## MEMORANDA

AS TO

### THE EARLY HISTORY OF THE INCORPORATION OF TAILORS OF RUTHERGLEN

---

When in 1892 the Charter Chest of the Incorporation was handed over to the present Clerk, the only document found in it, beyond a few receipts of a comparatively recent date and of no special importance, was the Charter or Seal of Cause granted to the Incorporation by the Provost, Bailies and Council of Rutherglen on 1st December, 1657. It is, however, a fortunate circumstance that there has since been delivered to the Incorporation the Minute Book recording the transactions of the Trade from the middle of the eighteenth century to the middle of last century. Before proceeding to trace the early history of the Incorporation as far as this can be done from the Minute Book and from the records of the Town Council it is appropriate that a short reference should be made to some Acts of the Scottish Parliament bearing on the subject of the Crafts generally.



Tradesmen or craftsmen existed in the various Scottish Burghs as early as the establishment of the towns themselves, but there is no evidence that they formed themselves into corporations until a much later period. By an Act of the Scottish Parliament, 1424, it is ordained that in each craft there be chosen a "wise man of that craft" to be "Deakon or Maisterman over the laife for the time, to govern and assay all warkes that beis maid." Two years later this Act was rescinded on the ground that the office "tended to the detriment and expense of the whole kingdom" but by an Act of the latter year the office was continued till the next Parliament, on the proviso, however, that the Deacon should have "na correction of the craft nor of na man thereof, bot allanerlie to see that the Warke-men be cunning, and the warke sufficient, and quhilk he sall assay and examine ever ilk fiteene daies anis."

Accordingly in the next Parliament it was ordained that the Council of a Burgh choose a wardane for a year for every craft to "examine and prise the mater and the warkeman-shippe of ilk craft." In 1491 another Act was passed on the narrative that "the using of Deakons of men of crafte in Burrowes is richt dangerous, and as they use the samin may be the cause of great trouble in Burrowes, and convocation and rising of the Kingis lieges be statutes making, contrair the commoun profite, and for their singular profite and availe" and it was provided that all "Deakons sall cease for ane zeir and have nane uther power bot allanerly to examine the fines of the stuffe and warke that beis wrocht."

Subsequently an Act, 1555, cap. 52, on the preamble that the choosing of Deacons and men of craft within Burghs has been dangerous and has caused great trouble, commotion, and rising of the Queen's lieges in diverse parts, enacted that there be no Deacons chosen in time coming, but that the Provost, Bailies and Councillors should choose the most honest man of craft to visit the craft, to see that they laboured sufficiently and that the work was of good material. This last Act does not seem to have been long observed for we find shortly after its passing that the trades in a number of Burghs were allowed to choose Deacons, and a charter was afterwards granted by James VI. on 22nd July, 1581, to the tradesmen in the various Burghs dispensing with all the provisions of the Act of 1555 which obstructed the liberties of craftsmen in Burghs and restoring to them the privilege of enjoying and having Deacons of crafts.

The appointment of Deacons thereafter became general and a large number of the crafts subsequently formed themselves into Incorporations. This was done by obtaining a Royal Charter, or a Seal of Cause, from the Magistrates and Council, or by a prescriptive possession of the privileges of an Incorporation.

With regard to the Tailors of Rutherglen it cannot now be definitely ascertained whether they had formed themselves into a Society or Incorporation prior to the granting of the Seal of Cause, but that a combination or union of some kind existed before 1657 is manifest from the Supplication made

to the Town Council for the Charter by the Tailors themselves, for it is there stated that the "libertie and friedom of their trade of tailyeorie throw the want of ane Deacone to be reowler over them is almost decayed, the comone good and other casualties which might be colected thair of neglected and the knowledge and practique of their said trade neirley extinguished to the enorme lesione and prejudice of the friedom, priviledges, and publict interest of this incorporatione and to the hurt and damage of the people damnified and wronged by the bad government of the sd craft."

The Magistrates of Rutherglen formerly had a supervision over the craft, for it is recorded in the Rutherglen Council Records for the year 1641 that they appointed "Williame Scott and John Leitch, tailyeores, to be visitoures and oversiers of the haill brether of the craft and to take tryell of all works wrocht be thame and of the sufficiencie and insufficiencie thair of, and to represent all wronges done be any of thame to the magistrates that ordour may be tane thairwith."

In 1659, on the Incorporation desiring that the hours for commencing and ceasing the day's labour when "they worke out of their awin howses" be fixed, the Council ordered that they "enter at fyve a clock in the morneing and lieve off at nyne a clock at night."

On the preamble that "thair former waidges were so small and littell that no member of their trade was able hardly to mentine themselfes let be mentine thair familie," the Incorporation passed an

Act that no member should work for less than 5s Scots a day, and the Council on 7th November, 1695, approved of the Act "in the haill heids, articles and clawssis and conditiones thair of and ordained the deacone and haill members of trade from this tyme furth to exact and take for thair dayes workeing in any persones howse fyve shillings Scots and no les." This proceeding on the part of the Tailors seems to have given dissatisfaction, for we find that on 21st January, 1706, the Council, on the narrative that the Act was passed during the "tym of the late dearth whenn all things were at a deair rate" and "that all things is now very cheape and the money very scant," found the Act to be "unjust and unressonable and to be a burdine on the burgesses and inhabitants of this place" and they thereupon rescinded it.

The Incorporation of Tailors was formerly directly represented on the Town Council by two of its members. The Set of the Burgh which was enacted by the Council on 12th October, 1671, reformed in Rutherglen the objectionable practice which existed in many Burghs of the Provost and Bailies electing the Council, "whairby some leiding and factious men have brought in on the Counsell all their friends, allayes (allies), relationes and adherents." Under the Set, the four Incorporations—the Smiths, the Weavers, the Masons and Wrights, and the Tailors—were recognised. The Common Council was to consist of 15 persons. Each of the first three Incorporations above-named was to give in a list of six persons, the Tailors were to give in a list of four persons and the remaining

Burgesses—presumably those not connected with any of the Incorporations—were to give in a list of eight persons. The Magistrates then met and elected three persons from each of the three lists comprising six names, two persons from the list of Incorporation of Tailors and four persons from the list of the unincorporated Burgesses, making 15 Councillors in all, who, with the Provost and two Bailies, constituted the Council.

The number of Councillors—18—is continued to the present day, although the method of election provided for by the Set, which was in 1671 deemed so satisfactory that it was declared that this “forme of electione of the commone Counsell is to be unalterable in all tyme-comeing” and was as late as 1819 considered by the Council of that year as the most liberal constitution in Scotland was abrogated by the Burgh Reform Act of 1833, when the system of election by popular vote, now with an extended franchise, was introduced. The minute of the Incorporation of 6th May, 1833, shews that they did not allow the change to be made without a protest.

In 1778 and the following year the Council Minutes record at considerable length the proceedings which culminated in an action in the Court of Session in connection with the election as a Councillor of Andrew Lindsay, a member of the Incorporation, and one of the leet of four names sent in by the Trade. It is altogether beyond the scope of these Notes to set forth any narrative of the dispute, which inter alia involved the question of Lindsay’s residence out of Rutherglen at the time of

and preceding his election, and the details of which will form instructive reading when the Council records of Rutherglen come to be printed. The minutes of the Incorporation merely state that an objection was taken to Lindsay voting or being voted upon on the ground that he had not resided a year and day within the Burgh.

Towards the end of the eighteenth century, an interesting question arose with regard to admission to the craft which is fully set forth in the Council records. At the meeting of the Master Court on the 16th November, 1781, a petition was presented from John Williamson, Journeyman Tailor, craving to be admitted a freeman of the Trade and the Court after considering the same “unanimously resolved not to interfere in said affair any manner of way.” Thereafter, on 5th December, the following Petition was presented to the Incorporation:—  
“Unto the Deacon, Masters, and remanent Members of the Incorporation of Taylors in Rutherglen, The Petition of John Williamson, Journeyman Taylor in Rutherglen, Humbly sheweth That the Petitioner entered into Indentures with John Turnbull, present Deacon of the Trade, to serve him for the space of Five years which the Petitioner served accordingly except for about seven months of his time which he bought up from his Master and obtained a discharge from him which the Trade are in the knowledge of. After the expiry of which Indenture the Petitioner was Booked a Journeyman and served as such in order to intitile him to be entered a Freeman after the expiry of the term



upon payment of certain fees fixed by the regulations of the Trade as having served apprentice with a freeman. The Petitioner accordingly applied to be made a Burgess and afterwards a freeman with the Incorporation and was willing to pay the usual fees of entry as having served his apprenticeship with a freeman within the Burgh, but it having been objected against the Petitioner that he was not entitled to be entered on this footing as he had bought up some months of his time from his Master and so had not served with him the full space of his Indenture altho it had been regularly discharged. This occasioned a process at the Petitioner's instance against the Trade before the Court of Session, the result of which it is unnecessary to mention further than altho it appeared a proof that it had been customary in the different Trades in Rutherglen for apprentices to buy up part of their time and obtain discharges of their Indentures from their Masters and that a number of the Freemen had actually done so, and afterwards admitted Freemen on the footing of having served as apprentices with Freemen. The Court of Session found I was not entitled to be entered as a Freeman of the Corporation as having served apprentice with a Freeman, and so the matter stands at present. It is well known to every member of the Incorporation that the Petitioner either in the character of apprentice or Journeyman has served at the Taylor craft in Rutherglen for nearly the space of eight years and as I was regularly Booked a Journeyman for more than a year past and paid the usual fees in terms of the Acts of Trade, and that I am now

willing to restrict my claim for admission into the Corporation and to pay the usual fees of entry that Landward persons or those that have been bred to the business and served apprenticeships out of the place are bound to. May it therefore please the Incorporation in respect of the premises and that the petitioner is a Burgess and resider in the place to find I am entitled to be entered a Freeman on paying the usual fees that strangers or Landward Intrants are bound to. To assign me an Essay and admit me a member of the Incorporation on paying such fees accordingly. According to Justice, etc.—(Signed) John Williamson.”

The Petition was duly considered at a Meeting of the Incorporation, the Minute of which is in the following terms:—“At Rutherglen, the Twenty-eight day of December, seventeen hundred and eighty-one years, convened John Turnbull, Deacon; John Auldcorn, Master of Craft; James Knox, John Parkhill, and Andrew Lindsay, Members of the Incorporation of Taylors in Rutherglen, when the Petition of John Williamson, Journeyman Taylor in Rutherglen, was laid before the Trade craving to be admitted a Member of Trade as said Petition more fully bears. The Trade after considering the same were unanimously of opinion that they could not intermeddle with the same, but in the meantime the Deacon, James Knox, and Andrew Lindsay refers the same to the Magistrates and Town Council for their determination against which last resolution John Auldcorn and John Parkhill gave their desint. (Signed) John Turnbull.”

The two dissenters having altered their views we find at the latter end of the next year the following Minute of the Incorporation :—"Rutherglen, November 30th, 1782. Convened the Members of the Incorporation of Taylors in Rutherglen, and taking into consideration John Williamson's petition craving to be admitted into the Trade and taking the same into a second consideration think it best and safest to referr it to the Magistrates and Council, and we do hereby referr the same unto them and wait for their determination. (Signed) John Auldcorn, John Turnbull, Andrew Lindsay, Allan Scott, James Knox, John Parkhill."

Accordingly the matter came before the Town Council, who, on 30th November, 1782, resolved to "authorise and enjoin the Corporation of Taylors to enter and receive the said John Williamson a Freeman of their Trade upon his undergoing an essay and being found qualified in the ordinary manner and paying the fees of his Entry upon the footing of a Stranger or Landward person in terms of the prayer of his Petition." Finally, on 31st May, 1783, Williamson was admitted a Freeman of the Incorporation.

In 1817 the Incorporation was again involved in an action in the Court of Session in connection with an election of Councillors. A Petition was presented by John Williamson, one of the Members, asking the Court to find that the Incorporation did wrong in returning to the Magistrates a leet containing the names of John Lowson and William Henderson, they not being Burgesses of the Burgh,

and that the Magistrates did wrong in sustaining the leet and in electing Lowson as a Councillor and to ordain the Magistrates again to meet and elect out of the said leet two persons legally qualified to be members of the Council and to expunge Lowson's name from the list of the Council. On 25th December, 1817, the Incorporation met "in order to hear John Williamson's reasons for accusing John Lowson and William Henderson being members of Craft, but John Williamson not appearing, though legally warned by the officer, the meeting was obliged to stop and it was unanimously agreed that the Deacon should call John Williamson by an officer before the Lord Provost to give in his reasons for libelling any of the members of Craft before the Court of Session." The Petition was followed by the usual cumbrous proceedings of the Supreme Court in those days — Answers for the Magistrates, Replies by Williamson and Duplies by the Magistrates. It appears from the pleadings that one of the grounds on which Lowson's election was challenged was that he had not paid certain stamp duties to the Government. What the result of the action was the writer does not authoritatively know, although he believes that the Petition was dismissed, and the election held to be valid.

It is provided by the Set of the Burgh that for "audeting, comptrolling and stateing of the Thesawrer accompts zeirlie" three persons shall be elected by the Council and three by the Incorporations and the unincorporated Burgesses. The audit of the accounts of the Burgh by the six auditors appointed in this way continued so recently as the

year 1900, when they were superseded by a professional accountant appointed by the Secretary for Scotland in terms of the Town Councils Act of that year.

Though the Dean of Guild in Rutherglen is a Magistrate of comparatively modern creation, the method of electing the lyners of his Court was, until recent years, carried out in the same way as was the election of auditors under the Set. At the joint Meeting composed of three representatives from the Tailors and eight from the unincorporated Burgesses held yearly in October for the election of three lyners of the Court it was the practice to appoint a member of the Incorporation as one of the lyners. But the unincorporated Burgesses have not met for some years and the Incorporation at its annual meeting in October appoints the three lyners from its own members.

The Incorporation owns a seat in the Parish Church of Rutherglen. In 1660 the Deacon having applied for a seat for the use and accommodation of the trade, the Council adjourned consideration of the application and ordered that all the trades that desired seats should "give in there desyres thairanent." The Council were in no particular hurry to dispose of the application for it was not till 1664 that they granted liberty to the Tailors to "erect and build up ane new seate or dyke consisting of two pews for the accomodatione of the trade in the south yle upon the southsyde wall thairof extending from the yle doore eestward (the foir seate being made no hier nor provest Scott's

seate is). They are to devyde the yle doore in twa and to hing ane half thairof upon eache syde of the doore and to uphold the glass window at the bake of there said seate intymcuming upon there awn charges." The Church here referred to was the ancient Church of Rutherglen taken down in 1794-5.

The Incorporation seems to have quietly, and let us hope profitably, occupied their seats for almost 80 years, for the next reference in the Council books to their "accomodatione" in the Church does not appear till 1720, when we find that the Treasurer of the Burgh was ordered "to pay the trade sex pund Scots upon this condition that the trade remove the seat out of that place where it is now standing pecablie without any farder pley (complaint) or debate."

In the Charter Chest was found a document of date 15th May, 1813, acknowledging that there had been paid to Archibald Allan, Treasurer of the Burgh, by James Knox, Collector of the Incorporation, "the sum of Ten Pounds Sterling as the Price of the Seat in the Gallarey of the new Church of Ru'glen Marked on the plan thereof and on the Seat itself numbered twenty-five so the said Incorporation, their Heirs and Successors are hereby Declared to have Reight to the Said Seat equally in all Time Coming." The new Church referred to is, of course, the Church which was closed on 18th March, 1900, and shortly thereafter demolished. Immediately after the erection of the present "new Church," which was opened on 31st May, 1902, negotiations were entered into between the Incor-



poration and the Heritors which resulted in virtue of the claim to sittings in the old Church, in the allocation of the pew in the Gallery Number 130, upon the book board of which there has been placed a suitable brass plate testifying that the pew is acknowledged as the property of the Incorporation. Appended to the document above referred to is a receipt by Mr Allan to Mr Knox for the sum of One Pound as the Incorporation's part of the expense of the law plea "in regard of repairing the Minister's Mance."

In 1762 the Council assessed the Incorporation in the sum of Fifteen Shillings Sterling towards defraying the expenses of repairing the Kirk and Kirkyeard dyke.

The number of members of the Incorporation is given as 12, in the Report on Rutherglen of the Royal Commission on Municipal Corporations in Scotland, 1835.

The following is an Excerpt from the Minutes of the Meeting held on 6th November, 1845, for the election of Auditors:—"Before proceeding to the Election an objection was stated to the Meeting against admitting Alexander Lowson, Deacon of the Tailors, and William Fyfe, one of the Masters of said Incorporation, for having any vote in the present election, on the ground that they were admitted Members of the Incorporation and advanced to the Office of Master and Deacon without ever being admitted Burgesses of the Burgh, it being a breach of the Constitution and Sett of the Burgh, and contrary to their Letter of Deaconry,

therefore the Meeting sustained the objection, and they were therefore not allowed to vote."

The Charter or Seal of Cause which was granted by the Magistrates as already stated on 1st December, 1657, is in excellent preservation. It is written on vellum, and has appended to it a fine example of the Seal of the Burgh enclosed in a metal case.

The Charter Chest is strongly made of mahogany, measures about 2 feet by 1½ feet. It bears the date 1795, although it was in 1827 that a new box was ordered.

The Minute Book referred to at the commencement of these notes was found to be in the possession of Mrs Jenkins, Melrose Avenue, a daughter of John Brisbane, who was long connected with the Incorporation, and who was admitted a member in 1825, was first elected Deacon in 1834 and died in 1885. Mrs Jenkins has kindly handed over the Volume to the Incorporation. It is an extremely interesting "find," and a perusal of its contents shews us the subjects which engaged the attention of the members in the days when the Incorporation was a living force in the practical life of the Burgh. The Volume opens with a copy of the Seal of Cause of 1st December, 1657. Then follow the oaths taken by the Deacon, Masters, Collector, Officer and Freemen. The First Minute entered is that of 23rd November, 1753, and the records are continued in regular sequence to the year 1845, when, at the Annual Meeting of that year, the late Alexander Lowson was elected Deacon. We have been enabled to supply a complete list of Deacons from 1753 till the present time. The Master Court appears to have

had five fixed meetings, viz.: — The Candlemas Court in February or March, the Beltane Court in May, the Whitsunday Court in June, the Lambmas Court in August or September, and the Martinmas Court in November or December. The Annual Meetings for the election of Deacon and Office-bearers were held in September either in the Tolbooth or Court Hall. The Master Court had a variety of meeting places, sometimes in the Tolbooth and the Deacon's house, and occasionally at a Vintner's where, doubtless, there would generally be a full attendance of the members. They met usually in the evenings but the records show that they on occasions met at 7 o'clock in the morning. The Minutes are in the majority of cases signed by the Deacon and frequently they are authenticated by "his mark." The Incorporation exercised exclusive authority in matters connected with their trade. No one could work as a tailor unless he had the sanction of the Incorporation. Apprentices, journeymen and freemen, had all to be admitted before engaging in the business, and the latter, only after performing an essay (making a coat, etc.) to the satisfaction of the Court. The Incorporation regulated the wages to be paid to journeymen and generally acted as supreme authority in all matters connected with the trade. The members were continually borrowing from the funds and strenuous efforts were latterly made to recover the sums due.

At the end of the Minute Book, there are recorded under date 15th May, 1759, the Acts and Regulations of the trade, but, as these relate solely to trade matters, they are not printed.

But the energies of the Incorporation were not confined to matters connected with their trade. They had their say in the settlement of the Minister and in the election of the Schoolmaster. They contributed to the repair of the Kirk and the Manse, and made a contribution to the cost of the erection of Rutherglen Bridge. They assisted in the relief of the poor, and they supported the Magistrates in an interesting dispute between the Town Council and the Heritors of Rutherglen as to which of these bodies had the supervision and control of the Kirk-yard. A similar unsuccessful claim was put forward by the Heritors in 1909.

At a meeting in January, 1837, a notice of motion was given that all the property belonging to the Incorporation be equally divided among the members and at a subsequent meeting the motion was agreed to unanimously since all were to get their share.

The last Minute in the Volume is that of 19th September, 1845, when Alexander Lowson was elected Deacon. For some years prior to that date the sole object of the existence of the Incorporation seemed to be the election of a Deacon and Masters and attempts to recover sums of money due to the craft by impecunious members. As already stated, no person could work in the capacity of a tailor within the Burgh without the sanction of the Incorporation. Similar restrictions to free trading existed in nearly all the Burghs in Scotland. But the spirit of reform was in the air. So anomalous had the position become, that an Act of Parliament was

passed in 1846 abolishing the exclusive privilege of trading within Burghs. It made it lawful for any person to carry on or exercise any trade without being a member of a Guild, Craft or Incorporation. It further provided that Incorporations could retain their corporate character and continue to be Incorporations with the same names and titles as hertofore. The Rutherglen Incorporation seems to have anticipated this blow which almost finally extinguished it. Thereafter the Incorporations, or such of them as possessed property or revenues continued to exist for benevolent and educational purposes. But the Rutherglen Incorporation had no property or revenues, and it seemed destined for the fate which befell the other incorporated trades in the Burgh, all three of which have now passed away—the Masons and Wrights only a few years ago on the death in 1899 in his 85th year, of the Deacon, Gavin Park, Wright, the then sole survivor.

Of the members of the Incorporation of Tailors, John Brisbane and Alexander Lowson were, since about 1852, the two remaining representatives. It would appear that they foregathered annually as “the Incorporation of Tailors,” and one or other sat as a lyner in the Dean of Guild Court of the Burgh. Some time after Mr Brisbane’s death Mr Lowson was strongly urged by a number of gentlemen interested in preserving the old Institution, to admit a few members and thus keep up the continuity of membership. At first he stoutly declined to do so, but yielding to repeated solicitations and

to a promise that he would receive pecuniary acknowledgment of his act (which was afterwards done) he, on 15th December, 1892, at a Meeting held in the Town Hall of Rutherglen handed over the Charter Chest, which had long lain in his house, and admitted the following gentlemen to be members:—Mr Robert Lang, then Provost of Rutherglen; the late Mr George Gray, Town Clerk; Dr John M. Buchanan, Medical Officer of Health; Mr Allan S. Edmiston, Inspector of Poor; and Mr George Gray, the present Town Clerk. The subsequent history of the Incorporation may be found in its Minute Book. Mr Lowson, who was first elected Deacon of the Incorporation in 1845, died in 1898, in his 85th year.

The 250th anniversary of the granting of the Charter or Seal of Cause was celebrated on Monday, 2nd December, 1907, at a Dinner held in the Lesser Town Hall. Deacon Thomas B. McConnell presided, and the duties of Croupier were discharged by Collector Gilbert S. Reid, and there was a large attendance of members and friends.

It is to be hoped that the vicissitudes of the Tailors are now at an end, and that the Incorporation will become in our ancient Burgh what similar Institutions elsewhere have become, a useful benevolent Society.

CHARTER OR SEAL OF CAUSE

GRANTED TO THE

INCORPORATION OF TAILORS

OF RUTHERGLEN

1st DECEMBER, 1657

At Rutherglen, the First day of December, the yeir of God Ane thousand sex hundredth and fyftie seven yeires, In presence of Walter Riddell, Provost; David Smith and John Wilsone, Baillies, of the Burgh of Rutherglen; James Wyllie, Thesaurer; Andrew Pinkartoun, William Riddell, Johne Wilsone, George Farie, Johne Robesone, George Wyllie, Johne Fairie, Johne Aitkenheid, Robert Smith, James Patersone and Andrew Harvie, Counsellors of the said Burgh, anent the supplicatione gevin in befor them, Be John Cochrane and Thomas Wilkie, tailyeors burgess's of the said Burgh for themselffes and in name and behalfe of the remanent bretheren of their vocatione and trade of tailyeorie burgess's within the said Burgh Makand Mentione That whair the libertie and friedome of their trade of tailyeorie throw the want of ane Deacone to be rewler over them is almost

# RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE INCORPORATION OF TAILORS OF RUTHERGLEN

ENACTED 21ST SEPTEMBER, 1909, AND AS ALTERED  
AND AMENDED 30th NOVEMBER, 1921,  
AND 4th DECEMBER, 1946

## I.—ADMISSION OF MEMBERS

No person shall be admitted a Member of the Incorporation unless he is a Burgess and Guild Brother of the Royal Burgh of Rutherglen. Every applicant for admission to the Incorporation shall fill up a Schedule which may be obtained from the Clerk setting forth his full name, trade or occupation, place of business, residence, date of birth, and date of Burgess Ticket. The Schedule shall then be forwarded to the Clerk along with the applicant's Burgess Ticket or other satisfactory evidence of this being a Burgess and Guild Brother of the Burgh, and the applicant shall thereafter produce such evidence of the other statements in the Schedule as may appear to the Master Court necessary. Members may be admitted by the Master Court provided the persons proposed shall be approved at one Meeting and admitted at the following Meeting of the Court. The Court shall have the absolute power to admit or reject applicants for admission as members without reason assigned. The entry money payable by each person at his admission shall be specified in the Appendix hereto, or as may be from time to time fixed by the Incorporation at a General Meeting. No Member shall be qualified to vote or be voted upon until one year and one day after his admission as a Member, after which it shall be the duty of the Clerk to add his name to the Qualified Roll. No Member shall be qualified to vote until he has attained the age of 18 years.

## II.—OFFICE-BEARERS AND MANAGEMENT

### (1) THE MASTER COURT

The business of the Incorporation shall be managed by a Master Court to consist of the Deacon, the immediate late Deacon, Collector, late Collector, Deacon's Master, and six ordinary Masters. Two of the six Masters longest in office shall retire annually. The Incorporation may elect Honorary Life Members of the Court with all the powers of Masters, but it shall not be competent for more than two such members to hold office at one time. The Court, any five of whom shall form a quorum, shall hold four Quarterly Meetings in Rutherglen, on such dates and at such places as the Deacon shall appoint, to receive applications for admission of members, enrol pensioners, appoint Committees, and transact any other business. Besides these Quarterly Meetings the Deacon shall be entitled to call meetings of the Court at any time he shall think proper or necessary for the good of the Incorporation and at any of these Meetings the Court shall have power to admit members and enrol pensioners and to transact any other business of the Incorporation. The Deacon shall be bound to call a Meeting of the Court within 48 hours after receiving a written requisition signed by three of their number, and if he fail to do so within that period, the requisitionists shall be entitled to call the Meeting by delivering a signed notice of the time and place of Meeting, specifying the business, to each Member.

### (2) THE DEACON

The Deacon shall preside at all Meetings of the Incorporation and the Court, and in his absence the immediate late or any prior Deacon shall take his place, and in their absence any qualified Member may be appointed by the Meeting to preside. The Deacon or Chairman shall have a casting as well as a deliberative vote.

bursements sanctioned by the Court or the Incorporation. The funds of the Incorporation, in so far as not invested, in excess of £20 shall be regularly lodged in Bank, in the name of the Incorporation, and shall not be withdrawn except by cheque or other authority signed by the Collector and Clerk jointly, whom failing, two Members of the Court duly appointed by the Court for that purpose. The Collector shall make up an account of his intromissions with the Funds of the Incorporation to the 30th day of September yearly, which account shall be audited by a qualified Accountant appointed at the previous Annual Meeting of the Incorporation, and shall, with the Auditors' Report, be laid before a Special Meeting of the Court to be held as soon thereafter as practicable, and shall be produced at the next ensuing Annual Meeting.

#### (4) THE CLERK

The Clerk shall be elected annually by the Members on the Qualified Roll at the Meeting for electing the Deacon and other Office-Bearers and shall hold Office until the next Meeting for that purpose, and shall have such salary and emoluments as the Incorporation may determine. His duties shall be to intimate and attend all Meetings and keep regular Minutes of the business transacted. He shall also keep another book—to be called the Qualified Roll—in which the names of all the Members shall be alphabetically inserted.

#### (5) THE OFFICER

The Officer shall in like manner be elected annually by the Members at the Meeting for electing the Deacon and other Office-Bearers, and hold his Office until the next Meeting for that purpose and have such salary and emoluments as the Incorporation may determine. His duties shall be to carry the books and papers to and from the place of Meeting, keep the door at such Meetings and perform any other duties required of him by the Deacon or Court or Incorporation.

#### (6) MEETINGS OF THE INCORPORATION

A General Meeting of the Incorporation for the election of a Deacon and Office-Bearers, and for the transaction of any other business, shall be held annually upon the last Wednesday of October or on such other date not later than the last Wednesday of November as may be fixed by the Master Court, intimation of which and of the business to be transacted shall be made by Circular to each Member. Twenty members shall form a quorum. Special Meetings of the Incorporation may be called for the despatch of business or the consideration of any matter or subject affecting the Incorporation by the Clerk at the request of the Deacon or of any three Members of the Court, or of a requisition subscribed by fifteen Members on the Qualified Roll. All such Special Meetings—the quorum of which shall be twenty—shall be called by Circular specifying the business. All questions brought before any Meetings shall be determined by vote. No one in receipt of a pension shall be entitled to vote in the affairs of the Incorporation. All votes shall be taken by a show of hands, but if fifteen Members request it then it shall be by calling the Qualified Roll and the majority shall in all cases bind the minority. No member who has not attained the age of 18 years shall be counted in the constitution of the quorum of any meeting.

#### III.—ELECTION OF OFFICE-BEARERS

No Member shall be eligible for any office in the Incorporation unless he has been enrolled on the Qualified Roll and has attained the age of 21 years. At the Annual Meeting the following Office-Bearers shall be elected, the vote being taken by ballot:—

- (A) A Deacon, from among such Members of the Court, or from such Members of the Incorporation although not Members of the Court as have served one year as Collector and been discharged from that office at least one year prior to the date of his being elected Deacon. The Deacon shall hold Office for one year and shall remain a Member of the Court for the ensuing year.

- (B) A Collector, to hold Office for one year, who shall have served one year as a Member of the Court and shall be a member of the Court at the time of his nomination, and it shall not be lawful to re-elect the same Master as Collector until he has been one year out of Office as Collector. The retiring Collector shall remain a Member of the Court for the ensuing year.

Nominations for the Office of Deacon, Collector, and Masters shall be made by written notice delivered or posted to the Clerk not later than Six days prior to the Annual Meeting. Should a Member nominated for any office die before or withdraw at the election, and the remaining nominations be insufficient to fill the vacancies, additional nominations without any limit may be made at the General Meeting for the Election of Office-Bearers. All vacancies occurring in the Court during the year through death or otherwise shall be filled up by the Court at their first Meeting.

## IV.—FUNDS

The Funds of the Incorporation of whatever denomination shall be under the direction and management of the Court. The Court shall have power to secure and invest the said funds as they think most advantageous, either in the purchase of heritable property, feu-duties, ground annuals or of any of the Government securities of the United Kingdom, or of any British Colony or Dependency or of the stock or annuities issued by any municipal corporation or public trust, incorporated by Charter or Act of Parliament, in any part of the United Kingdom, or by lending the said funds on the security of any of the aforesaid heritages or securities, or of any municipal corporation, County Council, Parish Council, or public trust, incorporated as aforesaid, in any part of the United Kingdom, or making deposits in any one of the chartered or joint stock banks in Rutherglen or Glasgow, and for the usual interest at the time. A Reserve Fund shall be formed by crediting to such fund (1) the balance of revenue after payment of expenses, pensions and temporary relief for the year ending 30th September, 1941, or the sum of £100, whichever is the less, (2) a quarter of such balance in each year thereafter until the Reserve Fund amounts to £500, and (3) thereafter such sum not exceeding a quarter of such balance in each year as shall be necessary to maintain the Reserve Fund at the sum of £500. The Reserve Fund may be used by the Court for the purpose of granting pensions or temporary relief. The Court shall have power to expend the revenue of each year and such sums out of the Reserve Fund as they may see fit, but shall not have power to expend any further sums or vote any part of the funds for public purposes without the approbation of the Incorporation. The sums paid by members on admission and any balance of revenue at the close of the accounts for each year, after crediting the Reserve Fund as aforesaid, shall be preserved and accumulated as capital and not expended as revenue.

The funds of the Incorporation, whether consisting of heritable or moveable property, shall be, and are, hereby vested in and declared to belong to the Incorporation for the uses and purposes hereinafter specified. The title deeds of the heritable property and the vouchers and securities for the moveable funds shall be conceived in favour of the Deacon, Collector, and Clerk, and their successors in Office as trustees for the Incorporation. The title deeds, vouchers, and securities shall be immediately deposited in the Charter Chest which shall be committed to the charge of the Clerk, provided the Court shall be satisfied that he has a good and sufficient fireproof room for their safe preservation.

## VI.—PENSIONS

The Court shall have power to settle pensions from the funds on any Member or the Widow or Children or dependents of any deceased Member in indigent circumstances. The Court shall have power to decide who are proper objects for pensions and the amount of the pensions and shall have power to remove any person from the Roll of Pensioners at pleasure and no person shall have or acquire a legal right to demand a pension or pecuniary aid or a share of the funds of the Incorporation as a pensioner. Application from a Member or the widow or child or dependent of a deceased Member for a pension must be lodged with the Clerk on a Schedule to be furnished by him, which application shall be submitted to and disposed of as the Court may think proper. No pension shall be awarded until the expiry of 1 year and 1 day after the admission of the person in respect of whose Membership the aid is asked. The Court shall be entitled to give temporary relief to Members of the Incorporation or the widows or children or dependents of deceased Members whom they shall think proper objects, provided the amount so given

shall not exceed in whole £10 a year to any individual, and in the event of the death of any Member whose relatives or connections shall apply for funeral expenses, they shall be entitled to pay such sums as shall seem proper to them not exceeding £10 in any one case. Funeral expenses.

## VII.—ALTERATION OF RULES AND REGULATIONS

These Rules and Regulations shall not be altered or repealed until the proposed alteration or repeal has been tabled and read at one Meeting of the Incorporation and considered at another Meeting to be held at least one month subsequent to that at which it was tabled and read, and then agreed to by a majority of the Members present at such later Meeting.
