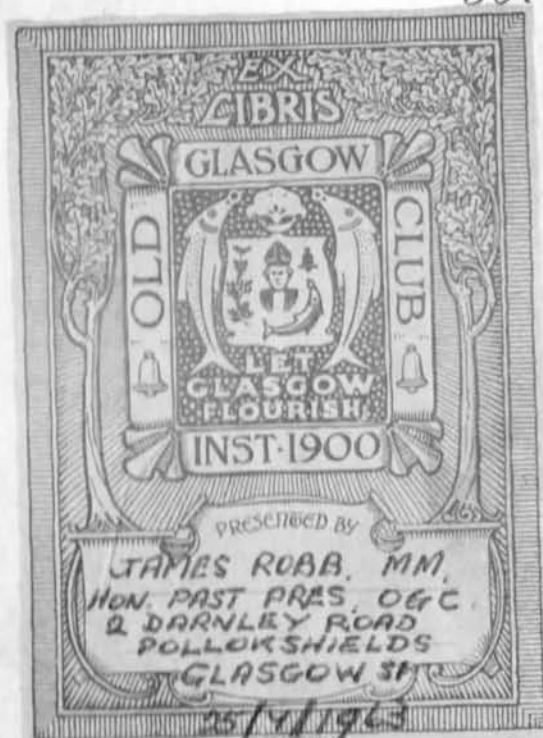

# THE WET REVIEW

THE 1881  
GATHERING

By THOMAS GIBSON, Late of 1st Berwick Volunteers

The 25th of August next marks the jubilee of an event of considerable interest, especially to old Volunteers and to that section of the community whose memories take them back 50 years. This is the jubilee of the Royal Review held in Edinburgh. It was a memorable gathering, probably the largest assemblage of troops which had ever taken place in Scotland—almost 40,000, more than Scotland was able to muster at Bannockburn. The weather conditions which prevailed were of the most memorable character. Rain, accompanied by a cold south-easterly wind, fell long before the start to the finish and earned for the gathering the appropriate and distinctive title of "The Wet Review." Owing to the soaking and exposure on that day hundreds of those who took part never recovered from the after effects, and there was a heavy death-roll.

## Royal Reviews in Scotland

There were three occasions on which the old Volunteers in Scotland passed under the review of royalty—twice before Queen Victoria—in August, 1860, and August, 1881, and once before King Edward in September, 1885 (the only review of Volunteers ever held by him). There was something distinctive about all of them. The first may be said to have celebrated the birth of the Force, the second the "coming of age," and the third its farewell, as the Volunteers as such were afterwards transformed to the Territorials. At the 1860 review the numbers present were 20,000, in 1881 37,819, and in 1885 34,560. The review of 1881, it will be seen, was the biggest assemblage of the Force, as it was certainly the most memorable. Of those who took part the majority must have passed away, but there are still several survivors, of whom the writer is one, who can vividly recall and hold as a never-forgotten memory that notable day.

It was representative of all the corps in Scotland and in addition several from the North of England, and also the London Scottish. The force formed an Army Corps of one Cavalry Brigade, and three divisions made up of Engineers, Artillery, and Rifles, the whole being under the command of Major-General Alastair Macdonald, Commanding the Forces in Scotland. In Holyrood Park, where the review was held, the hillsides overlooking the parade ground were thickly covered with spectators, estimated by some to number 400,000, who had taken up their position hours before. The outstanding feature of the crowd was the great cloud of umbrellas. Never before, it is safe to say, nor since had such a number been seen in the park.

## A Long, Weary Wait

Fifty years ago there were not the facilities, nor had those to do with these the experience which has now been obtained in transporting large masses. Consequently, there were some units from the North whose attendance at the review meant several days' travel, and all but those in or near Edinburgh had to be early astir on the morning of the eventful day. For days before there had been heavy rain and the weather outlook had been anxiously discussed. The morning of the 25th opened not too auspiciously, lowering clouds with a watery-looking sky. The rain held off more or less during the forenoon, but after midday there were intermittent showers. Those corps which came from a distance were all in positions at their special rendezvous by one o'clock, and a dreary, dismal wait began.

The march past was fixed for the late hour of four o'clock in the afternoon, and for more than an hour before the whole troops were ready. By this time rain had begun to fall in real earnest. At first it was gentle, but it gradually increased into a steady, persistent pelting pour, and before the most picturesque part of the proceedings began everyone was drenched, numbed, and weary. It was remarkable, however, that after the royal salute announcing the Queen's arrival there was a loud cheer from the rain-soaked onlookers, while the soldiers seemed to forget all their troubles and spring to new life.

## Squash—Squash—Plash—Plash

At the saluting base the Queen sat in an open carriage, sheltered only by an umbrella. She was surrounded by a distinguished company, which included three royal Dukes, two Princesses, and two generals of brilliant renown—Sir Garnet (afterwards Lord) Wolseley, and Sir Frederick (afterwards Lord) Roberts. When the march past commenced the parade ground was in parts a quagmire; in others there were large pools of water, and before the close the mud was more than ankle-deep in many places. It was a case of squash—squash—plash—plash—and added to all this the wind had increased in force and lashed the rain in the face. (The Trades House on Glasgow, 2017) Under these untoward circumstances, the majority

of the corps marched past with head erect, buoyant step, and steadily maintained their lines.

## A Major's Plight

Even by those in the ranks several incidents were observed. There are two indelibly fixed in my memory. One was the breaking-in of the crowd between the 2nd and 3rd Divisions. A portion of the spectators on the slopes at Salisbury Crags either accidentally or of purpose got going, and, gradually gaining impetus, completely swept away the oncoming companies, and it was some time before the way was clear for the troops.

Another incident had reference to the plight of a major of a county battalion. At no time was the major a great equestrian, and on the review day he got so numbed with the long wait in the rain that when his horse became restive he was unable to manage it. It took leave of the battalion despite the major, and the two ultimately parted company. In his fall the major lost his sword and belts, which were buried by the tramp of the succeeding corps, and there they lay. The horse meanwhile went careering round the park until captured, but the major never passed the saluting base.

## Great Praise to All

The march past, which was in quarter column, occupied an hour and a half. Those who took part received great praise, and the discomforts of the day, borne with such excellent discipline, counted more to the Force by the military authorities than all the 21 years of their previous service. The Field-Marshal Commanding-in-Chief, the Duke of Cambridge, expressed on behalf of the Queen, while regretting the discomforts suffered, Her Majesty's entire satisfaction with the appearance of the troops assembled.

In his final report to the War Office, Major-General Macdonald warmly praised those who took part. He said, "The discipline maintained under circumstances of grave disorder, pelting rain, and change of movement would have graced Regular and tried troops." And (an almost prophetic expression), "I submit that the Volunteer forces

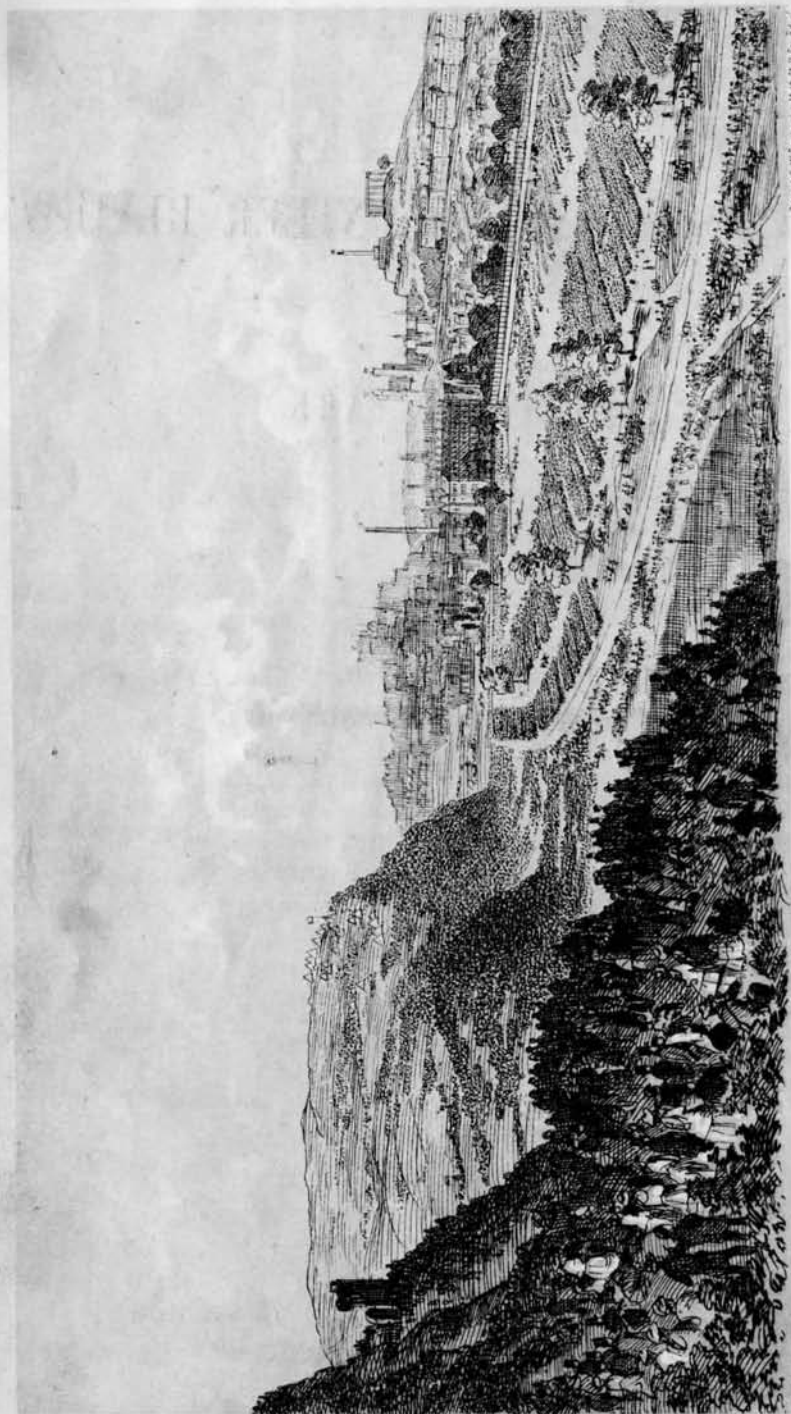
were tested to a very full extent in discipline, endurance, and morale, and that their capacity for extensive military undertakings has been demonstrated by the proceedings which culminated in this great Review." One of the almost immediate results of the review was the provision of overcoats for the Force, and from then onward the Force held a firm and established place in official circles and in the admiration of the community. Things have changed since 1881. It is safe to say that no force would now be kept so long in waiting under such conditions. A start would have been made when ready long before they did.

## Call to Glasgow and the West

At the review, corps from Lanark, Renfrew, and Dumbarton to a total of 12,626 took part. With the exception of the Queen's Edinburgh, the 1st Lanark with 1300 was the largest unit on parade, and the 1st Lanarkshire Artillery with 970 had the largest muster of all the artillery corps. It has been arranged to hold a parade of the survivors in Edinburgh on August 29, which is the nearest convenient date to the 25th. Lieutenant-General Sir Percy Radcliffe, G.O.C. Commanding-in-Chief in Scotland, who will be accompanied by the Lord Provost, will take the salute. The secretary of the jubilee parade is Mr Robert Law, 238 Leith Walk, Edinburgh.

While the promoters made their appeal to Edinburgh and district, there have been many inquiries from survivors from a distance intimating their desire to take part, and all will be welcome although the parade is not strictly a national one. But the Edinburgh parade should not preclude other local celebrations. Is the West going to do anything to mark the occasion? It would surely be fitting that a district with such Volunteer traditions should do so. Glasgow Volunteers were the first to salute royalty in Scotland with the Loch Katrine body-guard—always a proud boast of those who took part. The jubilee of the "Wet Review" is surely an occasion of note. If those who took part in it cannot say like old Kaspar, "It was a famous victory," they can truly say it was a famous occasion.

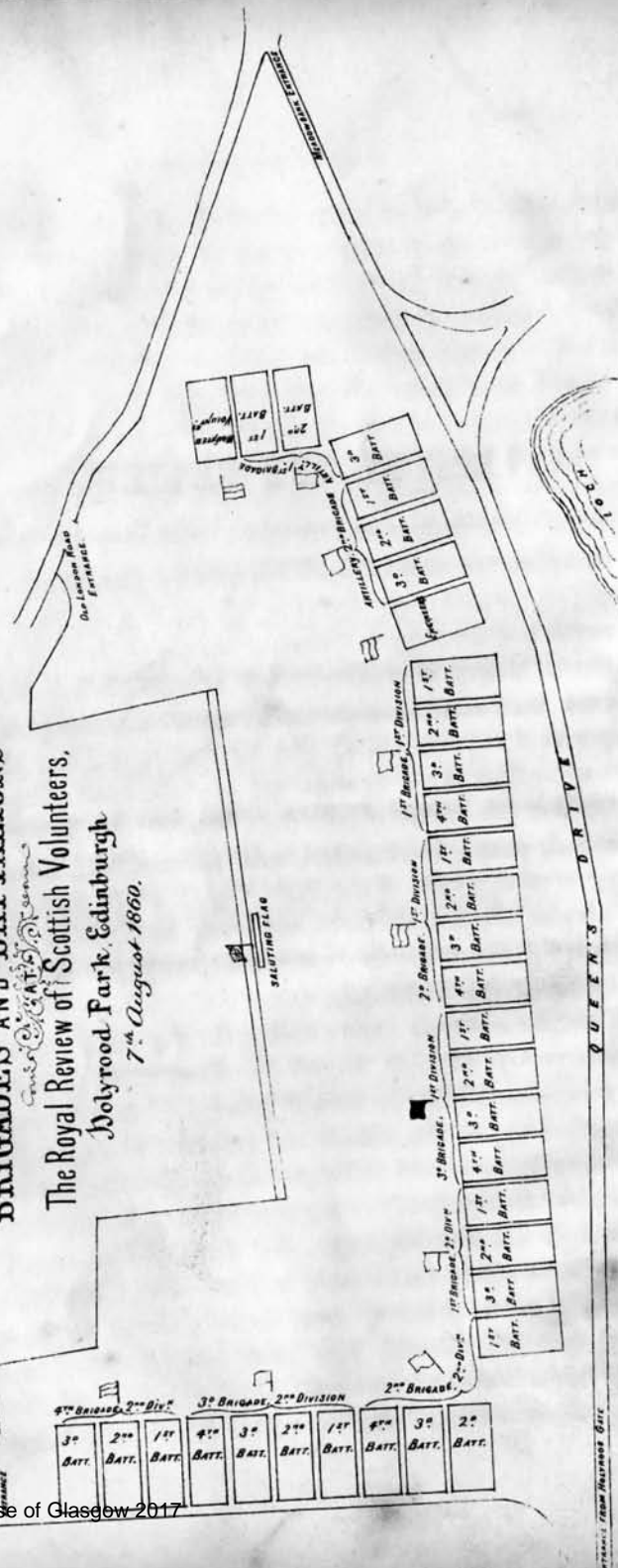

## BEFORE THE REVIEW.

No sooner had the English Volunteer Review of June 23 become a matter of history, than every Scotch Volunteer had made up his mind that there must be another. The question was never debated. Every man of us "was willin'," like Mr Barkis; and Her Majesty, who was *the* Lady in the question, took us at our word. It was not jealousy that prompted the desire for a Scottish Volunteer Review. Every Scotchman's heart glowed with pride when he read the stirring account of the Hyde Park display. But every Scotchman felt also that it must be his endeavour, as it was his duty, to shew that his native land had not fallen short in this the greatest national movement of modern times.

Edinburgh, usually so dreary during the dog-days, presented a strange scene on Monday, August 6. Everywhere preparations were going on. Here were tons of bread and hundredweights of beef on their way to the schools and granaries where the Volunteers from a distance were to be quartered. There perfect forests of evergreens and roods of bunting were being carted about for the decoration of the city buildings. Not a member of any of the Edinburgh Volunteer Corps could address himself to anything. "Wait till the Review is over," was the only answer to the most pressing calls of business. Men proverbial for steadiness and business-habits wandered recklessly about the principal streets, seeming to care for nothing, save that occasionally a wistful



eye would be cast at the indicator of an Aneroid in an optician's window. The opticians, by the bye, made up for the idleness of others by the unwearied energy with which they adjusted telescopes and polished the lenses of lorgnettes, descanting the while upon their admirable qualities as Review-glasses. Hawkers in the streets drove a thriving trade in "medallions, struck by authority, on'y a penny!" Tailors danced hornpipes of rage and despair round journeymen, who denied that "them there huntin' coats for the Fife gents" could be finished in time; while in the workshop, the Volunteer movement was spoken of in terms the reverse of flattering by blear-eyed unfortunates compelled to get up in the middle of the night to complete the frogging and braiding of Ensign Sopht's new coatee and inexpressibles.

During the whole day, corps from different parts of the country were arriving at the various railway stations, and marched to their quarters, accompanied by crowds of little boys of that shrewd and intelligent street class, whose opinions on the efficiency of a corps are rapidly formed, generally well-judged, and always emphatically expressed. The Breadalbane men attracted a great deal of notice. A fine, active, and well-built body of men, they will form, without question, one of the most efficient of our Scottish Volunteer Corps, and considering the disadvantages they labour under, many of them having to walk six or seven miles to drill, the progress they have already made is most praiseworthy. On the whole, the populace seem more in favour of the kilt than any other dress, the corps so clothed being always received with marks of special approbation.

It is impossible to speak too highly of the exertions made by the civic authorities of Edinburgh to provide accommodation for the Volunteers, and which were only equalled by the kind alacrity with which public bodies and private individuals placed all the conveniences in their power at the disposal of the Magistrates. Schools, halls, hospitals, granaries, distilleries, and every description of building, were turned into temporary barracks, where everything that could be done was done to insure the comfort of the

men. All throughout, the greatest liberality was displayed, and no pains were spared to make all the strangers feel at home.

During the whole of Monday, the weather, which is usually only permitted as an introduction to conversation, formed the most engrossing topic. Many sighed, for barometers, on being tapped, gave indications decidedly of a dropsical tendency, the hand pointing steadily to the wrong side of "change." Children, with the same fictitious pleasure which results from stopping the clock on a holiday, forced the lady to stay out, and the gentleman to retire into the house-barometer. But all in vain; the only solace that could be got was in the wilfully false statement always made in like circumstances, viz., that the weather is always the exact reverse of what is indicated by the barometer; and so the fate of the morrow, the "quid sit futurum cras," was left to the morrow to shew.

Towards evening the bustle in the town increased. People crowded to the spots where companies of the city corps were getting their last finishing touch of drill for the morrow. In some of the city squares might be seen companies of the Artisans, in their working clothes, practising the advance in line and royal salute. "Present Arms—one—two—three; count the motions inwardly, and stand perfectly steady," says the captain, who knows his men are being watched by critics numberless from provincial corps, who are looking on in the crowd. Before dismissing, the men get an admonition about dressing, and touching to the pivot, and the other "incomprehensible nonsenses" of "How not to do it," and are further directed to bring with them to the Review what in battalion orders is facetiously termed "some light refreshment," but which their captain tells them had better be substantial, as they will be under arms for about nine or ten hours.

During the whole of Monday, as well as on the day previous, the Queen's Park and Arthur Seat were visited by thousands anxious to anticipate by imagination the spectacle they were to see there on the day of the Review. The Grand Stand, about which so much correspondence took place, and so many telegrams



were sent, was a very handsome erection, tastefully decorated with evergreens and banners, and capable of containing about three thousand persons. A splendid banner, twenty-five yards square, having the Scottish lion on a yellow ground, was placed on the summit of Arthur Seat, while other flags and a large number of bell-tents decorated the inner slopes of Salisbury Crags. In town all the principal public buildings and monuments shewed flag-staffs, promising a flaming display, while the hotels, the large warehouses, and all the places of public amusement, were wreathed with evergreens and decorated with banners. In one or two streets halyards were stretched from one side to the other, from which floated the national standard of almost every kingdom of the civilised globe. In several places gas devices were erected, consisting for the most part of the loyal "V. A.," which some of the would-be witty insisted on reading "Volunteer Artillery." The labour of preparation was carried on far into the night; but at length all was ready, and all were resting to prepare themselves for the greatest day that Scotland has seen during the present generation.

Early on Tuesday the whole city was astir. Thousands, in holiday trim, were in the Park by eight o'clock to see Her Majesty drive from the railway station to the Palace, and these returning to town swelled the throng which already had begun to move with restless activity through the streets. The sky was rather leaden, so all that could be done was to console one's self with the old proverb about "morning gray," wilfully overlooking the fact that the evening previous had been anything but an "evening red." Even as it was, every one seemed determined to carry out Mark Tapley's maxim, and to be "jolly," despite all inconveniences. Irascible old gentlemen, who, on any other occasion, would have broken their umbrellas over the offenders' heads, submitted to be jostled and pushed about with bland good humour. Sundry excited individuals, who had got blue or West-end tickets for the Grand Stand, but who had certain reasons for wishing to be of Mrs This or That's party, who had white

tickets, eagerly sought an exchange; while it is hinted, though we don't believe it, that certain parties turned an honest penny by subscribing for tickets, and retailing them, at a Jew's profit, to disappointed applicants.

At last the living stream began to flow deep and strong. From an early hour, train after train brought its freight of Volunteers and visitors from every quarter. Here and there might be seen a handsome fellow, with sergeant's stripes on his sleeve, and his young wife on his arm. How proud she was of him, and how her little foot beat time to his steady, soldier-like pace! She knew she had in him one who would shed his heart's blood to protect her; and what he was to her, that the Volunteers of Britain are to their native land. And should the day ever come when the Volunteers shall be called on to stand, shoulder to shoulder, in defence of their Queen and country, it will then be seen that those are not the worst soldiers for whom domestic life has its charms—

"Smooth amorists are roughest warriors."

Among the many uniforms, it would have been strange if there had been nothing to criticise; but, of course, every man was ready to defend his own against all comers. Perhaps it is hardly fair to speak of the appearance of a dismounted trooper; but it is impossible to refrain from saying, that the tight breeches and Hessians of the Fife Mounted (who look so well when in the saddle) are anything but becoming when seen on *terra firma*, and recall to the memory Chaucer's description,—

"Ful longe were his legges and ful lene,  
Ylike a staff, there was no calf ysene."

No Volunteer, however, will be persuaded that his own is not the most perfect uniform; so true it is—

"There's no deformity so vile, so base,  
That 'tis not somewhere thought a charm, a grace,"

and, therefore, we shall not attempt so hopeless, so thankless a task.

By about one o'clock, all the corps which had arrived in Edinburgh were on their way to the Park, being led by brass, flute,



bagpipe, and all kinds of music, good, bad, and indifferent, and by two o'clock most of these had taken up their positions. So admirable were the arrangements, that there was no crowding or delay at any of the four entrances of the Park, each of which had to afford passage for upwards of 5000 men within little more than an hour.

The scene which presented itself to the Volunteers as the slopes of Arthur Seat burst upon their view, made many a strong man's eye glisten. The rocks themselves, here rugged and precipitous, there clothed in rich verdure, so emblematic of the national character, are alone an interesting spectacle. But when that noble amphitheatre was crowded by the thousands, the tens, ay, the hundreds of thousands who assembled that day, it was a sight which no man in that army of Volunteers could look on unmoved. Every Volunteer saw in that crowd not a mere mass of gaping sight-seekers, but the representatives of the people of his fatherland, that people whose nationality, whose property, whose very existence, might some day depend upon the exertions of that army of which he formed a unit. And every man knew also, that in the vast multitude there were those to whom he personally was dear, whose hearts thrilled responsive to, his own; and every man felt ennobled and uplifted to a sense of the greatness and power of that unity of love, that national one-mindedness and loyalty which for centuries has formed the grand basis of Britain's glory and greatness. And what were the feelings of that living mass of spectators, as they saw thousand upon thousand of their dear ones, fathers and husbands, brothers and sons, form up in deep solid columns upon the plain below? Doubtless mingled feelings swayed them. A feeling of wonder, dashed with honest pride, that within little more than a year, so great, so disciplined an army of self-supporting soldiers could be brought into the field. A feeling of gratitude to Heaven, and gratitude to those who had devoted themselves so unselfishly to insure the safety of their country. But we are guessing: those who composed that host of spectators can alone say what they felt.

To the lover of the picturesque, nothing could be more enchanting than the aspect of Arthur Seat. On the spots more favourable for seeing the Review, nought was visible but a sea of heads. The two slopes of the Fairy's Knowe and Salisbury Crag, with their western precipices, put one in mind of

"Waves mountains high, all suddenly congeal'd;"

while far away to the east, the hill was covered on every spot not too steep for standing ground. The light and many-coloured dresses of the ladies, contrasting with white petticoats and the greensward, gave an additional liveliness to the scene, the whole forming a picture inconceivably grand, and which no artist could attempt to portray. Some of the discipline of the reviewed seemed to have communicated itself to the onlookers, for there was none of that confusion and danger usually concomitant with a large crowd—good humour seemed the panacea for all troubles. If two "roughs" got quarrelsome, the bursts of laughter which the sight of their fierce visages elicited, soon made them ashamed of themselves. Little boys detected fleehing pork-pies from hampers, were only chased by an empty soda-water bottle. Lilliputian artillery of corks kept popping unremittingly, and vendors of refreshing (?) beverages kept up a lively business; while gooseberries, held in inverted parasols, went the round of many a party seated on the grass. No doubt the light-fingered volunteer corps shewed their good drill in their usual *déagé* manner, and shared the "loot" with the honour proverbial in their ranks.

The opposite side of the parade-ground presented a somewhat different aspect. The Grand Stand, with its decorations, formed an excellent background for the saluting base, while the tall flagstaff in the centre marked the spot where the Royal carriage would take its stand. The rank, the beauty, the talent, and the genius of Scotland were there worthily represented. The brilliant and elegant costumes of the ladies, and the bright scarlet coats of the military, were well set off against the dark shading given by the civilians, who, let us hope, for their own credit, were—or then and there determined to become—honorary members of some of the



corps which passed in review before them. Ranged on either side the Royal flagstaff were the members of the ancient toxophilite body-guard, whose appearance to modern eyes led one to exclaim—

“Now, by two-headed Janus,  
Nature hath framed strange fellows in her time!”

These were under the command of a well-known anti-Volunteer Viscount, who once enunciated the proposition that no general officer would command the Volunteers. Some were inclined to think it strange that such views should be represented on such an occasion, and that a body armed with so apparently unpracticable a weapon as a bow, should be commanded by one who denounced the Volunteers, because in his opinion they were useless. We cannot help thinking, however, that his presence was intended as an *amende honorable* from an honest man, ready to admit a hasty error; and if so, “let bygones be bygones:” in name of the Volunteers of Britain we offer him the right hand of fellowship.

Between one and two o'clock the sky, which previously had somewhat brightened, suddenly lowered, and a smart but brief shower fell, and, though lasting for scarcely ten minutes, caused a magical mushroom growth of umbrellas. So short was it that it only resembled a threat on the part of the watery god, and served to indicate what he had in store for us had he been unpropitiously inclined. As it was, when Phoebus—“superis gratus et imis”—again shewed his jolly face, everything and everybody seemed rather the better for the rain than otherwise. And during the whole of the rest of the afternoon the sun poured down a flood of rich, golden light, giving to the whole scene a charm and a warmth which nothing else could supply. It is one thing to object to rain, and another thing to feel the want of water. The Volunteers, on ascending the parade-ground from the road, had to breast their way against a simoom of dust, which forced its way in at eyes, ears, nose, and mouth, with a percolating power inconceivable. The most careful toilet, and the most daintily-brushed coatee, were almost instantaneously begrimed like the working

clothes of a collier; and all the efforts to restore an appearance of tidiness, by handkerchiefs and otherwise, proved more or less abortive. Even these clouds of dust added another to the many “effects” of the scene, although, taking all their effects together, their services might well have been dispensed with. The only consolation of the dandies, as they gazed ruefully at their cuffs, was, that if they were not quite the thing, the Queen would know the reason why. Horace speaks of some who were fond of dust—“pulverem collegisse juvat;” how they would have revelled in delight had they ever come so far north as Edinburgh! There is a racy grittiness about the dust of Auld Reekie that is not to be met with elsewhere, and must be felt to be appreciated.

Each corps, on being dressed up to its position, was allowed to stand easy, when instantly there was hauled forth from cartridge-boxes, pockets, and shakos, the light refreshment spoken of above. The various good things were bartered and exchanged on all hands. The man with the hard-boiled eggs gave one for a sandwich, and another for a bread-and-cheese. The sherry man fraternised with the possessor of curaçoa, and just the least taste of the “cratur” for a finish, was in great demand. In a very few minutes all was consumed, and like giants refreshed, the Volunteers began to look about them, observing with critical eyes the appearance of other corps on their way to their places in line. “There’s Lord Elcho!” shouts Sergeant Finesight, the winner of a Whitworth at Wimbledon, as the handsome young Colonel rides past in his drab and knickerbockers. And “Who’s that?” asks Private Nameless, as a benevolent-looking old gentleman in tartan trews reins up his Highland pony to take a look at the sombre ranks of the E. R. V. Private Bytheright is positive it must be Lord Clyde, who, he knows on good authority, is to be present, and thinks Corporal Halfpence is quizzing him, when he says it is the Marquis of Breadalbane. An immense amount of chaff was carried on at the expense of the scarlet staff, who galloped about with all that apparently meaningless frenzy which is so astonishing to civilians.



The position of the troops, when formed to receive Her Majesty, was thus arranged:—

The Fife Mounted Rifles and the First Brigade of Artillery on the extreme east of the parade-ground, facing the west; the Second Brigade of Artillery, the Engineers, and four Brigades of Rifles on the south of the parade-ground, facing northwards; the remaining three Brigades on the west of the parade-ground, facing eastwards. Each Brigade consisted of four battalions, with the exception of one or two on the left, which had only three battalions. The whole force was under the command of Lieutenant-General Sir George Augustus Wetherall, K.C.B. and K.H., and was composed of two Divisions, the first consisting of the Mounted Rifles, the two Artillery Brigades, the Engineer Battalion, and the first three Brigades of Rifles, under the command of Major-General Lord Rokeby, K.C.B.; and the second consisting of the remaining four Brigades of Rifles, commanded by Major-General Cameron, C.B., Commander of the Forces in Scotland.

**FIRST DIVISION.**—The only Mounted Volunteers were the Fife-shire Company, a fine body of men, splendidly mounted.

The Artillery came next, in the following order:—

*First Brigade*—First Battalion—City of Edinburgh (1st–6th), Northumberland (1st and 2d), Haddingtonshire, Berwickshire, Durhamshire. Second Battalion—Midlothian Coast (1st–3d), Cumberland, Berwick-on-Tweed. Third Battalion—Forfarshire (6 companies), Kincardine, Caithness, 4th Aberdeen.

*Second Brigade*—First Battalion—Greenock (1st–3d), Ayrshire (1st and 2d), 3d Argyle, Wigton, Dumbarton (1st and 2d). Second Battalion—Fife (1st–9th), Inverness, 2d Stirling, Nairn. Third Battalion—Lanark (1st–11th).

Engineers—Lanark (1st and 2d), City of Edinburgh.

After the Engineers came the Rifles, in the following order:—

*First Brigade*—First and Second Battalions—City of Edinburgh. Third Battalion—Midlothian (5 companies), Roxburgh

(1st and 2d), 1st Selkirk. Fourth Battalion—Berwickshire (1st–5th), Haddington (1st–5th), Berwick-on-Tweed (1st and 2d).

At three o'clock, the nominal hour for the commencement of the Review, there were still some considerable gaps in the line, and people began to be apprehensive that some accident must have happened to prevent the appearance of the corps destined to fill them up. But ever and anon, the rolling of drums and martial music announced the approach of some of the truants, who had been detained by railway delays, and who marched coolly and imperturbably across the parade-ground, as if to carry out the Irish reading of *tempus fugit*, "there's no hurry," till forced into a "double," in some cases approaching to a run, by the goading of a red-coated aide-de-camp, who galloped frantically at them the



moment their heads popped up on a level with the inspection-ground. By half-past three o'clock all had arrived, and all was ready,—the Volunteers in Review-order to salute; the Review-bands with their instruments at their lips; the spectators on the tiptoe of expectation; and away towards the Palace galloped another of the red-coats, at the most furious pace that heel and spur were capable of inducing.

## THE REVIEW.

WITH her usual punctuality, the Queen was ready before all was ready for her; so, scarcely had the "scarlet runner" disappeared behind the wall, when a distant cheering, the booming of artillery, and the straining of the necks of the fair ladies on the Grand Stand, announced that the Royal cortège was approaching. No cheering from the Volunteers however. They stand like statues carved in many-coloured stone, till the unfurling of the royal standard and the two G's of the bugle give the signal for the Royal salute, when up go 20,000 rifles and several hundred swords as by magic, and down they come with the simultaneous ring which tells so forcibly its own tale of steady and painstaking drill. And while the soul-stirring chords of our National Anthem swell upon the breeze, the whole of that mighty host stands mute and motionless, not in the cringing servility of serfdom, but upright and stately, offering the free homage of a loyal people to a beloved and cherished Sovereign.

"Mann kann in wahrer Freiheit leben,  
Und doch nicht ungebunden sein."\*

When the bands ceased playing, the whole shouldered arms, and the Royal cortège proceeded to the east end of the Park, and passed down the whole line, from right to left, in the following order:—

Her Majesty scrutinised the various corps with great attention as her carriage drove slowly past, albeit occasionally the dust was

almost blinding. The Duchess of Kent and the Princesses seemed to take great interest in the Review. Our lady readers will, perhaps, thank us for the information that Her Majesty wore a pale lilac silk dress, a green silk bonnet, with Maltese lace trimmings and green feathers, a Stuart tartan shawl, and a white parasol with white fringe. This last she changed for a dark green one, some say in compliment to the riflemen, others, with more show of reason, as a better protection against the clouds of dust which swept across the parade. The Duchess of Kent was dressed in black. The Princesses wore white straw hats, trimmed with green ribbons and white feathers, with light-coloured cloaks and dresses.

The cheers from the hill as the Royal carriage passed down the front were redoubled, and ran along the thousand-deep line of loyal hearts from right to left, like a Brobdignagian *feu-de-joie*, being caught up again by the favoured few on the Grand Stand, as the procession returned to its original position in front of the Royal standard. And now began the real business of the day. The Review bands, being those of the 13th Light Dragoons, the 78th Highlanders, the 29th Regiment, and the West York Rifle Militia, advanced from the line, and took up a position opposite to the Royal flagstaff, leaving a sufficient space for the Volunteers to pass the Royal carriage. Here also the General Commanding in Chief and his staff took their stand. On a given signal the whole army was put in motion, and the marching past commenced.

The general effect was very striking, as brigade after brigade got into motion. There was not the gorgeous blaze of scarlet and gold which gives so dazzling an effect to a review of our regular troops, but the quietness of colour generally pervading the mass had a novel and pleasing appearance, and led one irresistibly to the thought that, as the movement was so evidently not got up for show, its continued efficiency and its permanence were the more to be looked for.

"Was glänzt ist für den Augenblick geboren;  
Das Aechte bleibt der Nachwelt unverloren."\*

\* "What glitters is the creature of a day;  
The truly real doth never pass away."

To attempt anything like a description of the uniforms worn by the different corps, would be about as easy as to arrange the colours in a Berlin-wool basket after a couple of kittens had taken an afternoon's amusement out of the contents. Suffice it to say, that from the bright scarlet of the Cavalry and Engineers down to the palest of pale grays of the Dumfries Rifles, there was every shade of colour and colourlessness that can be conceived. Among the Artillery, as might be expected, blue was the favourite hue; while the Rifles, beginning with the dusky gray of the City of Edinburgh,—which, with its polished belts, gives to a column when seen from a distance, the look of a stack of the Earl of Zetland's best Jewel,—wandered through every variety of gray mixture, with here and there a patch of green, and an occasional bright facing or stripe, which last gave a pleasing floral effect to some of the columns.

To reach the spot for wheeling into the saluting base, as that line of march is called in which the saluting point is situated, each column had to pass behind a rising ground which hid it from the view of the Grand Stand and the other Volunteers; and when it emerged, it was marching at wheeling distance—that is, each company was following the other at a distance equal to its own length. Like masses of ore passed into the bowels of some vast machine, and reappearing in solid compact bars, so column after column was lost to view, to reappear in steadily-moving straight lines of companies, which marched along the saluting base with a regularity of step that, in most cases, could not be surpassed. Placed at certain points on the line of march were pioneers of the 78th Highlanders, and close to these it was the duty of each officer commanding a company to pass—a very wise substitute for the usual flags, which are so easily avoided, and are generally knocked down by the first company that reaches them, “covering” being proverbially the weak point of Volunteer officers. Not one inch, however, will Pioneer Pipeclay be induced to budge for all the Volunteer captains in Great Britain. Not even when Her Majesty's escort, in taking up its position,

makes a show of riding him over, does he move a muscle. So firm does he stand, that the rasp of the hilt of Captain Dressup's sword against his sporran is heard by the ladies in the Grand Stand, who, by the by, allege that though otherwise totally motionless, Pioneer Pipeclay, like “*pallida mors*,” kept marking time—“*equo pede*”—with his heels to the music of the Review band. These are not the first volunteers he has seen. He is one of the heroes of Lucknow. Does he give his adherence to the views of our Peels and Robertson Gladstones or not? One would like to have a *crack* (Scotticé) with him over a good foaming pot, and have his views on things in general, and the Volunteer movement in particular. Who knows?—perhaps some day the joint opinions of Pioneer Pipeclay, and Private Tomkins of the Grenadiers, who performed the same rôle in Hyde Park in June last, may be advertised to be published, in a neat volume, “suitable for a Christmas or birthday present.” Doubtless they will be well worth reading.

Her Majesty watched the various corps as they flowed by unceasingly with great apparent delight. She seemed in high spirits, and smiled and bowed to the corps as they passed with more than Royal condescension. The Prince-Consort seemed also to take a very lively interest in the scene, scrutinising the companies, and nodding his approval to the Duke of Buccleuch, with whom he conversed during the greater part of the Review. The Princesses, too, seemed to enjoy the whole scene, as did also the Duchess of Kent, who, we are sorry to say, looked far from well. What the brilliant staff of officers, many of them heroes of world-wide renown, thought of the display we cannot say, but doubtless, with the usual generosity of their cloth, their criticisms would be lenient and their words encouraging. The people in the Grand Stand could not restrain their enthusiasm. Even the near neighbourhood of Royalty failed to prevent sundry bursts of applause, as an unusually good marching company passed by. All the Highland corps were favoured with special marks of approbation, as indeed they are on every occasion.

At times Her Majesty must have found it a difficult task to preserve her gravity, as certain gallant captains, whose faces she was familiar with in a civic capacity, strode by, their faces begrimed almost to the hue of their coats, giving them a comical air of sternness, ludicrously at variance with the occasion. "Like master, like men," almost all the First Division presented a sootiness worthy of a band of coal-heavers. And on and on, for about an hour and a half, rolled that sea of living waves, to the amazement of the Volunteers themselves, who, from their position in the ranks, could form no estimate of the vast mass of which they formed a part.

Each battalion, after its rear company had marched past, closed up again to quarter-distance in double time; and here the genius of the lamp, Colonel M'Murdo, displayed his masterpiece. The Volunteers as they came out of the saluting base, were wheeled up, under his direction, into parallel masses of columns, and passed along to their original ground as soon as it was vacated by the rear of the whole body, which was still on its way to march past. In so masterly a manner was this manoeuvre conducted that the whole of the First Division was formed up on its original ground in line of contiguous columns, and ready for the advance in line and Royal salute, while company after company from the Second Division was still rising to view from behind the knoll already mentioned, and moving steadily on past the Royal standard. Meanwhile, the uninitiated in the Grand Stand were making all sorts of insane conjectures. The endless succession of companies seemed completely to bewilder them, one young lady insisting that "these were the same ones over again;" and an old gentleman in a white hat protesting that they had walked the course three times at least.

In all, 348 companies marched past Her Majesty; and, as each company consisted of sixty men—besides officers and sergeants—the grand total cannot have been anything under 22,000 men. Of these, from 1800 to 2000 were Volunteers from the North of England, thus leaving about 20,000 as the total number of Scotch

Volunteers who took part in the Review. Such a result cannot fail to be gratifying to every Scotchman, and has been cheerfully acknowledged by all the English press as most creditable to the zeal and energy of Scotland. Only one paper holds aloof, and, beyond a contemptible scrap of telegraphic news, says nothing. Is it from constitutional spleen, which will not admit that any good can come out of Scotland? If so,

"He's quite right, 'tis always the best way,  
Say nothing, when you nothing have to say."

Scotland can afford to despise such paltriness; though—

"It's hardly in a body's power,  
To keep at Times from being sour"—

for when he *does* speak, he does his stinging well, but verily his silence will never slay us. That Scotland, with so few resources, and so limited a population, should be able to bring together so powerful a body of men—surpassing considerably in numbers that brought together by the wealthier and more populous sister country—is a fact of which no Scotchman would be a man did he not feel proud. The fact is, when Scotchmen are roused into taking up a scheme, they never do it by halves, but go into it, heart and soul, with an indomitable energy which defies all obstacles, and a steady, unswerving zeal, which insures ultimate success. And, if in numbers the Scottish Review had rather the better of the London, how much more did it excel in the beauty of the spot on which it was enacted? Arthur Seat and Salisbury Crags formed an amphitheatre such as no other city in Europe can boast, where there was room for all Scotland to look on; while, instead of the dull leaden sky of June 23, the whole scene was bathed in the light of a brilliant harvest sun. Doubtless the corps who were so loud in favour of the flat plain of Stenhouse Muir, or the corn-fields of Stirling, in preference to the Queen's Park at Holyrood, were converted at the last moment as they entered the magnificent arena, in which they were to shew, not their prowess certainly, but their paces.

But "to return to our sheep:" the marching past, as a whole,

was a success, most of the companies stepping with that firm, elastic tread and upright carriage, which are so strong an evidence of good training. In speaking of the good appearance made by all, it would be invidious to particularise, and therefore we shall mention no corps by name. At intervals, happily few and far between, a little wavering was observable, in some cases the result of an over-nervousness to excel; in others, caused for the most part by the guilt of some solitary individual, who either walked *pronis oculis*, (not marched, for no man can march with his eyes on the ground,) and thus ruined the dressing, or else contumaciously, in spite of the oft-repeated past admonitions of his captain, and the present anathemas, not loud but deep, of the sergeant behind him, would "just have one look at the Queen" in passing. In almost every corps there are one or more representatives of two classes—first, the enthusiastic volunteer, who is always at drill, but never learns anything, who will sit on his heel in his bed-room by the hour, and yet never hit the target; and, second, the man who is sure he can do it all without any trouble, and therefore never even takes the trouble to do well what he can do. These are the men who should be put in the front rank, if you wish to give your company a *dégagé* look. If that is not your object, get Number One to resign and become an honorary member, and make the corps too hot for Number Two.

The marching past lasted an hour and forty minutes, the rate of passing being about three to four companies per minute. And during the whole of this time Her Majesty's attention never flagged. She stood up in the carriage during the greater part of the time, only resting occasionally, and for a few minutes. From a quick-eared lady in the Grand Stand we learn that knickerbockers were not highly favoured among the Royal party, although we do not vouch for the accuracy of the fair reporter's notes. Occasionally, as a familiar face presented itself among the mounted officers, a more than formal bow was the answer to the salute. Indeed, throughout the whole Review Her Majesty seemed overflowing

with kindly feeling to the whole of the Volunteers, and to be deeply affected with the majestic nature of the whole scene.

The bands whose duty it was to play while the Volunteers were marching past, did their work admirably. Ever and anon, as a glimpse of tartan was seen in the distance, they gave way to the pibrochs of the 78th Highlanders, which in the case of the Breadalbane men was unnecessary, as they strode by with five sturdy chieftains at their head, who blew with might and main, making some of the staff dance a hornpipe obligato the reverse of dignified, their steeds being generally perfect models of military decorum.

On entering and passing out of the saluting base, each column had to wheel to the left in double time; and this most difficult movement was in most cases performed with a steadiness and ease at which many of the military men on the ground expressed their admiration. The movement is one which requires intelligence, and it is in this that the Volunteer rises superior to the common soldier. In everything else which is the effect of mere drudgery and training, the soldier of the line will always be *facile princeps*; but in those specialties of drill which demand a more than ordinary exercise of intelligence, the Volunteer may yet excel. Some of the battalions which were made up of companies from different quarters, and which had never met before, were, of course, not so proficient; but we are speaking of those corps which formed complete battalions from their own ranks.

So admirable was the arrangement above alluded to, by which the respective corps were brought back to their original ground, that not ten minutes had elapsed after the marching past of the last company, before all was ready for the advance in line, the officers having taken post in Review order, and the men standing with shouldered arms. On the signal being given, the whole line advanced, the Review bands playing. The effect of this was, in one word, indescribable, and when the whole was simultaneously halted, and the Royal salute given, the silent grandeur of the scene, broken



only by the chords of the National Anthem, sent a thrill of heart-stirring awe through the assembled multitude. But on a sudden the deathlike silence is broken, and the pent-up enthusiasm of the Volunteers breaks forth like the bursting of some vast reservoir. A cheer, such as only Britons have in them to give, goes forth with the full power of 22,000 loyal throats,—a cheer such as old Holyrood never heard before, and probably has heard for the last time, caught up by the crowds on the hill and rolled back to the plain, again and again to burst forth with redoubled energy, until it merges into one prolonged, heart-stirring, joyous roar, shakos and caps and busbies being held on high on swords and rifles and carbines, till the whole mass resembles a few thousand yards of dahlia-pros, with the flower-pots on the ends;—a sight and a sound probably never to be experienced again, and most surely never to be forgotten by one of the countless throng who that day poured out their ovation of love and loyalty at the feet of a beloved Sovereign.

Horses may be trained to stand almost anything, but a real British cheer is one of the few things they are never well up to, simply because cheering cannot be got up for the purposes of training. Consequently, when that deafening cheer burst forth, some performed a bear's dance on their hind-legs, one or two laid their riders on the ground and made off, or stood with that stupid bewilderment with which a horse always looks at his human burden after having shewn it the shortest road to grass. By far the greater number, however, slewed round, and, with flattened ears and bent haunches, curtsied back from the line, like a *prima donna* acknowledging the plaudits of an enthusiastic auditory, the rider looking excessively foolish the while, as a man always must do when forced backwards against his will.

At last the uproar somewhat subsided, and all watched Sir George Wetherall, to whom Her Majesty was speaking. She spoke a considerable time, and we are told expressed her very great satisfaction at the manner in which the Volunteers had acquitted

themselves, her approval being conveyed by Sir George Wetherall to the officers commanding battalions, and by them to their respective corps, along with the intimation that in due time a formal General Order would be issued from the Adjutant-General's office, which would contain an expression of Her Majesty's opinion of the Review.

It was now nearly six o'clock, and the Royal procession proceeded towards the Palace, the cheers being again renewed as Her Majesty's carriage approached the line. The enthusiasm of the men near whom she passed rose to such a pitch, that all the starch of soldierly etiquette was for the moment forgotten, and they rushed pell-mell, helter-skelter to the carriage, which they surrounded, cheering vociferously, waving their caps and shakos, and giving full vent to their feelings by the most frantic demonstrations of loyalty; and it was only after the line was passed, and the postilions had urged their horses into a trot, that the men returned to fall into their places again, hoarse and happy.

For about half an hour the crowd on the slopes had been slowly and almost imperceptibly melting off from the surface of the hill, and the thaw, as it was aptly described, reached its height as the Royal cortège left the ground, descending in a perfect avalanche into the plain, and leaving only scattered groups, who stayed behind, either to see the Volunteers quit the ground, or else to wait, like old ladies in church, till the rush was over. Still, notwithstanding the immensity of the throng, thanks to Superintendent Linton and the natural advantages of the ground, there was none of that dangerous rushing and squeezing so common and often so fatal on similar occasions. Women with children in their arms were scarcely even put to discomfort, and the only annoyance was, that if by any accident companions got separated, their chance of being reunited was somewhat shady. Mr Waxy found, to his horror, that his pretty wife had disappeared with that handsome cousin of hers, the young Inner Temple man; and while he knew himself a fool for indulging in so ruinous a luxury, his jealousy

drove him nearly frantic. Meanwhile Mrs Waxy, whom her brute of a husband was maligning in thought, was imploring the cousin not to mind her, and to go in search of poor Waxy, who will be dying of fright about her, and this, said coz, acting like a sensible man, flatly refuses to do, insists on seeing Mrs W. safe out of the crowd, and is thanked in the evening by Waxy himself, who has got over his little touch of *delirium uxorium*. Mr Trimble, after holding his son's arm during the whole Review for fear of losing him, relaxes his grasp for a single minute to have a peer at the Queen as she passes on her way back to the Palace, and is rewarded for his loyalty by finding that Master Trimble has broken from his moorings, run foul of a half-tipsy cad, and is getting tolerably well pummelled in consequence; and on Mr Trimble's interfering, and endeavouring to prevent further breach of the peace, he is saluted on the calf by the cad's bull-terrier, which, up to this moment, has been acting bottle-holder to his master, and seeing fair-play between the combatants. Mr Moneyless, whose son has disappeared along with his *sac de voyage* and all his cash, goes to the Police-office to see what they can do to recover his poor boy, and finds to his astonishment that the young hopeful has been there before him, leaving a message for the "Governor," to say that he had gone to the Theatre, where he might follow him if he chose.

Ladies also, who had been disappointed of seats on the Grand Stand, and had been compelled to brave the crowd on the hill, though in no danger, suffered some little inconvenience. Circles of steel were doubled up, bent, broken, and twisted into all sorts of shapes, while not a few cane hoops for kites were obtained by thievish urchins who prowled about for prey. In fact, to use a slang phrase, there was a good deal of stealing of hoops and bone-ing of steels, which, as it could not be helped, was philosophically submitted to. In the Grand Stand even, allowance had not been made for the fair sex in proportion to their proportions; and the manner in which twenty-four inches by twenty-two was made to

contain belles to whom the one in York Minster is a trifle, was in itself a practical lecture on the compressibility of matter.

While many little incidents like the above were occurring in the crowd, and the ladies on the Grand Stand were spreading their ample skirts like birds stretching their wings for flight, the to us most wonderful part of the day's proceedings was being performed by the Volunteers—viz., 22,000 men passing out of the Queen's Park, by four exits, in very little more than half an hour. Colonel M'Murdo had issued to each corps its directions, and these were implicitly obeyed,—the Volunteers uncoiling from their columns like vast many-coloured snakes, and winding their way out at the various exits without hurry, yet still with wonderful speed; so that, ere one could appreciate the fact that the Review was over, the whole plain was bared as if by magic, and nothing left to tell of the gorgeous pageant just concluded but the *débris* of papers, and corks, and bottles, which, having served their purpose, and being of no further use, even to the owners, were abandoned.

While the City of Edinburgh Rifles were "standing easy," waiting their turn to pass off the ground, Lord Elcho, who in his uniform as Lieutenant-Colonel of the London Scottish Rifle Corps, had taken an active part in the day's proceedings, rode up to the column to converse with Lieutenant-Colonel Davidson,—the commanding officer, the Lord Advocate, the senior Lieutenant-Colonel of the corps, being absent on duty in Parliament. He was received with some desultory cheering from those who happened to observe him, when a stentorian voice—by some erroneously attributed to the Captain of the 1st Highlanders, who, however, cheered as lustily as any one—shouted, "Three cheers for Lord Elcho!" Instantly three cheers rent the air, such cheers as a man cannot receive more than once in a lifetime, while the dark mass closed around him, to the great astonishment of his steed, and probably of himself, leaving him no escape from that "painful pleasure," or rather pleasurable pain, to truly noble minds, of



making a speech in reply to an ovation, which so often turns the best orator into a blushing blunderer. When silence had been restored,—a matter of considerable difficulty from the unruly enthusiasm of the men,—his Lordship spoke in a quiet tone of voice, but with that clearness of intonation which is so much more easily heard than loud speaking, and which always insures attention. Holding his cap in one hand, while the other played with the mane of his horse, on which his eyes were fixed,—he apparently not being able to look his brother-volunteers in the face without betraying his emotion,—he spoke words “*digna sacro silentio*.” He said he had come down to be with his East Lothian friends and constituents at the Review, and had not expected such a reception as this from the Edinburgh men. He could not attempt to thank them for so kind, so cordial, a reception in any other way than by going on as he had begun, until the 130,000 British Volunteers already enrolled were doubled or trebled, numbers being the thing to look to in the Volunteer movement. The recent Review in Hyde Park had had a most wonderful effect in bringing forward recruits, and such might and would be also the result of the present most successful Review. He would urge on all the importance of getting their friends to join the movement, and that they should stick to their self-imposed work like men. On this the cheering was renewed, and the young lieutenant-colonel rode away visibly affected.

This little *impromptu* demonstration not only served to wile away the time, during which the E. R. V. were kept waiting their turn to leave the field, but also afforded an admirable instance of the good effects of drill and discipline in giving men the power of rallying quickly, after being thrown into confusion. As above mentioned, when Lord Elcho came near the corps, the men quitted their ranks and crowded round him to give vent to their enthusiasm, and when he left them they were in about as pretty a jumble as a mass of unsorted types, what printers very aptly denominate “*pie*.” As his lordship rode off, the word “*Fall in*” was given, and repeated by all the officers, and before you could have got

through the Greek Alphabet, every man was in his place and ready. We are often told that the Volunteer movement encourages a loose style of drill, and that consequently there is a want of discipline, for which no amount of zeal or good shooting can compensate. We doubt much the accuracy of the assertion, and we appeal to any one who has taken the trouble to watch the Volunteers on their parades to say whether it be not the fact, that the Volunteers, from the time they fall in till they are dismissed, have always been drilled with the same rigid discipline which obtains in the regular army.\* Indeed, where they are drilled in public, the strictness observed is generally even greater. A discriminating (?) public, with its own usual narrow-mindedness, laughs at the slightest mistake when made by Volunteers, even though it be an error such as any troops might fall into, and which would raise no laugh if committed by regulars. The Volunteers are thus more put upon their mettle, and their drill-instructors are obliged to attend very carefully to minute points of discipline which might otherwise be disregarded. There is, therefore, little fear of the Volunteers becoming the disorganised armed rabble which some of our military martinets seem to dread. The Duke of Cambridge, at the dinner in St James's Hall, after the Volunteer levee, gave it as his advice to Volunteers, to become well-drilled soldiers before they tried to assume the *dégagé* rifle-man; and if the Volunteers themselves do not adopt this advice from choice, they must either be forced to it by circumstances such as we have mentioned, or else the sooner they are disbanded the better. Our own view is, that the Volunteers as a body prefer being well (which means strictly) drilled, and that the isolated individuals who become Volunteers in order to gratify a personal vanity or a love of finery, will either be obliged to acquire their duties from a fear of ridicule, or else will soon be brought to desert a movement with which they have nothing in common. That in reality the Volunteers, as far as they have yet gone, have not been loosely drilled, is proved by the reports of Her Majesty's

Inspectors on the corps they have visited, and by such occurrences as we have above detailed. But this is a digression, for which we must ask pardon.

The City of Edinburgh Rifles, who had been almost more exposed to the dust than any other corps on the ground, and whose dusky uniform makes a black face look excessively absurd, from the very want of a contrast, had, on leaving the ground, to pass close by several other corps who were still waiting for their turn to leave the field. Among these were some of the corps from the North of England, who had acquitted themselves in such a manner as to uphold the honour of their country. They had had the good fortune to be placed on the western grassy part of the Park, where there was little or no dust, and consequently, in comparison with some of their less fortunate brothers in arms, their appearance was perfectly angelic. As the Edinburgh men came up to them, they were greeted with a hearty cheer, but which irresistibly slid into an equally hearty guffaw of laughter, as their nearer approach brought their coal-whipper visages to view. The sooty ones grinned in reply, but it was indeed "horribly a ghastly smile," and the shouts of laughter were redoubled, while facetious hints were thrown out about a probable rise in the price of soap, and much similar badinage was good-humouredly fired off. On their reaching town the fun got cruel. Confidential hints were thrown out by the *cœtus vulgares* that there was a "lum a-low" (Anglicé—chimney on fire) somewhere, so that they had better make haste. It really was rather trying. In whatever way they treated their tormentors, 'twas all the same. If they tried to laugh back, the effect was so horrible that the crowd howled again. If they frowned and tried to look angry, the effect was so irresistibly comical that they themselves had to join the coalition, and laugh at one another. And on they trudged, elated and tired, proud and dirty. May they never be stained by a bloodier dust!

Long after the Volunteers had left the ground, groups of people still hung about the slopes of the hill, or wandered over the now

desolate-looking Review ground, we suppose going over again in imagination the spectacle they had witnessed; and it was not until evening had closed in and given place to night that the last lingerers reluctantly acknowledged to themselves that

## AFTER THE REVIEW.

A DAY of excitement is seldom followed by a quiet evening. Accordingly, every one sallied forth, with his pass-key in his pocket, to see whatever could be seen. Edinburgh, from its wide streets and broad pavements, is not the unpleasant place most towns are when crowded, and an evening stroll, when anything unusual is going on, is extremely agreeable. We do not believe the Modern Athens has been so full as it was on the evening after the Review, since the occasion of Her Majesty's first visit to Scotland on her accession to the throne. We doubt if even then the throng was so great, although the attractions of a general illumination were added to the rest. The day of the Review was more or less a holiday throughout the whole of Scotland, and, consequently, the number of strangers was greater proportionately than it would have been on the occasion of any ordinary festivity. During the whole afternoon, the city had been silent almost as the grave. As far as the eye of the solitary policeman on his beat could reach, not a living creature was to be seen. Even Princes Street, which the most pelting thunder-shower can never empty, was silent and deserted, except that occasionally a cab, containing a country visitor who had missed the early train, dashed madly past on its way to the Park. London on a Derby-day is by some supposed to be synonymous with emptiness itself. In comparison with Edinburgh on the afternoon of 7th August, it sinks into

positive insignificance. Not only was there no creature to be seen, but there was no sound even to break the appalling stillness. For once the whole public were agreed, and had gone *en masse* towards one goal.

About half-past five o'clock, the living tide had begun to flow again, those who had fled the general rush coming into town in twos and threes, like the advanced skirmishers of an army. On it came, with a distant hoarse hum, rushing into the town by all the avenues, till the whole area was filled by a moving mass, through which the Volunteers steadily wound their serpentine path. Even now, when the Review was over, they still seemed to be upon their mettle, marching upright and firm, not stiff and starched like stage soldiers, but with an erectness of carriage free from effort, and an ease of motion free from looseness—a combination truly rare, but which, in our opinion, forms the true essence of a soldierly bearing.

Many of the provincial corps marched direct to the trains which were to convey them home again, but by far the greater number, having got rid of their Enfields, sallied out to swell the throng in the streets. During the day, the eye could only take in the general effects of the different uniforms, but now was the time for the critic to take his survey. By seating himself in the bow-window of a hotel in Princes Street, he could see passing before him the uniforms of almost every corps in Scotland, and it would be hard if he could not construct one to his taste, by taking piecemeal from all those parts which he approved. The objection which occurred most forcibly to any one who had an eye to the practical was that in most cases the cartridge-boxes were useless, from their diminutive size, and still more so from the manner in which they were hung. Made for the most part on the pattern of cavalry pouches, they will hardly contain more than twenty rounds, while, from their being hung aslant on the centre of the back, their contents cannot be got at conveniently, and the first severe shower would damp the ammunition and render it useless. This is an evil which must be rectified sooner or later, and therefore we

take the liberty of pointing it out for the benefit of any future corps which may be formed, as we have no doubt the stimulus given to the movement by the recent Reviews will have the effect of adding a great many new companies to the presently-existing force.

Of course, the whole conversation turned on the one topic. Talk as one might about it, it was impossible to talk it threadbare. Those who had been in the Grand Stand were besieged with questions as to "how the A.B.R.V.'s, or the X.Y.L.'s looked, as they marched past,—Did the Prince Consort really say anything about them to the Duke of Buccleuch?—Was the Queen standing up, when they passed?" &c. Of course, a considerable amount of good-humoured cruelty was practised. The captain of the Ardnaduig Rangers was told by his wife that his marching was disgraceful, and that as he passed, she heard Col. M'Murdo mutter, "Confound that fellow, he will spoil the whole thing!" A sergeant of the 15th Wogsalg was informed by a young lady, to whom he is attached, that there were gaps in his company through which she could have walked; to which the sergeant replies, that they must have been gaps indeed through which she could pass. Lieutenant Mactavish, who is about 5 feet 2½ inches in his boots, and who happened to have the command of his company, was feelingly told, that as he marched up, one of the princesses called him a funny little man, and pointed out to the other that the point of his sword was about six inches above the top of his head. The Volunteers took these and similar slaps with perfect good humour; the grand consolatory idea, by which all private troubles were got over, being the universal opinion that the whole affair, taken together, had turned out such a triumphant success.

The civilian visitors to the Modern Athens were different from the ordinary run of strangers visiting town. There was every grade, from the Highland laird, with his kilt and splendidly jewelled dirk, down to the village ploughboy, who gaped open-mouthed at the V.A.'s and gas crowns with which some of the

buildings were ornamented. The news-vendors selling second editions containing accounts of the Review did good trading among the country visitors on their way to the trains, who wished to carry with them a record of the great event; while others, selling a badly-printed sheet with a wretched woodcut of a Volunteer, in a very short kilt, at the top, got their stock off their hands by the unblushing effrontery with which they assured their hearers, that it was the only programme of the Review sanctioned by the Commander-in-Chief.

The railway stations during the whole evening were literally besieged by Volunteers and visitors, who, being totally unable to get accommodation in town, were anxious to get home as fast as possible. As fast as possible, turned out to be very slow indeed. Numbers came rushing about eight o'clock to get into the eight o'clock train, and found, after they had taken their seats and thanked their stars that they had got them, that they were not in the eight o'clock train at all, but were in a half-past seven train for another line, which had not been able to start yet. The scene on the platform resembled Bedlam let loose. At one end was the band of some provincial corps, rather fancifully dressed in brown Hussar jackets, trimmed with lilac, and white trousers, blowing away with might and main a parting and somewhat tuneless tune, the drummer apparently trying which end of his drum would go first, the cymbals clashing madly all the time, in defiance of the "pianos" of the music-sheet; and amidst this awful din there were Volunteers shouting into the ears of porters to know what had become of their rifles, which had been left in the baggage-room, and been handed out to some other corps, and the porters protesting ignorance in reply; women screaming for their children, who had wandered after some more than usually enticing uniform; constables shouting out the positions of the different trains; mouth and steam whistles blowing,—in short, a general maddening noise and confusion, which made many an intending traveller regret the money he had spent on his ticket, and resolve to put up for the night with any sort of shake-down he could get, rather than again



attempt to get into a train at such imminent risk to his shins, his ears, and his temper. As to the matter of temper, it was amazing how good-humoured every one was in spite of every difficulty. Some of them certainly were "jolly" under very creditable circumstances indeed, seeing that, after waiting a couple of hours for a train, they had to start on a journey of fifty or sixty miles, with their knees and chins meeting as they sat in the bottom of a cattle-truck, while others, even less fortunate, were cooped up sixteen in a compartment, with half-a-dozen squalling children, a drum, a saxhorn, and a pair of bagpipes. In spite, however, of these and similar inconveniences, no one allowed himself to get depressed. Every one had too much that was pleasant and agreeable to think of, to brood over or even to bestow a thought upon the ordinary or extraordinary discomforts of excursion travelling.

We ought, in justice to the Railway Companies, to say that they are in no way to blame for any discomfort to which their customers were put. It was impossible for them to do more than they did to forward their passengers. The traffic was such as no foresight or resources could provide for; and in considering what is due to the Railway Companies for their exertions in relation to the Review, we would be acting unfairly did we not chronicle a fact which above all others redounds to their credit, viz., that notwithstanding the enormous traffic which inundated all the lines leading to Edinburgh on the 6th, 7th, and 8th of August, not one single railway accident took place in connexion with any of the trains run for the occasion. It is true, we should be thankful to a still higher Power for such merciful preservation from disaster, but this is not inconsistent with a due award of praise to those who performed so well the duties intrusted to them. When we reflect how quickly the happiness of every one on that joyous occasion might have been turned into gloom by any fatal occurrence, such as has of late been so frequent, we cannot be too thankful to those who had duties to perform attended with so great risk, and who acquitted themselves so well.

After all the cheering of the afternoon, one would have supposed the whole stock of "hurrahs" was expended; but this was far from being the case. In the fulness of their hearts, the Volunteers were ready to cheer at anything or nothing. The corps, on their march to the railway stations, were cheered by the crowd, and cheered back in reply. If they met any of the other corps with whom they had been brigaded, they redoubled their shouts. In the cafés and eating-houses, men who had never seen one another before were eating and drinking together, proposing toasts, singing, cheering, and enjoying themselves, as if they were old acquaintances. The Volunteer movement in this would seem to have originated a Freemasonry of its own. Every Volunteer claims a right to fraternise with his brother Volunteers, and this feeling is always reciprocated in such a manner as cannot fail to convince that the movement, in its essence, is a movement of the heart.

"Denn es muss von Herzen gehen  
Was auf Herzen wirken soll." \*

Besides the impromptu entertainments just mentioned, there were others going on. The Bankers' Corps from Glasgow were being entertained by their Edinburgh brethren in the Floral Hall of the Experimental Gardens; while the Glasgow University Corps, after having refreshed themselves in their quarters at the High School, had the pleasure of being escorted to the train which was to convey them home, by the Edinburgh University Company, who, notwithstanding the fatigues of the day, turned out to a man, fully armed and accoutred to do them honour. All who, by previous arrangement, had provided accommodation and rations for themselves, were well off; but how those fared who had not done so, depended entirely on their good or bad luck. That accommodation, such as it was, could be procured for all, is not so surprising. We ourselves saw a party of three quietly enjoying their tumbler on the floor of the passage of a hotel; but how all

got food is still a mystery. In fact, we are inclined to think that the solution lies in the fact that many were not fed, and went home fasting. If so, the Review will have served the useful end of giving to a part at least of the Volunteers some notion of the hardships of a campaign. One thing we were delighted to observe—there was none of that drunkenness for which Scotland is so unhappily notorious. Never within the memory of man has any great public demonstration taken place in the Northern Metropolis which has been distinguished by so great a freedom from intemperance,—that general bane of all holidays and excursions. The Volunteer movement has, throughout the country, done much to wean the national mind from ignoble pleasures, and to give a higher moral tone to the people, and this was strongly exemplified in the sobriety which characterised the late Great National Demonstration. That such will continue to be its result, and in still greater measure, we firmly believe.

St Swithin, who had let the 7th off so easily, was determined to shew what he could have done, had he not chosen to patronise the Review, and give us "Queen Victoria weather." Accordingly, on the 8th, from early morning till night closed in, it rained in one perpendicular, penetrating, percolating pour, which no Macintosh or Nicoll could protest against. Those Volunteers who had remained in town were a caution to behold, with their plumes pasted on to one side of their shakos, and their tunics steaming. The banners, which on the previous day had made the whole town look so lively and gay, were flattened down on their poles, to which they clung with weed-like tenacity, indicating that just in proportion as they had given enlivenment to the scene as it actually happened, so they would have added another item to its gloominess had it been otherwise; for if anything could increase the miseries of a wet gala-day, it is the feelings induced by the wretched appearance of soaked decorations and drenched

banners. Every one seemed thoroughly to appreciate their escape. The first thing said by all, as they looked out in the morning and saw the black sky and pelting rain, was, "Suppose the Review had been to-day!" or, "What if yesterday had been like to-day!" If the Review-day had been a wet one,—if, instead of the bright summer sun, which made the scene so gorgeous, there had been nothing but dark clouds and rain, and, in consequence, many of the corps had not arrived, those who did marching past a closed carriage and a drenched staff, with draggled plumes and miserable faces, it would have been a blow that Scotland's enemies would have rejoiced at. Perhaps, then, the Review, with the aspect of a failure, might have been thought deserving of more notice by a certain leading newspaper which, as it has been a success, declines to patronise it. At all events, it is only another proof how much depends upon the weather, and that even a national movement may have to rely for much of its vigour upon a few hours of sunshine. For, most unquestionably, had the day of the Review been a similar one to the day which followed it, the natural effect would have been to throw a damp over the whole movement, which no amount of argument could remove, or philosophy overcome. Individuals might have tried to pass it off by saying that the same might have happened at any Review, and that, therefore, it could not in fairness be said to have affected its success, and thus that no evil could accrue; but then, though every large concourse is composed of individuals, all of whom may, as individuals, be shrewd and sensible, still it is a well-known, though curious, fact that all large bodies, as such, are fickle and easily moved, readily giving themselves up to elation on the one hand and to despondency on the other. This being so, the depression which might have been the result of a wet 7th of August, a day which had been looked forward to so anxiously by all, is a subject which we would rather not contemplate. We are too glad to be able to chronicle that, in weather as in everything else, the Review was so specially favoured and so eminently successful.

As if unwilling to leave the arena in which they had won such



honours, many of the Volunteers from the provinces were to be seen still lingering in Edinburgh for days after the Review was over. Most of these, as well as thousands of the general public, visited the Queen's Park during the days immediately following the 7th August, to look at the scene in which the Review had taken place, and to compare it with its more usual and solitary aspect. When one stood on the spot where the royal carriage had taken its position, and looked out on the bare parade from which a day or two before some 22,000 men had dispersed, and were now scattered over the length and breadth of Scotland, it was impossible not to feel that every one of these men had returned to his home more loyal, more patriotic, with nobler views and nobler feelings, a better man and a better citizen, in virtue of the honour done to him by one whose reign, more than that of any former sovereign, has conduced to the improvement, advancement, and development of the national character in all its nobler aspects. And along with this came the thought that, as these men had come from far and near at the call of their Queen, for the honour of passing in review before her, with how much greater alacrity, and in how much greater numbers, would they come at the first threatening of danger to herself, or the kingdom over which she rules. Like the fiery cross of old, the call to arms would fly through the length and breadth of the land, and not only would it find all willing, but, thanks to the Volunteer movement, it would find a large army *ready* in the true sense of the word,—that is, prepared, both in drill and in skill in the use of the rifle, to stand shoulder to shoulder with the regular troops in defending their Queen and their country to the last. And what ground could have been chosen which, in its natural qualifications and its historical associations, was so suited for such a great national festival? for it is in that light we look upon the Reviews both of June 23 and August 7. A plain, looked down upon by that Palace which, from time immemorial, had been the residence of the kings of Scotland, and commanded by a natural amphitheatre, from which all Scotland could behold the spectacle of her sons devoting them-

selves anew to their Sovereign and their country. And the influence of that day, and of that scene, will continue to be felt long after the actors in it have passed away. Such demonstrations of a nation's power and a nation's loyalty are not empty pageants, like an Eglinton Tournament. They stamp upon the future an indelible impress, which the waves of time cannot efface. Things will settle down into their ordinary course. The Review will become altogether a thing of the past; it will cease to be constantly spoken about, and, perhaps, for a time it may be forgotten, but deep down in the national heart will the ramifications of its influence continue to extend, purifying, enlarging, and ennobling. Such events are not the property of the generation which is privileged to see them; they belong to all time, and to all time does their influence extend.

Few properly appreciate the zeal displayed by the Volunteers on the occasion of the Review. It sounds strange in the ears of some that credit should be given to them for coming, when it was entirely for their own gratification and advantage. But we would ask how many men were there present, who, had it been a mere matter of personal gratification, would have stayed away? Consider the loss of time, and the expense to which many were put, who, to gratify themselves, would never have left their work or opened their purse-strings, and you will then be able to form an idea of the practical self-denial which was shewn on that occasion. To all who were not of independent means, and who did not reside in the metropolis, attending the Review must have entailed, if not a loss in purse, a loss in its equivalent—time. And when there is further taken into consideration the time spent in previous drill, and special preparation for the Review, some notion may be formed of the work which the Volunteers have taken upon themselves, and which as yet they have so well and so cheerfully fulfilled. Drill is hard work at any time; but when men are tired before they go to drill, it is harder still. When men have been at work all day, some at the desk, others at sedentary occupations of one sort or other, and very many at manual labour, it requires zeal and a

self-denial which none but those who have exercised them can fully appreciate, to give up part of the evening, if it be only half-an-hour, to become a machine in the hands of an officer or drill-sergeant. At the very time, perhaps, when a man would like to be resting himself from the fatigues of the day, and enjoying the society of his family, he must, despite even the entreaties of his wife, sally out again and submit to another hour of drudgery. We are not speaking of those who drill for a few weeks, and then, when the excitement has worn off, never appear upon parade, except at the presentation of a silver bugle, or some similar show occasion. We are speaking of such men as were reviewed by the Queen, men who still stick to their work, as to a duty; who look upon it as a serious matter that the Queen should accept their services as Volunteers; who feel that by shamming volunteering, as some do, they would be acting a traitorous part to their country, and giving themselves out to be what they are not. What right has a man to call himself a Volunteer whose only claim to the name is that he once enrolled himself in the ranks of this or that corps? No man is a Volunteer who is not in real earnest in the matter, and who does not make up his mind thoroughly to learn his duty. Happily the Reviews of London and Edinburgh have shewn most clearly that the great body of Volunteers in this country are men whose object is not to wear a fancy dress and to play the soldier, but who have banded themselves together with the determination to qualify themselves to defend their native land, should their services ever be required. And again we say that the self-denial and the moral courage shewn by all who have joined the Volunteer ranks with the earnest purpose of learning their part, is not to be appreciated at a casual glance. It is indeed strange to observe how the tone of those who disapprove of the Volunteer movement has changed since its commencement. At that time their cry was that the *Volunteers* were, and always would be, useless. Meanwhile, the Volunteers, not heeding their sneers, worked steadily on during the summer of 1859, and through many a dark winter night; and this summer their zeal has been rewarded by the two national

Reviews, at which they have had an opportunity of shewing what progress they have made. The result has been beyond their most sanguine hopes. Military men have expressed themselves amazed at the proficiency attained within so short a time, and have put an end to the possibility of the assertion of the would-be-wise objectors,—that the *Volunteers* are not, and never will be, efficient or good for anything. Now they find out that it is the *movement* that is useless, as there is no one wanting to invade us. Be that as it may, it is quite plain that we cannot depend upon their second-sight to tell us we shall not be invaded, nor does it follow, supposing it admitted that no one wants to invade us, that the desire to do so cannot arise, in which case it might be too late to prepare to meet the danger. But putting all such matters out of the question, is a movement useless which tends to improve our national *physique*, to wean us from a dyspeptic or an intemperate habit of body, to keep down expense, (it is here the shoe chiefly pinches,) which tends, in short, to strengthen our bodies, to invigorate our minds, and to keep the nation in a healthy and improving condition? To this there can be but one answer.

In speaking of the outlay attending the Review, we must not overlook the noble liberality of many who, at their own expense, brought bodies of Volunteers to the Review, and entertained them while in Edinburgh. Such truly patriotic conduct is beyond all praise, and only serves to shew from another point of view the deep seat which the movement must hold in the national mind to be productive of such results. We could mention by name many instances of such generosity, some of them being truly of a princely character, but this would be invidious to those whom we omitted, who all did their utmost. Besides, it was not with the wish to have it blazoned abroad that they acted as they did. Their reward they have received already, in the gratitude, the respect, and the love of those who experienced their generosity.

There is one person to whom, above all others who were in any way connected with the Review, the thanks of the Volunteers and of the nation are due,—we mean Lieutenant-Colonel M'Murdo, the



Inspector of Volunteer Corps. No one can calculate the labour, the difficulties, the trials of his situation. Before he came down to Scotland, and while it was still uncertain where the Scottish Volunteer Review was to be held, the Queen's Park was carefully gone over by several military gentlemen, who agreed that 12,000 men were all it could possibly hold. So sure and certain was this said to be, that it was proposed to announce that no more applications for permission to attend the Review could be received beyond 12,000 men. We are further almost certain that no one supposed, till within a week of the Review taking place, that there would be more than 15,000 at the Review, and some even pooh-poohed the notion that Scotland could bring together so many as preposterous. However, application after application was sent in, and accepted, until the total amounted to 22,000 in round numbers. Here was a nice little lot to be got into a place which it was said could not, even on a pinch, contain more than 12,000 men. Talk about getting 50,000 out of Hyde Park! That was a trifle to getting 22,000 into and out of the Queen's Park at Holyrood, and manœuvring them without confusion while there. Yet this Colonel M'Murdo succeeded in doing. The 22,000 Volunteers assembled with the utmost ease and regularity, were moved about without the least approach to a "lock," and were all got out of the Park in little more than half-an-hour from the conclusion of the Review. It has often been said, with great truth, that just in proportion as a difficult feat is well performed, in the same proportion does it look easy of execution to the spectator. And certainly the uninitiated onlooker at the Review of August 7, when he saw the ease and the freedom from confusion with which the immense mass of 22,000 Volunteers was moved about in the somewhat confined and inconveniently-shaped area of the Queen's Park at Holyrood, never for one single moment conceived how extremely difficult it was to do at all what Colonel M'Murdo succeeded in effecting with such apparent ease. We are certain, however, that nothing could be more difficult than the task which Colonel M'Murdo was required to perform, and we are equally certain that

no one in the same circumstances could have acquitted himself with greater *éclat*, or more to the satisfaction of the military authorities. When we further take into consideration how short a time was allowed for the preparations for so great an event, and that, short as the time was, the preparations themselves were ten-fold more complicated and arduous than they otherwise would have been, in consequence of the enormous number of applications which were sent in for leave to attend the Review,—far exceeding the expectations of the most sanguine,—and also of the late period at which many of the applications were lodged, we cannot too greatly admire, or too heartily applaud, the energy and skill, approaching almost to genius, with which the whole of the Review arrangements were made and carried out. Not only did the arrangements include the necessity of making the very most of the limited space in which the Review was to take place, but they further comprehended the infinitely more difficult operation of distributing into battalions some 250 corps from all different parts of the country. This, like all the other arrangements, was effected in the most masterly manner, so that among all the Volunteers who were present but one sentiment has been expressed—viz., the greatest possible satisfaction with the admirable arrangements made on the occasion.

For several days after the Review, every one was on the *qui vive* for the issue of the promised General Order from the Adjutant-General's office in relation to the Review. It was the first thing that was looked for in the newspapers every morning; and the first question asked by every one was, "Is there any news of the General Order yet?" Second editions were eagerly sought for in the hope that they might contain it, or news relating to it. The telegram-board in the Philosophical Institution was daily besieged by countless subscribers, and not a few non-subscribers, anxious to devour the contents of the Order the moment it was published. Four days elapsed, and still it did not appear. People got fidgety—hoped that there was no hitch about the matter at the Circumlocution Office, and speculated wildly as to

the cause of the delay. Was it that Her Majesty would not allow the Order to go forth without its being first submitted to her for approval? At last, however, on Saturday the 11th August, the long-looked-for and almost-despaired-of Order appeared, and proved all that the most ardent and enthusiastic Volunteer could desire. As it forms one of the most important links in the history of the Review, and, in fact, of the Volunteer movement itself, we shall give it in full, calling attention to the fact that its language is not in the formal and conventional style of similar Orders, but conveys Her Majesty's satisfaction in the most condescending, and even most cordial terms; and that, though brief and business-like, it omits nothing that could in any degree assist in conveying to the Volunteers who were present at the Review Her Majesty's approval of their loyalty and proficiency:—

“HORSE GUARDS, S.W., *August 10, 1860.*

“The Adjutant-General has received the Queen's commands to convey her thanks to the several corps of Artillery and Rifle Volunteers assembled at Edinburgh on the 7th instant, and to assure them of the satisfaction and gratification with which Her Majesty beheld the magnificent spectacle there presented to her.

“Her Majesty could not see without admiration the soldier-like bearing of the different corps as they passed before her; and she finds, in the high state of efficiency to which they have attained in an incredibly short space of time, another proof that she may at all times surely rely on the loyalty and patriotism of her people for the defence, in the hour of need, of the freedom and integrity of the empire.

Along with the foregoing came the following letter to the Lords-Lieutenant of the various counties:—

“WAR OFFICE, *13th August 1860.*

“I have the pleasure of enclosing a copy of a General Order, in which the Adjutant-General has been authorised to express Her Majesty's admiration of the soldier-like bearing of the Volunteers reviewed by Her Majesty at Edinburgh on Tuesday last, and of the high state of efficiency to which they have attained in an incredibly short space of time, and in which Her Majesty finds another proof that she may at all times rely upon their patriotism and loyalty.

“In communicating this document to you, and requesting you to enclose copies of it to the commanding officers of the different corps in your county, I avail myself of the opportunity to express to you the high gratification with which Her Majesty's Government have observed the rapid success of the Volunteer movement throughout the country, the zeal and public spirit which were displayed by the corps present at the late Review, and the very efficient manner in which they went through the various movements that they were called upon to perform on that occasion.

“I have also to convey to you the thanks of the Government for the assistance which you have afforded me in the raising and organisation of this force, and for the zeal with which you have discharged the onerous duties which have devolved upon you in connexion with it.

## CONCLUDING REMARKS.

To all the Volunteers, and especially to all those who took part in the great Scottish Review, we would say,—Do not let your zeal flag now that the greatest day of the Volunteer movement may be said to be over. Let the Review not be to you a thing altogether of the past; let it be a present reality, cheering you in your future progress in the labour you have taken upon yourself. Your motto must be "Forward!" Much as you have learned, you have much yet to learn. The difficulties you have already overcome must not induce you to sit down at your ease to contemplate the ground you have already gone over. The longer you delay returning to the drudgery of your duties, the more will the desire to idle in the matter grow upon you. Take Lord Elcho's advice, and "stick to your work like men." Depend upon it, drill is never properly acquired, nor can it produce steadiness in the field, until it has become a matter of habit. Do not say that you know your drill well enough, and that it is not essential for a rifleman to be well drilled. Good drill and good discipline are twin cherries on one stalk; and no commander will choose men because they are good shots, if they have not learned discipline and drill. It is all very well for thoroughly-drilled soldiers, who can rally into a well-disciplined body in a moment, to act the *dégagé* rifleman, if need

be; but it would be mere folly for those who had no discipline to fall back upon, to hope, by irregular warfare, to defend their country against disciplined troops. Bravery is well enough; but what is nobler than bravery is the patience which will submit to toil, and toil with very little apparent advantage, and voluntarily go over and over again the same lesson and the same monotonous course of discipline. This it is, however, which forms the truly useful soldier, and for the want of this no amount of zeal will compensate. Work on steadily, then; do not look back. You have taken upon yourselves a task, and have done your duty well up to this time. Go on, do not retrograde because you find it somewhat irksome now that the first excitement has worn off. Let it become a steady habit, and it will lose all its irksomeness. As you gave yourself heart and soul to it at first, and being ledged, you cannot in honour go back—look onwards! Work with an object. You have an object: the noblest object of any man's career as a citizen,—to make himself *able* as he is *willing* to defend the country of his birth and the land of his fathers in the day of danger. In the beginning of the present century, when our land was in imminent danger, our troops being engaged in fighting the battles of their country on a foreign soil, a Royal Proclamation went forth asking for Volunteers to arm in defence of their country; and what was the result? The returns of the year 1806 shew that there were in the United Kingdom at that date a number of Volunteers considerably exceeding 300,000 men. Why should the present generation, which far exceeds the former in population, fall short in the number of men able and willing to volunteer their services for the better security of the peace and the happiness of their native land! It is true, we admit, that the enrolment of the old Volunteers took place at a more exciting and critical period than the present, the country being actually at war with that power from whom an attack was dreaded. But this reduces the question to one of mere excitement and alarm. Now, as then, the citizens of Great Britain are asked by their rulers to enrol themselves in the ranks

of the Volunteers for the purpose of supplying a recognised want in those national defences upon which we rely for protection against attack, and which ought always to be maintained in an efficient state in time of peace, in order that deficiencies may not require to be supplied when perhaps it may be too late to do so with effect: no doubt the number of Volunteers already enrolled is very considerable, amounting, as it does, to more than 130,000 men, but still this falls far short of the number which the beginning of the present century could boast. We sincerely hope and firmly believe that the real solution of the matter will be found to be in this,—that the Volunteer movement of the present day is still in its infancy, and that as it has not shot up all at once like a tree planted in a too fertile ground, but has grown gradually and steadily to its present dimensions, so it will continue steadily to progress in numbers and in efficiency. The numbers are still steadily increasing, and, as we said before, we do not doubt that the effect of the two Royal Reviews will be to bring forward a still larger number of new recruits to swell the ranks of the Volunteers. Let all, however, resolve to do everything in their power to advance and to nourish the movement. Let those who have already joined endeavour to persuade others to do so, and let those whom circumstances prevent from taking a personal part in the movement by joining the ranks, give every other support in their power to this great national undertaking. Let it be the resolve of every man whose heart is with the movement that it shall become one of the permanent institutions of the country; and let us never hear again of British gold being expended in procuring foreign mercenaries as long as there are British hearts able and ready and willing to fight without pay, in defence of their lives, their liberties, and their native land.

We sincerely hope, in conclusion, that the recent Royal Reviews will have the effect of smoothing and removing any little jealous feeling which still exists between England and Scotland. For many centuries England and Scotland were at constant feud.

Their animosity was all the more rancorous, and their hatred of each other all the more cordial, from their being compelled to live in such close proximity. Hating one another, and yet, as it were, chained together by circumstances, they for many centuries weakened each other by constant warfare and constant bloodshed. England could never be at war with any foreign power without Scotland at once becoming the most cordial ally of that power; nor could the invasion of any other country be attempted by England without danger of an attack from the North. As Macaulay somewhere says, the rancour which exists between two nations at war with each other, but locally separated, always falls far short of the rancour of two nations which, though internationally separated, are yet, from circumstances, locally intermingled. Happily, however, through the course of events, the barrier of separation which existed between the two countries has been removed; and, under the name of Great Britain, the two lands, united, have attained to a national greatness which, disjoined, they never could have reached. Still, however, the weeds of jealousy will occasionally crop up, and endeavour to choke the cordiality of feeling between the two countries. Away with such paltry influences and unworthy sentiments!

Let the Volunteer movement do its part to smooth down those little roughnesses which still exist to mar the union of the two sister countries. It is as British Volunteers, and not as English or Scottish, that the thousands of brave compatriots have enrolled themselves. Let England and Scotland go hand in hand, ready to defend the liberties, the hearths, and the homes of Britain. As we have one Queen, so we have one common cause; therefore let us with one heart and one mind join hands in our solemn vow of allegiance, and become one in deed as we are one in purpose. It is in combination and oneness of purpose that our strength must lie.

“Blunt wedges rive hard knots;” but the wedge must be solid, compact, and firm. “Union is strength;” but the union must not

be merely one of words and charters, it must be a heartfelt, a cordial, a brotherly union. Let this truth sink deep into the heart of every British Volunteer. You have one common cause and one common object of affection, have one heart.

"Be wise, be firm, be cautious,  
Yet be bold!  
Be brothers true! be one!  
Teach but what the Phrygian  
Taught of old—  
Divide, and be undone."

## No. II.

CIRCULAR from War Office to Commanding Officers.

WAR OFFICE, 2d August 1860.

SIR,—HER MAJESTY having graciously signified her intention to hold, at Edinburgh, on the 7th instant, a Review of the Volunteer Corps serving in North Britain, I am directed by Mr Secretary Herbert to inform you that permission has been given, through the Lord-Lieutenant of your County, for the Corps under your command to be present on that occasion, on the understanding that there shall be no charge upon the public caused thereby; that the arrangements for their conveyance and accommodation shall be made by the Corps; and that all orders and instructions issued on the occasion under his authority shall be strictly obeyed.

I am to request, therefore, that every exertion may be made by you to bring

the Corps under your command to a state of efficiency, and that you will point out to the members the necessity for their steady and persevering attendance at drill, in order to enable the Corps to appear with credit at the Review.

With this view the Secretary of State for War relies upon you, as Commanding Officer, not to allow any Volunteer to attend who is not fit, in point of proficiency in drill, to appear before Her Majesty.

I am to add, that the formations and movements which will take place at the Review will be few and very simple, and will not include manœuvring or firing, or marching past in slow time.

You are requested to fill in the enclosed Forms, and forward the Returns to Colonel M'Murdo, C.B., 66 North Frederick Street, Edinburgh, (No. 1 being required at once); and any subsequent alterations which may occur as to number or arrangements are to be duly notified to that Officer.—I have the honour to be, Sir, your obedient servant,

### No. III.

#### MEMORANDUM.

It is necessary that the Corps of Volunteers which attend the Review on the 7th instant should be formed into provisional Battalions, averaging ten companies of thirty files, or 600 strong.

This organisation will be effected as much as possible with reference to the localities of Corps in their respective counties; and where the aggregate strength of the Corps in any county may not be sufficient for the purpose, the Battalion will be completed from the neighbouring county.

In like manner, Brigades will be formed of Battalions,—drawn from counties bordering on the same line of communication.

In consequence of the early arrival of many of the Corps in Edinburgh, the arrangements laid down in the Notes at the foot of Return No. 2 will be modified according to instructions which will be published hereafter.

But it is to be fully understood as a principle, which must on no account be departed from, that the places of rendezvous, wherever they are, must include complete Battalions; and that no portions of any one Battalion are to be located in separate parts of the city.

The several Battalions are to be formed, told off, and marched from their respective rendezvous at the precise hours ordered. It must be borne in mind that punctuality is indispensable to all combined operations. The Volunteers will be silent and steady in the ranks, and attentive to the words of command given by their Battalion Commanders. There is to be no cheering without orders.

Bayonets are not to be fixed; the Drill for the short Rifle only is to be adhered to.

Battalions will move off with arms at the trail; and will shoulder when on the saluting base—resuming the trail when they again close to quarter distance.

No objection will be made to Haversacks being worn by such companies as require them, provided they are uniform in pattern, and worn over the left shoulder; and by all the members of the Corps.

Those Corps which have uniform greatcoats, are to carry them neatly folded according to regimental pattern.

Particular regard is to be had to uniformity in dress and appointments.

Officers commanding Corps will take care that the instructions which will be published for leaving the Park are strictly carried out; no deviation from the prescribed order of march will be permitted.

It is to be clearly understood that the proportion of Serjeants allowed by the regulations only (viz., one per twenty rank and file) will be permitted in the supernumerary ranks of companies; all other Non-Commissioned Officers being extra to the establishment and holding lance rank only, must be in the ranks.

The Bands of Volunteer Corps will not play during the Review; special arrangements will be made for the music required on the occasion.

There will be a Staff-Officer on duty at each terminus, who will communicate orders to the Commanding Officer of every corps as it arrives; the orders of the Staff-Officers are to be implicitly obeyed by Officers commanding Corps of Volunteers.

Officers commanding Corps will give to the Officers commanding their respective Battalions accurate states of their respective Corps, according to the accompanying form; these are to be given to the Majors of Brigade on the ground.

### No. IV.

HORSE GUARDS, S.W., 4th August, 1860.

HER MAJESTY having intimated that it is her pleasure to review the Rifle Corps collected in Edinburgh in the Queen's Park on the 7th August 1860, the following directions will be observed on the occasion, viz. :—

1. The Corps to be reviewed will be formed into two Divisions under the command of Major-General Lord Rokeby, K.C.B., and Major-General Cameron,



- C.B., the whole under the command of Lieutenant-General Sir George Wetherall, K.C.B.
2. They will be drawn up in the Queen's Park in a line of contiguous quarter distance columns as directed by the officers in command—facing the north—the right resting *en potence* on the saluting base, the left extending *en potence* towards Croft-an-Righ.
  3. The Royal Standard will be placed to mark the saluting point.
  4. The staff and others forming the *cortège*, as hereafter detailed, will assemble at Holyrood Palace at half-past two o'clock.
  5. Her Majesty will leave Holyrood Palace at three o'clock P.M., and enter the Park by the south-eastern corner of the garden.
  6. A Royal Salute will be fired by the battery of Royal Artillery stationed on the Queen's Drive above the lodge of the south-eastern entrance of the Park—commencing when Her Majesty leaves the Palace.
  7. On Her Majesty's arrival at the Royal Standard, the Volunteers will give a Royal Salute.
  8. Her Majesty will, after receiving the salute, drive down the line from right to left.
  9. When Her Majesty has returned to the Royal Standard, the Volunteers will march past in open columns of companies, and re-form in line of contiguous columns on the original ground.
  10. The line will, after being re-formed, advance a few paces in quick time, and salute as before.
  11. Her Majesty will leave the ground in the same order as she entered it, the Royal Artillery saluting as Her Majesty leaves the Park.
  12. During the marching past, the *cortège* in attendance upon Her Majesty will be drawn up on either side the band, and fronting the Royal Standard.
  13. The ground will be kept by the 13th Light Dragoons and 78th Highlanders off duty, and 100 men of the 22d Depot Battalion, under the command of Lieutenant-Colonel M'Intyre, C.B., 78th Highlanders.
  14. A Guard of Honour of the Royal Scottish Archers will be formed at the Royal Standard.
  15. In consequence of the limited space, no officers except those engaged at the Review will be permitted to enter the enclosure.
  16. None but the Royal carriages will be admitted within the enclosure.
  17. No equestrians except the *cortège* in attendance on Her Majesty and the mounted officers reviewed will be admitted.
  18. All spectators will be required to stand in rear of the troops marking the square, which must be kept perfectly free.
  19. Directions for details affecting the troops will be given by the officers in immediate command.
  20. The staff forming the *cortège* in attendance on Her Majesty at the Review, with the Lords Lieutenant of counties to which the corps to be reviewed belong, will attend at 2.30, and the procession will be formed as detailed below:—

1. Detachment of 13th Light Dragoons (Troop) 1.  
preceded by the Staff-Adjutant.
2. Her Majesty's Aides-de-Camp. 2.
3. Officers Acting as Deputy-Adjutant General, 3.  
and Deputy-Quartermaster-General, with  
The Queen's Equerries-in-Waiting, not otherwise employed.

4. The Adjutant-General. The Quartermaster-General, 4.
  5. THE SOVEREIGN. 5.
  6. Carriages of Her Majesty. 6.
  7. The Lords-Lieutenant of Counties to which the Volunteers belong, 7.  
Mounted and in Uniform.
  8. Assistant Adjutant-Generals. Assistant Quartermaster-Generals, 8.
  9. Detachment of Light Cavalry (Troop.) 9.

In addition to the direction by Colonel M'Murdo to the Volunteers, the following supplementary memorandum was issued:—

Officers commanding companies must be very accurate in their covering and distance in column, on the march and at the halt.

Companies of thirty files, in quarter-distance column, will be about four paces distance from the rear rank of one company to the front rank of the next.

In taking ground to a flank by fours great care must be taken to keep exact distance between each section of fours. No opening out must be allowed.

After having wheeled into the saluting point alignment, each battalion must take ground to its front sixty paces, the covering corrected, and ready to open out from the front.

As each company opens out to wheeling distance the supernumerary rank must see that the men have got the proper step.

As soon as the rear company of each battalion has passed her Majesty fifty paces, the officer commanding (who will proceed to the centre of his battalion on the reverse flank) will give the order to close to quarter distance on the leading company, so that the rear company may distinctly hear the order given.

At the conclusion of the Review the troops will leave the ground simultaneously according to the following official programme, issued by Colonel M'Murdo:—

#### MOUNTED VOLUNTEERS.

Pass out—from the Right—by the Old London Road entrance.

1st Battalion.—Pass out—from the Right—by the Old London Road entrance.

On going out of the Park the 1st Edinburgh City and 1st Berwickshire, take the left hand; the Northumberland, Haddington, and Durham Corps, turn to the right towards St Margaret's Station.

2d Battalion.—Pass out—from the Right—by the Old London Road entrance.

After quitting the Park, the 1st and 2d Midlothian follow the Edinburgh

City and Berwickshire Corps. The Cumberland and Berwick-upon-Tweed follow the Durham Corps to St Margaret's Station.

*3d Battalion.*—Follow the Midlothian Corps of the 2d Battalion.

#### 2D ARTILLERY BRIGADE.

*1st Battalion.*—Remains stationary until all the Corps upon its left are cleared from its line of march; then it moves from its left to Holyrood Gate, and is consequently the last Corps which passes out of that gate.

*2d Battalion.*—Disengages to its right front; and follows the 3d Battalion 1st Artillery Brigade, to Scotland Street Station.

*3d Battalion.*—Remains steady till its left is clear; then moves from its left to Holyrood Gate.

*Engineers.*—Remain steady till their left is clear; then move from the left of Companies to Holyrood Gate.

#### RIFLE VOLUNTEERS.

##### 1ST BRIGADE—1ST DIVISION.

*1st and 2d Battalions.*—Remain steady till their left is clear; then move from the left to Holyrood Gate.

*3d Battalion.*—Moves, at once, directly to the rear as far as the Queen's Drive, then by its proper right, through the Meadow Bank entrance to St Margaret's Station.

*4th Battalion.*—Moves directly to its rear, as far as the Queen's Drive, and follows the 3d Battalion.

##### 2D BRIGADE—1ST DIVISION.

*1st Battalion.*—Disengages to the right front, and moves by the Old London Road entrance, following the 2d Battalion 2d Artillery Brigade, to Scotland Street Station.

*2d Battalion.*—Follows the 1st Battalion.

*3d Battalion.*—Will march directly to the road in its rear, halt, and front. The Northumberland Corps then move by the right to the Meadow Bank entrance, following the 4th Battalion 1st Brigade, to St Margaret's Station. The Cumberland Corps remains halted till its left is clear, when it moves to its left along the road, to Holyrood Gate and Lothian Road Station, following in rear of the 3d Brigade 1st Division.

*4th Battalion* marches directly to its rear as far as the Queen's Drive; and moves to its right by the Meadow Bank entrance; following the Northumberland Corps of the 3d Battalion to the St Margaret's Station.

##### 3D BRIGADE—1ST DIVISION.

*1st Battalion* to follow the 2d Battalion.

*2d Battalion* to follow the 3d Battalion.

*3d Battalion* to follow the 4th Battalion.

*4th Battalion* to disengage to its left rear; and march—left in front—by Holyrood Gate and the Canongate, &c.

##### 2D DIVISION.

The entire 2d Division, consisting of four Brigades, will move off in succession of

Companies from the left (beginning with the left Battalion of the 4th Brigade), through the Croft-an-Righ entrance; by Abbey Hill and Princes Street to their respective railway stations.

The foregoing movements will be executed simultaneously on the order being given by the Lieutenant-General to march home.

Officers commanding Brigades will see that their Battalions quit the ground with regularity, and strictly in accordance with the foregoing orders: and the Majors of Brigade will satisfy themselves that the arrangements for the return of the several Corps to their homes are clearly understood by their respective Commanding Officers. They will be distributed to the Railway Stations; and it will be their special duty to regulate the distribution of the several Corps on arriving in the vicinity of each Station, so as to prevent confusion, or blocking up of thoroughfares; and, in conjunction with the Railway authorities, bring the Corps in succession to their respective Trains.

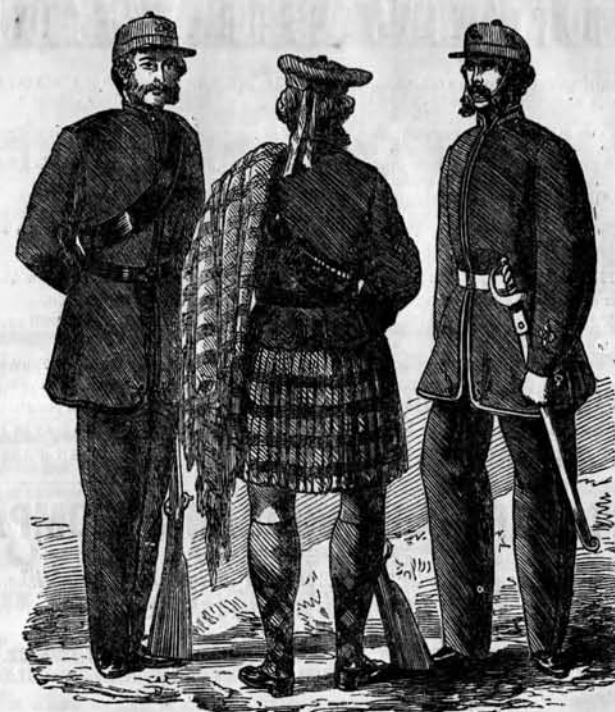
