OBSERVE. Between 1st April and 1st October a large Boat leaves each side of the Passage, every lawful day, each hour from Six A. M. till Sunset; and during the remainder of the year from Eight A.M. till Sunset. A Pinnace sails from each side half an hour after the large Boat.

Separate fares to be exacted, when they exceed the sums payable for a freighted Boat, Pinnace, or Yawl.

Sunrise to be calculated according to the time when the Boat &c. leaves the landing place; and sunset according to the time when they reach it.

Signals for a chaise or horses to be in readiness, are hoisted in the boats when desired, and the skippers are allowed to charge 6d. for so doing.

* *Coach Passengers are not now chargeable for the conveyance of their Luggage to the Boats.*

Annual Meeting of Trustees held, alternately, on the north and south side of the Ferry, on the first Monday in September. The Passage is let in the first week of April, for one, two, or three years. The Committee of Management meets occasionally; Admiral Adam and A. Rolland of Gask, Conveners of Committee.

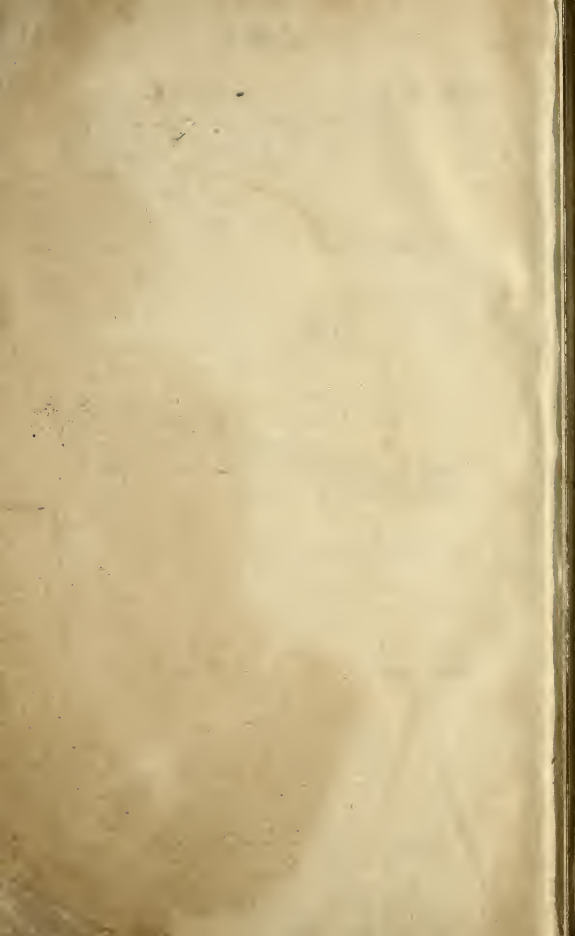
