals, Government Stock, or the guaranteed stocks or debenture stocks of the said public companies or corporations.

IX.—Application of Income.

The entire annual income of the Ordinary and Bursary Funds of the Society shall, so far as fitting applicants or objects for its distribution can be found, be spent annually; but should the whole income not be spent in any year, the surplus, or part thereof, shall be, wholly or partially, either added to capital or carried forward for distribution in a future year, or appropriated to any of the other objects of the Society, as may be determined at the Annual General Meeting of the Society. The income as well as the Capital of the Special Fund shall be held or applied at the discretion of the Directors as after mentioned.

The following general regulations are applicable to the different funds. The Directors may from time to time make such detailed rules as to the forms and attestations of applications, and enquiries to be made thereanent, as they consider necessary:—

I.—ORDINARY FUND.

The income from this fund shall be applied, in the discretion of the Directors, to the relief of persons in reduced or destitute circumstances, but not receiving parochial relief, in the order of precedence following, that is to say (1) Members of the Society; (2) the widows, sisters, brothers, or descendents of deceased Members; (3) natives of Ayrshire resident in Glasgow.

II.—BURSARY FUND.

- (1) This fund, including what was formerly known as the Education Fund, shall be devoted to the Establishment of Bursaries in the University of Glasgow, of which the Board of Directors for the time being shall be perpetual Patrons. The Bursaries shall not, however, be increased beyond their present amount. The Bursaries shall be known as the Glasgow Ayrshire Society's Bursaries.
- (2) A Bursary shall not be tenable for a longer period than three years, and shall be subject to the conditions that the Bursars shall give regular attendance at the classes as students in one or other of the faculties; that they shall produce evidence of having passed, in a satisfactory manner, the examination in the various classes attended by them; and that they shall otherwise conduct themselves to the satisfaction of the Patrons.
- (3) The Patrons shall be sole judges in all questions and disputes which may arise in reference to any Bursary, and they shall have absolute power to withold payment at their discretion of the whole or any part of a Bursary, when and so often as they may think right.
- (4) The Bursaries shall be open to applicants of both sexes between the ages of 14 and 24 who are either descendents of Members of the Society, or natives of Ayrshire, or sons, or daughters of natives resident in Glasgow.
- (5) Before receiving a presentation to a Bursary, the applicant shall undergo such examination as the Patrons from time to time may appoint.

- (6) In judging of the eligibility of applicants, the Patrons shall require that they be of good moral character, well recommended by the teachers under whose tuition they have formerly been; that they have given evidence in their previous studies of good average ability, and are in circumstances which render the aid of a Bursary necessary or desirable.
- (7) A fixed sum out of the free annual proceeds of the capital invested shall be paid to each Bursar, at such times and in such sums as the Patrons may appoint, but no Bursary shall exceed £15 per annum.
- (8) The Patrons shall have power to alter the above regulations, or to adopt new and additional ones, at any meeting called for the purpose, and from time to time to make bye-laws or regulations for more effectually carrying out the objects for which the Bursaries are established.

III.—SPECIAL FUND.

- (1) The Capital and income of the Special Fund shall be available for any urgent cases of distress among individuals closely connected with both Ayrshire and Glasgow, irrespective of whether the individuals requesting assistance are members or representatives of members or not, and may be held or applied to such extent, by such grants, at such times, and in such manner as the Directors for the time being may think most expedient.
- (2) Without limiting the discretion of the Directors for the time being, it is declared that the fund is not intended for the assistance of persons who are ordinary subjects of parochial relief.

X.—Amendments on Constitution.

The present Constitution may be altered and amended from time to time, as may be deemed expedient, by resolution of an Annual or Special General Meeting, concurred in by a majority of not less than three-fourths of the Members present; but no such resolution shall be proposed unless previous notice of it be given in the advertisement calling the Meeting, nor shall it be carried into effect until it is confirmed by the following Annual General Meeting, or by a Special General Meeting called not earlier than one month after the first meeting.
