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Introduction

During work on recording the information held in the Archives of the Trades House a document was found which listed the legacies, gifts etc from 1605 to 1928. These records were transcribed and then the minutes of the Trades House was examined to determine the other gifts etc. which the House had received from 1928 to 1953.

It was decided not to record donors or gifts etc., after 1953 as it was felt that some donors may still be alive and this could interfere with their right to privacy.
