THE SOCIETY OF DEACONS AND FREE PRESESES OF GLASGOW

The Society was founded in the year 1780 when Glasgow had only 43,000 inhabitants. The city was, however, well set for extension and development, but the very nature of its growth was such that many of the early wealthy citizens for relief of the poor. In the eighteenth century, the Trades House with the four other Incorporations, the Merchants' House, Fishmongers' Trust, the Clink Society and many other similar bodies all stood for benevolence and a great deal of good work was being done by them. It was out of the small number of these that the Society of Deacons and Free Preses arose, but their aim could not be better expressed than in the language of the preamble of the original Articles and Regulations which read:

"Among the numerous Associations in this City for charitable purposes none is better formed or more the end of establishing such a connection between them as that persons might thereby be directed for the benefit of the whole and advantage of the nation to the public men also who had devoted great part of their time and attention in raising and managing funds for the support of the poor seemed to be no longer provided for when their own circumstances fail and when in sickness and old age they were who have not contributed so much to the public benefit."

"These considerations induced a number of Deacons and Free Preses within the City to set themselves into a Society and begin the constitution and raising of a fund which in process of time through the blessing of God might prove the means of relief and support to such of their brethren as now or hereafter may think proper to join them in this laudable scheme or of their widows when in poor circumstances or as they may be decently supported while in sickness and distress, wherefore they did and do hereby avow themselves and a Society for the fore-said purposes to be called in all time coming The Society of Deacons and Free Preses within the City and Burgh of Glasgow."

These articles provided that membership was confined to "any person who hath been a Deacon of one of the Incorporations of this City or a Member of some charitable society and is a Freeborn and Civil Born of the City of Glasgow of a good moral character", and included among the members of the Society were Lord Provosts, Magistrates, Clergymen of Church, Deacons, Craftsmen, many Deacons of Incorporations, Presidents of such societies as The Grand Antiquary Society and The Anderson Weavers Society; but that the terms of the original constitution were in the process of time being gradually superseded and altered by the frequent representation of the names of other persons who were not primarily benevolent.

By 1817 there were up to 1817 many Deacons of the Incorporations of the City. This 1997 reprint of the History, Rules and Regulations of the Society has been printed with alterations to the Rules from 1980 and contains an up-to-date List of Members

HISTORY

The Society was founded in the year 1780 when Glasgow had only 43,000 inhabitants. The city was, however, well set for extension and development, but the very nature of its prosperity, arising as it did from trades which had their ups and downs, had lent itself to the formation of many worthy schemes for relief of distress among the people. In the Eighteenth Century, the Trades House with the Fourteen Incorporations, the Merchants' House, Hutchesons' Trust, the Clan Societies and many other similar bodies all stood for benevolence and a great deal of good work was being done by them. It was out of the multiplicity of these that the Society of Deacons and Free Preses arose, but the origin could not be better explained than in the language of the preamble of the original Articles and Regulations which reads:-

"Among the numerous Associations in their City for charitable purposes none hitherto formed answers the end of establishing such a connection between them as that schemes might thereby be derived for the benefit of the whole and advantage also accrue to the public; men also who had devoted great part of their time and attention in raising and managing funds for the support of the poor seemed to be no better provided for when their own circumstances fail and when in sickness and old age than others who have not contributed so much to the public benefit.

"These considerations induced a number of Deacons and Free Preses within the City to erect themselves into a Society and begin the contribution and raising of a fund which in process of time through the blessing of God might prove the mean of relief and support to such of their brethren as now or hereafter may think proper to join them in this laudable scheme or of their widows when in poor circumstances so as they may be decently supported while in sickness and distress, wherefore they did and do hereby erect themselves into a Society for the foresaid purposes to be called in all time coming The Society of Deacons and Free Preses within the City and Burgh of Glasgow."

These articles provided that membership was confined to "any person who has been a Deacon of one of the Incorporations of this City or a Preses of some charitable society and is a Burgess and Guild Brother of the City of Glasgow of a good moral character", and included among the members of the Society were Lord Provosts, Magistrates, Deans of Guild, Deacon Conveners, many Deacons of Incorporations, Presidents of such societies as The Grand Antiquity Society and The Anderston Weavers Society; but that the terms of the original constitution were in the process of time being gradually departed from is seen by the frequent appearance of the names of other societies and bodies not primarily benevolent.

For same years up to 1857 many Deacons of the Incorporations of the Trades House were admitted to membership of the Society but the institution in that year of the Association of Deacons of the Fourteen

Incorporated Trades of Glasgow caused a major reduction in the number of new members joining the Society from the Incorporations. Thereafter direct contact between the Society and the Trades House and its Incorporation gradually diminished.

In 1876 the Rules of the Society were altered to provide for applicants being admitted who "were not and had not been Deacons or Preseses, but were desirous of joining the Society from motives of philanthropy" and from that date the rule has remained in this form.

Happily the rift which had developed between the Society and the Trades House was healed when, in 1989, a formal deed was entered into between the Deacon of the Society and the Deacon Convener of the Trades of Glasgow in terms of which, while acknowledging the independence and autonomy of each body, they undertook to strive for a closer association between them and to assist and co-operate with each other in achieving their charitable objectives. That closer relationship continues today.

The formation of the Master Court has varied little in the history of the Society. In the Rules two principal Office Bearers are referred to always as "Preses" and "Treasurer" but since 1876 all the records refer to them as "Deacon" and "Collector". Careful and sympathetic consideration is given to all cases of hardship that come before them and assistance has been granted by way of pensions or precepts in relief in many cases. Following a change in the Rules in 1974, limited Grants can be made to Charities and individuals not connected with the Society; many Charities have benefitted, and continue to benefit, from this provision.

The original Rules of the Society provided that there should be "a Box or Charter Chest wherein to deposit their bonds, bills and valuable papers"; the Box is still a cherished possession and there is now in it a collection of records and articles of no little historical interest which have been added to from time to time to mark the passing of the years.

The centenary of the Society in 1880 was marked by the acquisition of what was described as a "handsome medal and chain of office" for the Deacon. This silver medal was, however, passed on to the Collector in 1897 when a medal of solid gold was purchased for the Deacon and these two medals are in use today.

The bicentenary of the Society was celebrated in 1980 with a Dinner in Glasgow which was attended by a number of distinguished guests including the Lord Provost of Glasgow, the Deacon Convener of the Trades of Glasgow and the Minister of Glasgow Cathedral.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

I. The name of the Society shall be "THE SOCIETY OF DEACONS AND FREE PRESESES OF GLASGOW", and the objects of the Society are declared to be the granting of benefit from the funds of the Society to such members of the Society and their widows and families and to other persons not connected with the Society as may be in reduced circumstances or otherwise in need of financial assistance, and the making of Grants to Charities or Charitable Objects.

II. Applicants for admission to the membership of the Society, on being duly proposed and seconded at any quarterly or other meeting of the Society or of the Master Court, shall be admitted or rejected by a majority of the votes of those present at that meeting. The fee or entry money payable by applicants for admission shall be such sum as may be determined from time to time by the Master Court, and until such fee or entry money has been paid to the Treasurer the applicant's name shall not be enrolled, nor shall he be entitled to any of the privileges of Membership.

III. The qualification necessary for Membership is, that the applicant has been, or is at the date of his application, a Deacon of one of the Incorporations of the City of Glasgow, or a Preses of a Benevolent Institution or Society, and is, at the time of his application, in the enjoyment of good bodily health: Declaring, however, that it shall always be in the power of the Society or of the Master Court to admit to the Society any applicants, otherwise eligible, who are not, and may not have been, Deacons or Preseses as above mentioned, and who are desirous of joining the Society from motives of philanthropy.

IV. The Management of the Society shall be vested in a Preses, Treasurer, and fourteen Masters or Directors, who shall form the Master Court (five to form a quorum), and who shall be nominated and elected at the Annual General Meetings of the Society as follows, viz.:— The fourteen Masters or Directors in office for the time being shall form a list for the office of Preses for the succeeding year, and the Master or Director having a majority of votes shall be declared Preses; thereafter, one of the Members of the Master Court for the preceding year shall be elected Treasurer; and the Preses shall thereupon nominate two Members, and the Members of the Society present shall elect nine Members as Directors or Members of the Master Court, who, after the first election, shall retire by three at a time—the first three to retire being the three lowest on the list provided that Ex-Preseses after expiry of their period of service for one year as Ex-Preses and a subsequent period of service as an ordinary Director (if duly elected) shall not be eligible for re-election until they have been out of the Master Court for at least one year, providing further however that should there be in any year more than one Ex-Preses in the Directors retiring the Ex-Preses who has held office as

Preses at the most remote date shall alone be ineligible for re-election under the preceding provision, and so on in rotation from year to year. The remaining Directors shall consist of the Preses and Treasurer for the preceding year together with the Candidate standing second in votes for the office of Preses, who are hereby declared Directors *ex officio*. It shall be competent to the Society to re-elect the Preses and Treasurer, or either of them, to their respective offices. In the event of the office of Preses or Treasurer becoming vacant during the course of the year, through death, resignation, or disqualification, it shall be in the option of the Directors either to elect one of their own number to the vacant office, or to call a General Meeting of the Society to make the election—the party elected being entitled to hold office until the next Annual Meeting.

It shall be competent to elect Honorary Directors for life at the Annual Meetings of the Society; but the number of such Directors shall at no time exceed three, and the persons so elected must have previously held office as Directors.

V. The Preses shall have the custody of the box containing the Society's records and papers, and the keys of the said box shall be held by the following parties as Key or Box Masters, viz:— The centre key by the Preses, and the two outside keys by the Director second in votes for the office of Preses, and the Director elected first in order by the Society, respectively.

VI. The Master Court shall meet quarterly, upon the first Thursday of each of the months of February, May, August, and November respectively, for the purpose of conducting the Society's business. At the Quarterly Meeting in May there shall fall to be appointed a Chartered Accountant to audit the Treasurer's Accounts for the year—closing as at 30th September. At this Meeting also it shall be open to the Directors to nominate two of their number to be recommended to the Society, at the ensuing Annual General Meeting, for the offices of Preses and Treasurer respectively: Declaring that it shall always be in the power of the Preses, or of any three Directors, to cause the Clerk to call a meeting at any time whatever—forty-eight hours' notice, by circular, of all meetings of Directors being given by the Clerk.

VII. A General Meeting of the whole Members of the Society, convened by circular issued to the whole Members of the Society whose addresses appear on the Roll, shall be held annually in November on a day to be fixed by the Directors, for the purpose of electing the Preses, Treasurer, Directors, and other Office-Bearers; of considering the proceedings of the Master Court during the year, and transacting the extraordinary business of the Society. The circulars calling this meeting shall be issued four days prior to the date thereof, and shall contain a statement of the Treasurer's past year's transactions, with the report by the Auditor thereon: Declaring that the majority of votes at all meetings, whether of the Society or of the Master Court shall determine the point submitted and voted on; the Preses, and in his absence the Chairman, *pro tempore*, having a casting vote as well as a deliberative vote.

VIII. At the Annual General Meeting the Society shall elect a Clerk to keep the Minutes and Writs of the Society, who shall continue in office during the Society's pleasure, and who shall be paid for his services such a salary as may from time to time be fixed by the Society or by the Master Court. At this Meeting the Society may also, if it see fit, appoint an officer whose principal duty shall be to warn the Members and Directors to attend the meetings of the Society and Master Court, and to wait on the same; and such officer shall receive such salary and remain in office for such period as the Master Court may fix.

IX. The Accounts of the Society shall be kept by the Treasurer who shall prepare an account current of the whole cash transactions of the year, which shall be laid before the Auditor to be appointed in terms of Rule VI; and the Auditor having examined the said account and relative vouchers and verified the investments, shall report the result of his audit to the Directors and shall docket and subscribe the Treasurer's account in accordance with his report. The Treasurer shall also pay, at such times as the Society may fix, the sums voted to Members and others on the Roll and to charities and charitable objects, and shall uplift and receive the whole sums accruing to the Society by way of revenue, and shall lodge, in the name of the Society, in such Bank or other Depository as the Master Court may fix the surplus funds of the Society coming into his hands.

X. The Master Court shall in all cases be the sole judge of the right of parties to receive benefit from the funds of the Society, and the amount of benefit to be afforded: Declaring that in no case shall any Member of the Society or other person be entitled to demand benefit, nor shall the Society be bound to afford it, such benefit being entirely voluntary on the part of the Society, and to be given or withheld at pleasure: Provided always that when considering the granting of benefit from the funds of the Society the Master Court shall at all times allow as a first charge on such funds the financial needs of Members of the Society, their widows and families and after such charges have been met in full the Master Court shall be at liberty to disburse the balance of available funds, or so much thereof as they may consider to be prudent, to any person or persons not connected with the Society who may be in need of financial assistance and to any charitable, benevolent or philanthropic body; declaring further (1) that in no one year shall the Master Court be entitled to disburse for the foresaid purposes more than the free annual income arising from the capital stock of the society and (2) that payments to persons not connected with the Society and to charitable, benevolent or philanthropic bodies must be approved by two thirds of the members present at the meeting at which approval of such payments is sought.

XI. Members receiving benefit from the funds shall not be entitled to vote at any of the meetings of the Society; and Members who shall receive temporary relief at any time, shall not be entitled to vote at the General Meeting

next ensuing after such relief shall have been given unless the same shall have been repaid to the Society.

XII. The Directors of the Society shall have the statutory powers of investment given to a Trustee from time to time and in addition power to invest the funds of the Society in the purchase of lands, houses, feu duties, ground annuals and other heritable subjects, to retain, sell or change such investments, to borrow on the security of same and to grant all necessary deeds.

Title Deeds, Certificates of Shares, Stocks or other securities may be taken in name of the Preses, the Treasurer and the Clerk (for the time being and their successors in office) who will hold as Trustees for behoof of the Society and the whole members thereof, or they may be taken in name of a Nominee Company of a Bank approved by and subject to the instructions of the Directors. Deeds dealing with the sale or transfer of invested funds shall require the signature of said three Office-Bearers. The Master Court may at its discretion appoint a Director to sign any Deeds in place of one of those Office-Bearers.

XIII. The foregoing shall be held to be the Rules and Regulations of the Society, and no alteration whatever shall be made thereon except at the Annual General Meeting, and any proposed alteration must lie upon the table for one year before being adopted, and notice of the same must be given in the circular calling the meeting at which such proposed alteration is to be discussed, and in the event of such alteration being approved of by a majority of the Members present, the same shall be engrossed in the Minute Book of the Society, and shall be binding on all concerned.
